BERKELEY, Calif. – After making short work of first and second round opponents, the Golden Bears head to State College, Pa. for their third consecutive NCAA tournament regional semifinal with a shot at revenge on their minds. As one of 16 remaining teams in the 2008 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship, Cal will face No. 14 Illinois in one regional semifinal match for the right to take on defending champion No. 1 Penn State in the regional final. The Bears fell to the Nittany Lions in the national championship semifinal a year ago and would like nothing better than to knock off undefeated Penn State. But first, Cal must get through an Illini squad that finished third in the Big Ten conference and which has won its last seven matches heading into the weekend. After hitting a rough patch in the season, the Bears have since won five of their last six and are in position to clinch Cal's best record in school history.

THE FACTS: No. 8 Cal (25-6, 13-5 Pac-10) earned the right to advance to the University Park Regional Semifinal of the 2008 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship with wins over Siena College and New Mexico State last weekend. The Bears will face No. 14 Illinois (26-7, 15-5 Big Ten) in a 12:30 p.m. PT match on Friday, Dec. 12 at the Rec Hall in State College, Pa. No. 1 Penn State (34-0, 20-0 Big Ten) draws Western Michigan (28-6, 14-2 MAC) in the other semifinal match at 3 p.m. PT, Dec. 12. The winners of each match will play in the University Park Regional Championship Match on Saturday, Dec. 13 at 1 p.m. PT. The final will be broadcast live by ESPNU with Beth Mowins calling the action and Karch Kiraly providing color commentary. TICKETS: All-session tickets for all three matches are on sale now and are \$16 for adults and \$10 for youth and students. Single-session tickets will be available at Rec Hall the day of the match only and are \$10 for adults, \$7 for youth and students and \$4 per person in groups of 20 or more, any age. NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY: Cal made a school-record seventh straight appearance in the NCAA championship tournament this season; 12th overall. Cal advanced to the round of 16 for the first time in 2003 with two 3-0 victories over Saint Mary's and Michigan. The Bears went 1-1 in the postseason in 2004 and 2005 before advancing to the round of 16 once again in 2006 where it fell to eventual NCAA runner-up Stanford. Last year, Cal set a new school record by advancing past the round of 16 to face defending NCAA champion Nebraska in the Wisconsin Regional Championship. There, it defeated the Cornhuskers, 3-0, to earn a spot in the national semifinal match. The Bears fell in a sweep to 2007 NCAA champion Penn State in Sacramento, Calif. Cal has also made postseason appearances in the AIAW (1981) and NIVC (1991) tournaments and owns a 20-15 record in all postseason matches, 16-11 in the NCAA tournament.

FELLER FOCUS: Cal head volleyball coach **Rich Feller** leads the Bears into the NCAA tournament for the seventh consecutive year. In his 10th season at Berkeley, Feller has a 13-6 NCAA championship record with Cal and has guided his Bears to victory in all six of their first round matches. Overall, Feller is 18-14 in postseason matches including five wins while at Colorado State and has now taken his team to the regional semifinal three straight years.

LAST WEEK: The Bears opened up postseason play in the comforting confines of Haas Pavilion, hosting Siena College, Saint Mary's College and New Mexico State. Cal brushed aside the Saints in the first round with a 25-18, 25-10, 25-20 sweep, marking the seventh straight season in which Cal has advanced past the first round of the NCAA tournament. Freshman outside hitter **Tarah Murrey** led the team with 11 kills (7e, 26att, .154) with junior outside hitter **Hana Cutura** in tow with 10 kills of her own (3e, 21att, .333). The Bears attacked efficiently, getting 48 kills on 86 attacks (13e) to post a .407 attack percentage. Siena College outside hitter **Burgandy McCurdy** led all players with 16 kills (6e, 26att, .385) but it was not enough as the Bears sent the Saints packing. Siena College has not won a single set in NCAA tournament play in five all-time appearances and has fallen to the eventual national champion in two of the last three years. The next night, Cal took on New Mexico State, the co-champions of the Western Athletic Conference. The Aggies defeated Saint Mary's College to advance to the second round. This time, the Bears needed four sets to get the victory (25-23, 25-13, 21-25, 25-17), maintaining a strong offense, but adding a formidable defense at the net. Cal set a season-high mark in blocks as it posted 17.5 total team blocks and forced the Aggies into a .107 attack rate for the match (48k, 35e, 122att). The Bears attacked at a .310 rate, getting 51 kills on 113 attempts (16e). Cutura led all players with 16 kills this time (5e, 35att, .314). Junior middle hitter **Mindi Wiley** and senior outside hitter **Am'ra Solomon** each had 13 kills apiece while sophomore setter **Carli Lloyd** led all players with 45 assists. New Mexico State outside hitter **Lindsey Yon** led her team with 11 kills and 11 digs. The victory over the Aggies sent Cal to a school-record third consecutive round of 16 appearance in the NCAA tourney.

NO. 14 ILLINOIS NOTES: The Illini (26-7, 15-5 Big Ten) defeated Milwaukee and Cincinnati in the first and second rounds of the NCAA championships to arrive at the University Park Regional. Illinois has won its last seven matches (13 of last 15) and is currently riding the momentum of a 13-set win streak. The Illini finished third in the Big Ten conference with just five losses; four of which came at the hands of No. 1 Penn State and second-place Minnesota. Illinois is led by sophomore outside hitter **Laura DeBruier** who averages 4/63 kps and is second on the team with 3.02 dps. The Illini run a 6-2 offense that features the talents of two setters, sophomore **Hilary Haen** (6.74 aps) and senior **Lizzie Bazzetta** (5.10 aps). Both setters average more than two digs per set as well. Defensively, the

Illini rely on sophomore middle blocker **Johannah Bangert** who averages 1.62 bps and has amassed 199 total blocks this season. The Bears are winless in two tries against the Illini, falling in four sets in 1985; and three sets in 1991.

NO. 1 PENN STATE NOTES: The Nittany Lions (34-0, 20-0 Big Ten) have not lost a single set of play this season and are favored by many experts to repeat as NCAA champions. Penn State leads the nation in blocks (3.26 bps) and hitting percentage (.404) and are among the top-10 in every statistical category. The Lions defeated a couple of repeat opponents as it hosted first and second round matches; dropping Long Island in the first round before knocking Yale out of the tournament. Penn State is led by junior outside hitter **Megan Hodge** who puts up 3.99 kps while attacking at a .341 rate. Hodge is also second on the team in digs (2.00 dps) and has 44 blocks this season. Senior outside hitter **Nicole Fawcett** averages 3.79 kps and has 78 blocks to go with 187 digs. Junior setter **Alisha Glass** leads the nation in assists, putting up 12.40 aps. Glass is also third on the team in blocks with a 1.00 bps average (102 blocks). Last season's meeting in the NCAA semifinal was the first and only meeting between Cal and Penn State.

WESTERN MICHIGAN NOTES: The Broncos (28-6, 14-2 MAC) advanced to the round of 16 for the first time in 21 years after they upset 16th-seeded Tulane in the second round, 3-2. Western Michigan tacked up a 3-1 victory over host Dayton to open tournament play before earning the trip to State College, Pa. The Broncos were the regular season champions of the Mid-American Conference with a 14-2 record and are led by junior outside hitter **Michelle Moore**, who averages 3.92 kps and is third on the team in digs with 2.25 dps. Junior setter **Jillian Mitchell** puts up 11.48 aps and is second on the team in service aces with 28 this season. Junior outside hitter **Katie Eberling** trailed Moore but has put up 351 kills this season to average 2.79 kps. The Bears and the Broncos have never faced each other.

CUTURA AND LLOYD EARN ALL-PAC-10 HONORS: The Pacific-10 conference announced its annual postseason honors on Dec. 1 with junior outside hitter **Hana Cutura** and sophomore setter **Carli Lloyd** receiving all-conference notice. While the award is a first for Lloyd, Cutura enjoys a repeat appearance after making the all-conference team last season. Senior outside hitter **Am'ra Solomon** and junior middle hitter **Mindi Wiley** received honorable mention notice while outside hitter **Tarah Murrey** and middle hitter **Shannon Hawari** were each selected to the Pac-10 All-Freshman team.

GOT FIVE ON IT: Five Bears earned Pac-10 All-Academic honorable mention this season including seniors **Am'ra Solomon** and **Kat Reilly**, juniors **Kristen Kathan** and **Mindi Wiley**; and sophomore **Carli Lloyd**. Solomon returned to the list of all-academic players after appearing in 2006. Kathan and Solomon made repeat appearances after earning honorable mention in 2007. Lloyd and Wiley were each first-time honorable mention.

POLL POSITION: Cal's No. 5 preseason ranking in the Bison/AVCA Division I Coaches Top 25 Poll marked the eighth time in school history that the Bears were ranked to open a season; the sixth since Rich Feller became head coach in 1999. The Bears were ranked No. 12 at the start of 2007, No. 17 to open 2006, No. 19 in 2005, No. 10 in 2004 and No. 24 in 2003. Cal's two other preseason rankings came in 1989 (No. 9) and 1983 (No. 12). Setting a program-best mark in 2007, the Bears finished the season in the No. 4 spot after reaching the NCAA national semifinal, where they fell 3-0 to eventual NCAA champion Penn State. Cal's highest regular season ranking was recorded several times this season as the Bears reached No. 4 for several weeks. Since 1982, the Bears have been ranked a total of 129 times.

BEARS IN TV LAND: Cal appeared live in five televised matches this season, the last of which was the USC match on Nov. 22, broadcast by Fox Sports Net. Comcast SportsNet California aired Cal's match against Stanford in the Big Spike on Nov. 14 and haunted the Haas sidelines on Halloween night (Oct. 31) as the Bears defeated Washington State, 3-1. Comcast also aired the Bears' *Dig for the Cure* match against Arizona State on Oct. 10. FSN showed Cal's historic 3-1 victory at Stanford (Oct. 19). Cal also appeared in a local telecast on the road at Washington Oct. 3. Cal is 5-1 in TV matches.

SUPER STREAKS: Cal's streak of 29 straight sets without a loss between Sept. 14 and Oct. 19 set a new school record, breaking the old record of 27 held by the 2002 squad. The Bears also had the second-longest match winning streak in school history this season, winning 13 consecutive matches between Sept. 13 and Oct. 24. In addition, Cal set a new school record by winning eight consecutive Pac-10 matches. This Cal team also owns the record for most consecutive matches won at home, 16 (from Oct. 11, 2007 through Oct. 31, 2008).

RACKIN' UP THE REWARDS: Several Cal players received recognition for their outstanding play in preseason tournaments this year; at the Cal Molten Classic, sophomore setter **Carli Lloyd** took home MVP honors, joined by junior libero **Kristen Kathan** as the defensive standout and junior outside hitter **Hana Cutura** on the all-tournament team. At the Golden Bear Invitational, Lloyd once again garnered MVP honors while Kathan repeated as the defensive standout. This time, the pair was joined not only by Cutura, but senior outside hitter/middle hitter **Morgan Beck** and junior middle hitter **Mindi Wiley**. At the Diet Coke Classic in Minneapolis, Minn., Lloyd and Cutura earned spots on the all-tournament team. And at the Crowne Plaza Volleyball Classic in Fullerton, Calif., Cutura took home MVP honors, joined by senior outside hitter **Am'ra Solomon** and Lloyd on the all-tournament team.

THE PACIFIC-10 CONFERENCE: Cal competed in what was arguably the toughest conference in women's collegiate volleyball, the Pac-10. Six teams ranked in the most recent Bison/AVCA top 25 poll reside in the Pac-10 conference with all six in the top 12. 2007 NCAA runner-up Stanford tops the group at No. 2 with Washington checking in at No. 5. Oregon sits at No. 7 followed by Cal at No. 8, No. 9 UCLA and No. 12 USC. Oregon State made its first appearance in the polls since 1996 earlier this year and Arizona maintained a spot in the top 25 for several weeks. Both have since exited the poll. With San Francisco (No. 25), Cal Poly, and Minnesota (No. 10) also cracking the lineup, and St. John's holding a position earlier this year, the Bears have faced 16 teams that either currently are or at one point were ranked in the top 25.

DIG FOR THE CURE: During the month of October, Pac-10 volleyball teams joined forces to help raise awareness about breast cancer during home matches. Among the promotional events, teams wore pink accessories, used pink game balls for the matches and tossed pink mini volleyballs into the stands. The Bears held *Dig for the Cure* on Oct. 10 when it hosted Arizona State at Haas Pavilion. On the road, Cal also participated in "Pink" matches when it visited Stanford (Oct. 19), UCLA (Oct. 24), and USC (Oct. 25).

BEARS IN THE PAC-10 RANKS: Cal ranked in the top five in six statistical categories in the Pac-10 this season. The Bears lead the conference in kills (14.95 kps) and are tied for the conference lead in assists (13.87 aps). Cal is second in opponent hitting percentage (.177) and tied for third in hitting percentage (.290). Cal is third in service aces (1.16 saps) and tied for third in blocks (2.59 bps). Individually, junior outside hitter **Hana Cutura** is second in the conference in kills (4.42 kps) and first in points (5.06 pps). She is third in service aces (0.30 saps). Junior libero **Kristen Kathan** ranks fourth in digs (4.32 dps) and fifth in service aces (0.28). Sophomore setter **Carli Lloyd** is second in assists with 12.04 aps. Freshman middle hitter **Shannon Hawari** (.389) is fifth in the conference in hitting percentage and junior middle hitter **Mindi Wiley** is sixth (.341).

NATIONAL N' THEM: The Bears hold several distinctions among the country's top teams including third in assists with 13.87 aps. As a byproduct, the Bears also rank third in the country in kills with 14.95 kps. Valparaiso leads all teams with a 15.32 kps average. Cal's .290 hitting percentage ranks seventh in the country behind Pac-10 leaders, Stanford (.319), Washington (.294) and NCAA leader, Penn State at No. 1 (.404). Defensively, the Bears average 2.59 bps, 25th in the NCAA; one of six Pac-10 teams in the top 40 in that statistical category. Individually, sophomore setter **Carli Lloyd** is third in the country with 12.04 aps and junior outside **Hana Cutura** is 13th nationally in kills at 4.42 kps.

CAPTAIN CRUNCH: Cal had the benefit of leadership from three captains this season. Seniors **Kat Reilly**, **Morgan Beck** and **Am'ra Solomon** each held the roll of co-team captain in 2008. Reilly brought her experience as the president of the Cal Student-Athlete Advisory Council to the court while Beck carried three years of on-court familiarity. Solomon's summer of growth with the USA A2 team coupled with her passion for the game and the team were apparent when she took the court, leading Cal in cheers.

OUTSIDE INFLUENCE: The Bears returned several weapons at the outside hitter position from a squad that made an appearance in the NCAA semifinal, including All-American junior **Hana Cutura**. Cutura leads the team in total kills with 482 (160e, 1061att, .303) and kills per set (4.42 kps). She also does her share of work on defense, picking up 257 digs thus far (2.36 dps). Senior outside hitter/middle hitter **Morgan Beck** has logged 108 kills (1.69 kps) and 30 total blocks (0.47 bps) despite playing a limited role due to injury. Beck earned All-Pac-10 honorable mention in 2006 and 2007. Senior **Am'ra Solomon** has made huge contributions, putting down 301 kills (2.98 kps, second on the team) with a .299 attack percentage (84e, 726att). Solomon netted 80 kills (2.58 kps) a year ago in limited action. The Bears also added the services of freshman **Tarah Murrey** (258k, 123e, 609att, .222) to the lineup this season.

FRESH FACES: The Bears welcomed five newcomers to the team this year. Topping the list was phenom outside hitter **Tarah Murrey**. Murrey came to Cal as one of 2007's most highly sought-after high school recruits in the country. Her impressive resume included *Volleyball Magazine* Fab 50 honors and recognition as the 2008 Gatorade California Player of the Year. Also a Fab 50 selection, freshman middle hitter **Shannon Hawari** stepped in and battled for immediate playing time. Joining Murrey and Hawari in the freshman class were setter/defensive specialist **Ashley Roe**, setter **Kristin Obermeyer** and defensive specialist/libero **Katherine Gorman**.

HOME, SWEET, HOME: There's no place like home and these Bears don't come to Haas Pavilion to hibernate. Cal successfully defended its home court advantage for a school-record 16 consecutive matches; a run that dated back to a 3-2 win over Washington on Oct. 11, 2007 and ended against with a loss to the Huskies on Nov. 2, 2008. The previous longest home winning streak lasted 13 matches from Oct. 28, 2005 through Oct. 19, 2006. This season, Cal went 12-2 in all matches at Haas Pavilion.

1,000 CLUB: Two Golden Bears surpassed the 1,000 kill mark in their careers this season. Junior outside hitter **Hana Cutura** was the first to do so, hitting the 1,000 kill milestone on the head against Central Connecticut State Sept. 19 at the Crowne Plaza Volleyball Classic in Fullerton, Calif. Cutura is fifth in all-time career kills at Cal with 1,359 and could threaten the fourth-place position before her season is over. Senior outside hitter/middle hitter **Morgan Beck** got her 1,000th kill against Oregon State Sept. 28. Beck now has 1,021 career kills and is ninth all-time at Cal in total blocks with 326.

MEET THE BEAR CUBS: Four prep volleyball players signed National Letters of Intent to play for the Golden Bears in 2009 during the early signing period (Nov. 12-19). Setter **Ely Barrett** (Westlake HS/Austin, Texas), middle blocker **Katherine Brown** (St. Francis HS/Mountain View, Calif.), middle blocker **Tia Gaffen** (Wayzata HS/Plymouth, Minn.) and middle blocker **Correy Johnson** (Lake Howell HS/Winter Park, Fla.). Barrett and Johnson were each honored with selections to the AVCA Under Armour High School All-American first team. Gaffen received second-team notice. All four players were PrepVolleyball.com Top 50 senior aces in 2008; Barrett was No. 12 (regarded as the top setter in the nation), Brown was No. 48, Gaffen was No. 47 and Johnson was No. 14.

#1: SETTING THE SCENE: Sophomore setter **Carli Lloyd** is averaging 12.04 aces (1,324 assists, ninth all-time single season record at Cal), second in the Pac-10 (third nationally), but more importantly, she has the Bears on top of the conference with a 13.87 aces mark (also third nationally). A 2007 Pac-10 All-Freshman selection, Lloyd posted 1,550 assists (12.81 dps) last year, and earned NCAA Wisconsin Regional all-tournament team status for her impressive postseason play. In addition to setting her teammates up, Lloyd also put down 93 kills and added 111 total blocks as a freshman. Lloyd broke the 2,000 assist mark against Oregon on Sept. 26, becoming just the sixth player in Cal history to break that plateau. Her 2,874 assists are already good for fifth among all-time career leaders at Cal. Lloyd's stellar play netted her all-tournament honors in all four of Cal's preseason tourney's including two MVP awards (Cal Molten Classic and Golden Bear Invitational), Pac-10 Player of the Week award twice and most recently, an AVCA National Player of the Week honor.

#1: CALIFORNIA GLADIATOR: Sophomore setter **Carli Lloyd** credits her athleticism to the training she received from uncle and coach, Galen Tomlinson. Tomlinson, a former volleyball coach at Fallbrook Union High School, is better known in some circles as Turbo from the 1980's television series, "American Gladiators."

#1: TRIPLE PLAY: Sophomore setter **Carli Lloyd** was named the Sports Imports/AVCA Division I National Player of the Week on Oct. 20, for her efforts in a 3-1 victory against Stanford, Oct. 19. She was also named Pac-10 Player of the Week for the second time this season for the week of Oct. 13-19, after earning honors for the week of Aug. 23-Aug. 31. In addition, Lloyd received the Cal Muscle Milk Student-Athlete of the Week award to complete a trifecta of awards and honors. She is the first Cal player since Angie Pressey to receive Pac-10 (Aug. 28, 2006) and the first player since Mia Jerkov (2003) to earn Pac-10 Player of the Week honors twice in one season.

#2: DIGGING DEEP: Junior defensive specialist/libero **Kristen Kathan** sits in fourth place among Pac-10 players in digs per set with 4.32 dps (475 in 110 sets). Last year, Kathan registered the ninth-best single-season mark for digs at Cal as a sophomore with 414 (3.70 dps) and had a then career-high 29 digs at USC, Oct. 26, 2007. This season, Kathan put up a career-high 31 balls twice, at Oregon, Nov. 28 and has moved into the fourth-place position in single-season digs.

#3: NATIONAL BECKONING: Senior outside hitter/middle hitter **Morgan Beck** spent the 2008 spring semester away from the Berkeley campus to be with the USA Women's Indoor Volleyball team in Colorado Springs, Colo. Along with since-departed Angie Pressey, Beck trained with the team under the direction of head coach "Jenny" Liang Ping. This summer, the USA Women's Indoor Volleyball team won the silver medal at the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing, China.

#4: SISTER, SISTER: Freshman outside hitter **Tarah Murrey** comes from a family of athletes, one of which is older sister, Brittney. The elder Murrey is the starting setter for UC Riverside. Cal faced the Highlanders in what became a family affair at Haas Pavilion on Sept. 6 in the Golden Bear Invitational. Youth beat out experience as Cal's Murrey helped the Bears to a 3-0 win to close out the tournament crown.

#4: TARAH-RIZING THE COURT: Freshman outside hitter **Tarah Murrey** has appeared in every match for the Bears, playing in 108 of 110 sets. She is third on the team in kills, averaging 2.39 kps and puts up 1.55 digs every set. The 6-3 El Cerrito, Calif. native has come of age in recent matches, earning career-high marks with 21 kills, 19 digs, and 50 attacks against UCLA on Nov. 21. Murrey received Pac-10 All-Freshman Team notice for her on-court efforts on Dec. 1.

#7: ROE, ROE, ROE YOUR BOAT: Freshman setter/defensive specialist **Ashley Roe** lists writing poetry and lyrics among her favorite off-court activities. She can often be heard singing or rapping ad-lib lyrics to familiar melodies. She has appeared in three matches for the Bears, logging a service ace on her first collegiate play against Minnesota (Sept. 12) and logged her first career assist on a kill from **Hana Cutura** against Central Connecticut State Sept. 19.

HAAS PAVILION

BERKELEY, CALIF.

The Walter A. Haas Jr. Pavilion has made a powerful statement about the stature of athletics at Cal. Along with its most important function - a state-of-the-art volleyball and basketball arena with capacity doubled to 11,877 - it adds space for many men's and women's intercollegiate programs, recreational and community activities, and athletic administration.

An innovative plan had been developed to build a shell around the original Harmon Gym structure. The exterior complements the former Harmon Gym's distinctive architecture. The roof of the Haas Pavilion was raised to make room for a bowl-shaped arena, a novel design that increases capacity on all four sides, yet creates good views of the court from every seat.

The Pavilion's in-the-round seating gives every visitor a direct sight line to the action on the court. The 11,877-seat arena includes up to 1,500 chairback seats at premium locations and 3,000 seats for students. The court will continue to be named in honor of Pete Newell, legendary coach of Cal's 1959 NCAA championship team.

The Pavilion will be the focal point for Cal's many athletic, recreational and cultural activities. Inside the Pavilion's east entrance, a large lobby will lead visitors to a new team store. Added concession areas and concourses will accommodate larger crowds.

On the concourse level, a Spectator Club provides a spacious yet intimate meeting spot for special friends of Cal. A new plaza at the Pavilion's east entrance will reach from Bancroft Way to Strawberry Creek, creating a new campus gateway and an ideal location for outdoor gatherings.

Construction began on the project in June 1997. Harmon Gym, which opened in 1933 and had a capacity of 6,578 seats, was home to Cal volleyball and basketball for 65 seasons.

Cal volleyball had the distinction of being the first-ever athletic event in the new Haas Pavilion when the Bears hosted Arizona State Oct. 15, 1999 (attendance: 3,125). The volleyball match was prior to the men's and women's basketball team's Midnight Madness, which celebrated the opening of the basketball season. Cal volleyball also had the honor of hosting the first-ever NCAA championship event at Haas Pavilion, as the Bears hosted the 2003 NCAA first and second rounds, defeating both Saint Mary's and Michigan, 3-0, to advance to the round of 16 in Honolulu, Hawaii. Cal again hosted the NCAA first and second rounds in 2004, defeating Pacific, 3-2, before falling to Saint Mary's, 3-2.

HEAD COACH RICH FELLER: The winningest head coach in Cal volleyball history, 190-114 (.625), 489-281 career (.635), head coach **Rich Feller** has led Golden Bears to a school-record seven straight NCAA appearances (2002-08). His achievements have not gone unnoticed, earning him recognition as the 2007 ASICS/Volleyball Magazine National Coach of the Year to go with his honors as the 2003 AVCA Pacific Region Co-Coach of the Year and the 2003 Pac-10 Conference Coach of the Year. Under Feller's guidance, the Bears have had six AVCA All-America selections, ten All-Pac-10 selections and Cal has set school records for postseason appearances, advancing to four NCAA regional semifinals (2003, 06, 07, 08) and to the NCAA semifinal in 2007. His squads hold school-records for single match and season totals in assists, total blocks, hitting percentage, set-win streaks and best start to open a season. He has led Cal to 20-win seasons five times (2002-03, 06-08). His leadership saw the Bears to a program best winning percentage of .781 (25-7 overall) in 2003. In just his first year on campus (1999), Cal was the most improved team in the Pac-10. In addition, Feller served as the top assistant coach for the USA Women's National Volleyball team from 1997-98.

#8: ADVENTURES WITH AM'RA: Senior outside hitter **Am'ra Solomon** will be authoring a photo-journal during each of Cal's road trips this season. The pictorial essays are a behind-the-scenes look at the 2008 Golden Bears and will receive updates the Monday following each road trip. Solomon celebrated her second road-trip of the year with a spot on the Crowne Plaza All-Tournament team. Be sure to check the volleyball home page on CalBears.com for the latest shots off of Am'ra's camera.

#8: SHE AM WHAT SHE AM: Senior outside hitter **Am'ra Solomon** has quietly become one of the Bears' go-to players on the outside. Her 2.98 kps is second on the team behind team leader junior **Hana Cutura**. Solomon's sure hand has netted her a .299 attack percentage (301k, 84e, 726att). She set new career highs in attacks at UCLA Oct. 24, with 49; and recorded a new career-high in kills with 20 at Arizona Nov. 7. She also set career high numbers in digs and blocks this season, playing in a heavily saturated front row. Solomon earned All-Pac-10 Honorable Mention this season.

#9: OBI WAN KENOBERMEYER: Freshman setter **Kristin Obermeyer** might not be able to play any Jedi mind-tricks on opponents but she has the resume to prove her academic aptitude as one of the valedictorians at Westmont High School in Campbell, Calif. She has appeared in three matches for Cal and had her first assist against DePaul Sept. 6; she later logged a career-high five assists against Central Connecticut State Sept. 19 at the Crowne Plaza Volleyball Classic in Fullerton, Calif.

#10: MIDDLE METTLE: In her final season with the Bears, senior middle hitter **Kat Reilly** served as one of three team captains. Reilly appeared in just 85 sets last year, protecting her knee after recovering from an injury sustained as a freshman. Last season, Reilly logged 147 kills and hit for .325 (44e, 317att), the sixth-best single season output by a Bear. She also ranked second on the team a year ago with a 1.36 bps average, putting up a total of 116 blocks. This season, slowed by injury, Reilly has logged 43 kills (0.77 kps) in limited time (21e, 133att, .165) and 54 total blocks (0.96 bps).

#10: PRESIDENTIAL PRECEDENCE: Senior middle hitter **Kat Reilly** serves as president of the Cal Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). SAAC is a collaboration of student-athletes representing all intercollegiate teams competing for the University of California, Berkeley. The mission of SAAC is to bring the student-athlete community together; provide feedback to the athletic administration on proposed conference and NCAA legislation; foster student-athlete welfare; create relationships between student-athletes and the community by organizing community service efforts and raising funds for various causes; and to become a sounding board for the athletic administration by generating a student-athlete voice where concerns are addressed.

#14: TEXAS TWO-STEP: The Cal roster once again featured two players from the great state of Texas. With the departure of Ellen Orchard (Houston, Texas), the Bears added another middle hitter in freshman **Shannon Hawari** to the lineup. Hawari arrived in Berkeley from Plano, Texas, a former player at Plano West High School. Hawari joins senior middle hitter **Kat Reilly**, who comes from Plano East High School.

#14: NO HAWARIAN ISLAND VACATION: Freshman middle hitter **Shannon Hawari** worked her way into the California starting lineup, logging 113 kills on 229 attacks with just 24 errors all season. Her .389 attack percentage ranks fifth among all Pac-10 players. She has also racked up 63 blocks (0.84 bps), second on the team. Hawari had a breakout match at USC Oct. 25 where she tallied a career-high 15 kills on 22 attacks. She joined fellow frosh **Tarah Murrey** on the Pac-10 All-Freshman team this season. When she does decide to take a break, she would like to vacation to Paris, France.

#17: STORMIN' GORMANS: Freshman defensive specialist/libero **Katherine Gorman's** older brother Richard is a junior designated hitter on the Cal baseball team. With 16 home volleyball matches and 30 home baseball games, Golden Bear sports will be a family affair for the Gorman household. Gorman has appeared in 17 of Cal's matches this year, recording her first digs in a match at Cal State Fullerton Sept. 20 and a career-high three digs at USC on Oct. 25.

#21: WILD AND WILEY: Junior middle hitter **Mindi Wiley** is attacking at a .341 clip (sixth in the Pac-10, 242k, 79e, 478att). She put up a career-high 15 kills and 25 attacks at UCLA Oct. 24 (matched with 25 attacks vs. UCLA on Nov. 21) and posted a career-high three solo blocks against UC Riverside Sept.

6. She has also recorded a career-high eight total blocks three times this season, first against San Francisco Sept. 20 and again against Oregon Sept. 26 with the last time coming at Oregon on Nov. 28. The first service aces of Wiley's career came against Arizona (Oct. 11) and Arizona State (Oct. 10). She has since served for ace on 12 occasions. Wiley had Cal's eighth-best single season output for hitting percentage in 2007, registering a mark of .307 (85k, 30e, 179att). As a sophomore, Wiley shared time in the middle with since-departed Ellen Orchard and senior **Kat Reilly** but still managed to average 1.52 kps and put up 74 total blocks (1.32 bps).

#26: PASSING ON PIROUETTES: Hailing from Zagreb, Croatia, junior outside hitter **Hana Cutura** wasn't always the menacing volleyball force the Bears have come to know. The 6-4 outside hitter used to be a ballet dancer as a young girl but her natural gift for volleyball eventually shoved *Nutcracker* dreams aside. Last year, Cutura's play in the postseason earned her honors as the NCAA Wisconsin Regional MVP, an achievement her parents are quite proud of. Cutura's father, Zoran is a former Olympic basketball star for Yugoslavia while her mother, Gordana, is a former member of the Croatian National Volleyball team.

#26: SUPER HANA: Junior outside hitter **Hana Cutura** is second in the Pac-10 in kills per set with a 4.42 kps average. She also contributed to the Cal defense by putting in 2.36 digs per set. Her 5.06 points per set is tops in the conference and she leads the Bears in service aces with 33 (0.30, third in the Pac-10). Cutura's dominance at the net and presence in the back row have earned her 10 double-double matches this season. Cutura moved into fifth place for all-time career kills (1,359) and eighth place for all-time career attacks (3,172) this season and has already logged the ninth-best single-season mark for kills with 482. She is just seven aces from cracking the top 10 in that career category as well and was selected to the Pac-10 All-Conference team for the second consecutive season.

Both her parents, Tom and Laura attended Cal and were cross country and track and field athletes for the Bears. Her uncle, John Starrett also starred as a rower for the Bears. Schmitt put up a career-high three service aces at Arizona Nov. 7 and later recorded a career-high 11 digs against UCLA on Nov. 21.

A FAMILIAR FOE: Cal's director of volleyball operations, **Chelsea White**, played volleyball for Iona College in 2004 and 2005. Iona competes in the same conference as Cal's first round opponent Siena College, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. She graduated with a degree in political science in 2006 and was a member of the Delta Epsilon Sigma National Scholastic Honor Society with a 3.92 GPA. As the starting libero, White climbed the Iona career and single-season records ladder and remains fourth all-time in digs (1,210) and second in career digs per set (5.28 dps). She had the second and third highest total in a single season for digs in 2005 (612 digs) and 2004 (598 digs).

McSHANE THE TRAIN: This past June, assistant coach **Matt McShane** joined over 2,800 bike riders on a seven-day, 545-mile trek from San Francisco to Los Angeles as a part of the 2008 AIDS/LifeCycle Ride benefiting HIV/AIDS services. 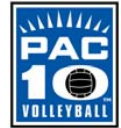

Cal's Feller and Oregon State's Liskevych parallel on, off court

California's Rich Feller and Oregon State's Taras "Terry" Liskevych have always had a lot in common.

They coached volleyball together at the University of the Pacific. Both spent time with the U.S. women's national team. And each has built his own college program into a national power.

Rich Feller has rebuilt Cal volleyball from a conference bottom-dweller to a national power.

Now, almost three decades after they first met after a United States Volleyball Association spring tournament, they'll go head-to-head as coaches in the challenging Pac-10 conference.

"In a parking lot somewhere in the Bay area," Liskevych recalled, "this guy comes up to me and says, 'Hey, I saw your team play, and I'd really like to come to UOP. Do you have any room on your staff?'"

Who could have guessed that such an unusual interaction would be the start of a beautiful friendship?

When Feller took control of the Cal volleyball program in 1999, the view from the bottom of the Pac-10 was daunting.

The Golden Bears had not had a winning season in nine years and had finished seventh or worse in conference standings seven straight seasons. Recruits were hard to sign, and he had the formidable task of coaching in the toughest conference in the nation against many of the top programs in women's college volleyball.

But just one look at Feller's résumé shows it was obvious that he was the right coach to rebuild Cal into a conference contender and national power.

He made the move to Berkeley, Calif., after a two-year stint as an assistant coach with the U.S. women's national team. Before that, he had compiled a 299-167 record at Colorado State from 1983 to 1996 and led the Rams to eight appearances in the NCAA tournament.

But the coaching experience that laid the foundation for all of his future success was in the four seasons he spent at Pacific under Liskevych.

"He was my mentor," Feller said. "I learned most of my organizational skills, especially the off-court coaching skills, from him when I was at UOP."

He learned those lessons well. It took Feller just five seasons to push Cal into the upper half of the Pac-10 standings and to break into the Top 25. Last year, the Bears made the program's first appearance in the national semifinals after defeating Nebraska in the regional final. They ended the season ranked No. 4 in the American Volleyball Coaches Association Top 25 poll, the highest ranking in the program's history. Cal also was ranked No. 4 earlier this season.

Now Liskevych is planning to follow the same course as his former protégé as he rebuilds the program at Oregon State.

Liskevych, the U.S. Olympic team coach from 1985 to 1996, returned to the college game in 2005 when he accepted the head-coaching position at Oregon State. Instantly, he faced the same challenges Feller encountered five years earlier at Cal.

"It's easy to have a good team," Liskevych said. "It's tough to have a good program for the long term because it's a systematic building of a program that prevents the dips down."

It didn't take long for his hiring to pay dividends, especially in recruiting, where he quickly laid the foundation for the team's current success. His first recruiting class -- setter Camilla Ah-Hoy, outside hitters Katie Cochran, Bree Knitter and Rachel Rourke and middle blocker Lexie Rathgeber -- gave Oregon State an immediate injection of talent and competitiveness.

The Beavers showed flashes of what was to come in 2007 when they became the first unranked team to sweep Hawaii on its home court and later defeated No. 4 UCLA at Pauley Pavilion.

This past weekend, Oregon State's continued improvement was on display when it defeated then-No. 4 USC in five sets Friday night, then dropped a five-set decision to then-No. 5 UCLA on Saturday. That performance earned the Beavers a No. 24 ranking, their first appearance in the AVCA poll since 1996.

In fact, the Beavers were part of Pac-10 volleyball history Friday night when the Oregon schools defeated the Los Angeles schools on the same night for the first time ever (Oregon defeated UCLA 3-1).

"He's the right man for that job, for sure," Feller said. "Terry is the kind of guy who can build a program. He showed that at UOP, he showed that at Ohio State [where he coached from 1974 to 1976] and he showed that with our national team. I think he's done a great job."

The addition of Feller and Liskevych to the list of Pac-10 coaches that includes national championship winners Andy Banachowski (UCLA), John Dunning (Stanford), Mick Haley (USC) and Jim McLaughlin (Washington) is just one of the reasons the conference has been so dominating in women's volleyball.

It also helps to be located in the heart of volleyball country. Regardless of how good a coach is or how great a school's facilities are, the athletes are what allow a program to ascend to the top of the conference.

"When I came here, the biggest difference from Cal, who was at the bottom, to the teams that were at the top, like Stanford and UCLA, was the depth on their teams," Feller said. "The bottom teams will have six or seven really high-quality players, but their depth really drops off after that."

Feller's strategy was to recruit athletes who could play above the net, then bring in "ballers" who had the skills to play the game. Each year, his recruits would be a little more skilled until he finally had classes made up of athletes who were highly skilled players.

By the 2002 and 2003 seasons, the Bears had a competitive roster. Feller's rebuilding plan came to fruition last year when senior outside hitter Angie Pressey was named a first-team All-American, sophomore outside hitter Hana Cutura was named to the second team and freshman setter Carli Lloyd was named to the Pac-10's all-Freshman team.

Now in its fourth season under Liskevych, Oregon State is still relatively early in its rebuilding process. With another big-time recruiting class scheduled to arrive next year, the Beavers are optimistic about the possibility of finishing in the upper half of the conference for the first time since 2001.

"We're improved this year, and we'll be very good next year," Liskevych said. "Practices are more competitive than they've ever been. We definitely could use some more players, but these are the best practices we've had since I've been at Oregon State."

Junior outside hitter Rachel Rourke is a member of Terry Liskevych's first recruiting class who earned All-Pac 10 honors last season.

"Next year, we're bringing some talented kids who are going to compete for spots and make everybody better."

The Beavers will need to continue their improvement to move up in the conference.

With nine programs capable of earning a spot in the NCAA tournament, the Pac-10 volleyball championship arguably is one of the most difficult titles to win in all college athletics.

"My staff and I have talked about this numerous times," Feller said. "It's almost easier to get to the Final Four than it is to win the Pac-10."

In fact, the conference has had three of the four teams in the Final Four each of the past two seasons, with five different programs making at least one appearance. Pac-10 schools have won 13 of 27 national titles since the NCAA began sponsoring women's volleyball in 1981, including five of the past seven.

Adding their teams to those lists is something else Feller and Liskevych would like to have in common.

Local stars spike Cal's volleyball program

ONE OF the best-kept sports secrets in the East Bay is the Cal women's volleyball team. But in the interest of justice, it's time to let the outside world in on this dynamic undercover operation.

With the Bears making a strong case to be considered perhaps the best team in the country, it's hard to imagine them flying under the radar much longer. The team is simply too good and too entertaining to ignore.

As an encore to its somewhat surprising Final Four appearance last December, Cal has matched its best start this year at 16-1, won a school-record 29 consecutive sets and is ranked No. 5 in the nation. The Bears also share the Pac-10 lead at 6-0 following a sweep of the Arizona schools last weekend, which is sort of like leading the SEC in football with six conference schools ranked in the top 11 nationally.

Perhaps the best aspect of Cal's push to prominence after years on the outside looking in is its distinctly local makeup. Seven of the 13 players on the roster are from the extended Bay Area, and two of the biggest factors in the Bears' 2008 success, junior Kristen Kathan and freshman Tarah Murrey, are from the East Bay's own backyard.

Kathan was a legend at Campolindo High, winning virtually every conceivable volleyball honor as a prep. She nonetheless was a walk-on at Cal, where she completely changed her game so she could compete at the highest level of college volleyball. Her gamble paid off, because she is now the dirty-work defensive specialist who holds Cal's talented team together.

Murrey, on the other hand, was one of the most highly recruited prep players in the country while at St. Mary's High in Berkeley. She's

proved why in a hurry, stepping in very capably as an outside hitter to replace All-American Angie Pressey, who graduated after last year's campaign.

In short, a decade of hard work helping develop a stronger East Bay volleyball culture is paying dividends for 10th-year coach Rich Feller. To wit, both Kathan and Murrey played together as preps with Golden Bear Club Volleyball, which has delivered numerous quality players to college programs.

Feller acknowledges that having many Bay Area players is a significant factor in his program taking the difficult step into the elite conversation with UCLA, USC and particularly No. 4 Stanford, whom the Bears meet Saturday at Maples Pavilion in a monster match.

"It builds a little loyalty among the Bay Area's high school coaches, club coaches and fans," he said. "Anytime we can see someone who can contribute, whether we have a scholarship for them right away or not, we want to get them here. The club coaches and the high school coaches recognize now that we're looking at those kids more than everyone else."

Kathan is a classic case. She could have accepted a scholarship at any number of smaller schools to play as an outside hitter. But Feller told her bluntly that it was unlikely she would do it in the Pac-10 because of her standing 5-foot-5. At the same time, he said her athleticism gave her tremendous potential to become a defensive specialist at the highest level.

It was a tough decision, initially coming to Cal without a scholarship, but, as Kathan said, "I knew I wanted to play the best volleyball I could play, and I knew that coming to Cal was going to give me that opportunity."

The transition was tough. Kathan went through a lot of frustrating practices as a freshman playing the back line. But things started to click last year, and this season she seems born to the role. She's one reason Cal hasn't missed a beat after losing a player the caliber of Pressey.

"She's all over the court, she's taking charge, she's just been phenomenal," Feller said. "I don't think I could take the role away from her now. If I asked her, 'Do you want to hit next week?' she'd say no."

Murrey was hardly a sure thing to come to Cal even though she grew up in El Cerrito. Her sister, Brittney, plays at UC Riverside and all the best volleyball programs coveted her. She took a few visits. But she found a comfort level with Cal, where she had been watching matches since fifth grade.

"I actually live about 10 minutes away, but it's weird because I'm never home now," she said. "I've just always loved Cal. It's my home, I'm so close with my family, and they get to come to the games, so it's a win-win situation."

The 6-foot-3 Murrey stepped in right away and has been on the court for every set this year, as has Kathan. She had a career-high 11 kills Saturday night in Cal's 3-0 win over Arizona. Playing alongside Hana Cutura of Croatia, the star of the team, Murrey has adjusted quickly.

"I feel like I'm learning so much in just a little time," she said.

Feller agreed, noting, "Hana was probably not as good as Tarah as a freshman. So if that progress continues, we're going to be very happy for three more years."

Elated if players such as Kathan and Murrey can continue to expand Cal's Bay Area pipeline.

Golden Child

It's Friday night, and Haas Pavilion is nearly empty.

Most of the No. 5 Cal volleyball team has showered and departed, its straight-sets victory over Arizona State quickly becoming just another line on the stat sheet. The maintenance crew is taking down the net, and the only sounds are the clacking of folding chairs being stacked and the steady murmur of conversation from the few fans still remaining.

Then, a familiar sight unfolds: a figure with long, blonde hair emerges from the locker room and climbs the steps into the stands to join a man in a gray Cal t-shirt.

No matter the opponent, no matter the outcome, every game is the same in one respect for sophomore setter Carli Lloyd: after the match, it's time to talk to Uncle Galen.

"If it was a hard match and we lost, usually I'll hold on to him for a minute like, 'Oh God, it sucked,'" Lloyd says. "If it was a good match, he'll compliment me on the things I did right and tell me what I did wrong."

When you talk to Lloyd, it becomes obvious immediately that Galen Tomlinson is no ordinary uncle. He is her mentor, her coach and, most

importantly, her parent due to the death of Lloyd's father when she was just four years old.

"He moved in shortly after my dad's passing," Lloyd says. "I actually didn't like him at first ? My mom would tell me that I would cry when he was around and run away. I didn't want him. He scared me, I guess."

It's not hard to imagine a four-year-old being intimidated by Tomlinson, who is best known by the general populace as Turbo from the 1990's television show American Gladiators. Even now he's an imposing man, broad-shouldered and muscular. But turn the conversation to his niece, and his face lights up.

"We were attached at the hip 'til she came up here," Tomlinson says. "We both cried for a month on the phone.

"She's as much mine as any child could be of any parent."

Growing up, Lloyd and her uncle did the things that any father and daughter might do-bike riding, trips to the pool and playing basketball-and a few things that most don't, like lifting weights in the gym and perfecting her technique on the volleyball court.

"My uncle is the most intense coach I've ever had," Lloyd says. "We had a really close connection outside of volleyball, so having him as my coach was really easy. But when he was hard on me, I would get mad at him. We'd fight. But I understand and I respected him so I feel like I became a better volleyball player faster by having a coach ? I respected."

From early on, Tomlinson recognized her drive to be the best at whatever she did, the very same determination that he knew in himself. As her coach through middle and high school, he pushed her harder and expected more from her in each practice, every game.

And Lloyd responded.

She was a PrepVolleyball Fab 50 selection all four years of high school, took home nearly every MVP and player of the year honor bestowed by the league and jumped to the top of Cal coach Rich Feller's wish list of 2007 recruits.

"The last thing (Feller) said to us when we left here on our first unofficial visit was that she was his number one '07 choice, and that he would wait for her until she made a commitment to someone," Tomlinson says. "And when somebody believes in your child as much as you do, that means a lot."

When Lloyd moved away from her family in Bonsall, Calif., the change was understandably jarring. The freshman had to contend with the pressure of setting two of the top hitters in the country in seniors Angie Pressey and Ellen Orchard, adjusting to the academic rigors of Cal and, of course, dealing with the sometimes overwhelming void left by the absence of her uncle.

"I was really homesick," Lloyd says. "It was hard not having my uncle here ? He came to the first three practices and sat there and watched, because he wanted to be able to see where I would be and be able to imagine everything ? There were like two times throughout the year where I would just like break down like, 'I need you back.'"

Things settled down, though, and Lloyd became comfortable running the offense that made it all the way to the semifinals of the 2007 NCAA tournament.

Along the way, she fell just six assists short of breaking the single-season Cal record and garnered Pac-10 All-Freshman honors, accomplishments that have sometimes left her uncle with little advice to impart.

"A couple times I've found myself saying, 'Don't let it go to your head, but dang, you're pretty good,'" Tomlinson says. "In the last 12 months, I expected the growth and maturity in her game to start to taper and slow down some, and it seems like it even accelerated even more."

In those 12 months, Tomlinson and Lloyd also learned to cope with the distance thanks to a good phone plan and lots of plane trips. Lloyd calls her uncle at least three times a day, depending on her schedule, and Tomlinson racks up the frequent flyer miles going to all of her matches, home and away.

But even when they're not together, they're never too far apart in spirit.

"When I do something wrong, it's him in my head telling me, 'You should have done this,'" says Lloyd. "I think about him and what he would say and how he would push me and when he would get on me. I guess I'm even harder on myself than I was before, because now I've made up for both of us."

And when they are together, the scene unfolds about the same each time. Lloyd hugs her niece and nephew, who have been playing hide-and-seek in the corners of Haas Pavilion while she was showering, and asks where they're headed for their post-game meal. Tomlinson follows her out into the cool Berkeley night, follows the niece he calls his "partial twin." They're whole again, at least for now.

"Every parent wants to believe their kid is the golden child," Tomlinson says softly, slowly, as though he is just now absorbing the magnitude of what he's about to say. "And I'm no different. But I believe there to be substantial evidence to indicate that if there is a golden child, it very well could be her."

Model Athlete

For the better part of four long seasons, Am'ra Solomon sat on the bench of the Cal volleyball team. But her presence was always felt.

Known as "The Energizer," Solomon's vocal passion on the court is unrivaled amongst her team. When Solomon makes a play, the whole stadium knows but, more importantly, her teammates find inspiration in it.

"When she gets a block or a great kill, she has a great celebration," says coach Rich Feller. "When she's not on the court, she's one of the loudest on the bench. So absolutely, her enthusiasm is something that the team needs."

Now, in her fifth and final year, Solomon has been elevated to a starting position and also earned the title of co-captain for the No. 9 Bears. She is third on the team in kills with 54 and, despite playing primarily in the front row, she is fourth on the team in points with 58.

Still, being a captain is about more than just putting up big numbers, and it is in the category of intangibles where Solomon truly provides leadership.

"I think I pump everybody up," she says. "I'd say my biggest strength is my energy."

It's safe to say that the energy has been bottled up for quite a while. Although Solomon has seen her fair share of playing time throughout her years in the program, a starting position was difficult to come across with All-Americans such as Angie Pressey and Hana Cutura playing alongside her. Injuries didn't help her chances either.

In 2004, her first year in the Cal volleyball program, Solomon hurt her ankle in a preseason match and was forced to take a medical redshirt.

The next season, Solomon wasn't quite at the level the coaches wanted her to be and saw limited action.

By the time her junior year arrived, Solomon was still playing on the scout team during practices. But her skills had grown too much to be ignored, and she recorded career-highs in kills and attacks that season.

Despite seeing limited time during the postseason run that saw the Bears make it to the final four for the first time in school history, Solomon relished the opportunity to observe her teammates and tried to contribute however she could.

"I had the pleasure of watching Angie play," she says. "I always watched her move, and when you're on the bench and you get time to watch people who play your position, you try to mock them or be better than them."

So Solomon worked on her game. She improved on her blocking by playing against hitters such as Pressey, and she added some height to her already ridiculous vertical jump.

Most importantly, her stint with the U.S. Women's National A2 squad during this past spring improved her all-around game and gave her the confidence that she now exudes every time she walks onto the court.

But the one thing that never needed any work was Solomon's energy and passion for the game. Those elements have always been there and are part of the many reasons why Solomon has fit into the role of captain so easily.

"The combination of all her work last year and the year before have brought her to a place right now where she's starting," says Feller. "And as she continues to get her game up she has a chance to be a starter for a long time."

Model Athlete

Sometimes it's hard to connect the woman on the court with the woman off it.

Dressed in sweats and a hoodie, Am'ra Solomon sips clam chowder in the club room of Haas Pavilion. Practice ended less than half an hour ago, but there's no sign of the intense player that her teammates call "The Energizer." Relaxed, Solomon talks about her years on the court at Cal—the injuries, the victories, the team.

Then, she drops the bomb.

"I want to model," Solomon says with a little laugh, as if she can't quite believe it herself. "And I was thinking about going overseas and playing volleyball, but I haven't made up my mind yet. So I'm like all over the place."

The outside hitter from Los Angeles isn't terribly worried about the future, though. For now, the most important things are family and volleyball-which, in spite of all outward appearances, are more often than not the same thing.

On the court, Solomon causes even her team to hold their breath when she's up for a kill.

"Holy crap," says setter Carli Lloyd. "I don't want to be on the other side of that."

But this game-day ferocity isn't who she is beyond the hardwood.

This kill machine derives her strength as a player from her family. Solomon's adoration for her athletic older sister Ericka led her to pursue sports in the first place, and the support of her parents kept her going during her frustrating freshman year at Cal when she was forced to sit out the season with a fractured ankle.

"Every time I'm down, I call my parents, and they always have encouraging words," she says. "Never give up, keep fighting, prove yourself. It's part of being an athlete. You just always have to keep going forward and keep pushing yourself."

Solomon based her decision to commit to Cal with her family in mind. Amidst three trash bags full of recruitment letters, only one fit her requirements: an up-and-coming program, solid academics and, of course, a school close to home.

Now, Solomon has joined another family, and it's the bond with the teammates she calls "sisters" that is the force that brings all six-plus feet of her bearing down on her rivals.

"Meagan Schmitt said, 'Am'ra, when you get a kill and you go crazy, that pumps all of us up,'" she says. "So I try to do that more and help the team out."

On the court, a lot has changed in Solomon's five years in Berkeley. She's gone from a prep player that coach Rich Feller termed "not extremely well trained" to a co-captain and starter on the No. 9 team in the nation. But while life in Haas Pavilion has been constantly evolving, Solomon says that her distinctive family-oriented personality hasn't altered much.

"I'm a family person," Solomon says. "I always relied on my family. But now being out here, I feel that I've matured a lot. I'm more independent. I can go out on my own and be okay."

Just like when she goes up for the kill. In that split second, Solomon appears to be alone. But she knows that she isn't. Somewhere beside her, a teammate is setting the ball-making sure that when Solomon is at her zenith, she'll connect.

Tall Task: Cal readies for Sunday showdown at Stanford

The way Cal women's volleyball coach Rich Feller sees it, freshmen Tarah Murrey and Shannon Hawari are "wide-eyed wonders," but they have adapted quickly to the rigors of life in the Pac-10.

"They're not as vocal as the seniors, but they're getting more comfortable in their surroundings all the time," Feller said. "They make up in spirit what they lack in experience. They're more excitable than the other players - in a positive way."

Murrey, a 6-foot-3 outside hitter from El Cerrito and St. Mary's High in Berkeley, and Hawari, a 6-2 middle hitter from Plano, Texas, have helped the Bears win 11 straight matches and a school-record 29 straight sets.

Those streaks and much more will be on the line when Cal (16-1 overall) plays Stanford (15-2) in the Big Spike at Maples Pavilion on Sunday. Both teams are 6-0 in the Pac-10, and no other conference team has fewer than two losses.

Both teams reached the NCAA Final Four last year before losing to champion Penn State. It was Cal's first trip to the Final Four, and the 17th for Stanford, which went down in a five-set thriller in the final. This year, Penn State is ranked No. 1 in the coaches' poll. Cal is fourth and Stanford, which started at No. 2, is fifth.

"Stanford is an awesome team," Murrey said.

Will the freshmen be in awe of the Cardinal's triumvirate of All-Americans: 2007 Player of the Year Foluke Akinradewo, Cynthia Barboza and Alix Klineman?

"I don't think it's a sense of awe," Murrey said. "We're skilled players as well. They're much more experienced, and I respect their game. But when they're on the court, they're the enemy."

Hawari is prepared for the noisy reception that awaits the Bears at Stanford, where Cal has won only one of 31 matches and none since 1979. "The crowd is pretty crazy there," she said. "This is probably the match we look forward to the most."

She suspects she and the other newcomers will be in awe, but points out, "We have some great players, too."

One of them is 6-4 junior outside hitter Hana Cutura, who leads the Pac-10 with 4.45 kills per set. "It's a little scary to try to block her in practice," Hawari said. "She's an amazing athlete."

Cal's only loss was a three-set wipeout to No. 11 Minnesota in Minneapolis on Sept. 12. Despite recent ankle injuries to seniors Kat Reilly and Morgan Beck, the Bears are off to their best start since 2003.

They have gotten 12 assists per set from sophomore setter Carli Lloyd, and senior outside hitter Am'ra Solomon has emerged after playing three years behind Angie Pressey, who graduated.

Stanford had a significant loss, too, when four-year starting setter Bryn Kehoe graduated. Feller says both teams have had ample time to regroup and develop new chemistry.

"This should be one of the most interesting matchups of the year," he said. "It's for pride and Bay Area bragging rights."

With Akinradewo, Barboza and Klineman all training with the U.S. national team, Stanford had to do its offseason preparation without them.

"It was great for them to do what they were doing," Cardinal coach John Dunning said. "We got them back Aug. 8, but we played without them for five months."

It took time for the team to adjust to Dunning's new two-setter alignment with Joanna Evans and Cassidy Lichtman. Since early road losses to Nebraska and Saint Louis, though, the Cardinal have been unbeatable.

Wiley still talks, plays a good game

Starting the music was a sign to the kids. Time to put the books away. Time to calm down. At least that's what all the kids had done, had always done for Barbara Westlake, the kindergarten teacher at Flowery Elementary School in Sonoma. But that year on the first day of class, Mindi Wiley reacted differently.

Wiley left her seat and began dancing. Didn't matter that everyone else was seated. The idea hadn't crossed anyone else's mind. Didn't matter. Mindi goes with the flow. Always has. It was music. You don't sit for music. After a time, the rest of the kids got to their feet, started dancing, and Westlake's kindergarten class turned into a dance party.

"I told both of my two girls (Mindi and Brooke) that there were two types of athletes," said Keith Wiley, a former college linebacker. "You are either a leader or a follower. The advantage to being a leader is that you don't have to look back and say, 'I should have done this or I should have said that.' Mindi took it to heart."

So when Mindi Wiley and Cal face off today at 12:30 p.m. against Stanford — in a matchup of the nation's fifth- and fourth-ranked volleyball teams, respectively — it comes as no surprise to anyone who knew Wiley that she is right in the middle of it. Life, the way Wiley sees it, is not a spectator sport.

"I just feel if you aren't talking and having a good time," said Wiley, 20, a junior, "why do it?"

In other words, Wiley is made for volleyball, or maybe volleyball was made for her. Volleyball requires height; Wiley is 6-foot-3. Volleyball requires athleticism; Wiley was the 2004 Redwood Empire Athlete of the Year at Sonoma Valley High. Volleyball requires almost continuous chatter, what with the constant shifting of lines and strategies; see previous quotation. Volleyball requires energy; see dad for further details.

"When they were in eighth and ninth grades," Keith said of Brooke and Mindi, "I'd take them to the park over at Altimira Junior High to try and burn off their energy."

He made it sound like a dog owner taking his pet to a dog park to wear him out for a good night's sleep.

"Oh yeah, exactly," Keith said. "Oh, I'd never tell them that, but we'd go out there and shoot baskets, shoot a crossbow into a bale of hay, jump rope, hit tennis balls, anything."

I didn't ask Keith if he had thrown a Frisbee and asked Mindi to jump up in the air and catch it in her mouth.

There were times that all the running and jumping still didn't do the job. Here was Keith, 6-foot-4, 240 pounds, a linebacker for both Henderson Junior College and Stephen F. Austin University, who had to throw up the white flag sometimes and surrender.

"Sit down, please, Mindi," he would say to his daughter. "I need to sit down. I just can't do anymore today. Please sit down."

So, just for kicks, this week I asked Mindi Wiley what would people say today who knew her growing up?

"They would have known me as this crazy 12-year-old bouncing off the walls," she said. "Now they'd probably be surprised at how studious I am, how focused, how I am so wrapped up in volleyball."

You'd be preoccupied, too, if you had a decent chance at being an NCAA champion. Today's match will go a long way to determining that reality. Cal hasn't won at Stanford since Nov. 15, 1979 — nine years before Wiley was born. That's 28 consecutive defeats at Stanford, and it is of no solace to Wiley or the Bears that Cal plays in the Pac-10, a conference that is to volleyball what the SEC is to football. Six of the top 11 ranked teams in the nation are in the Pac-10.

"I can't wait, I wish we could play them now," Wiley, a middle hitter who directs the blocking, said last Tuesday.

That Wiley is playing college volleyball and is not a collegiate high jumper might also surprise the people who knew her as youth. Wiley was a high jumper who finished second in the state meet as a high school freshman. "But my body changed," said Wiley. Long and lean turned out to be long and thickly muscled. Her body changed and, happily, coincidentally, so did her appreciation of volleyball, which almost had become a sidelight to track and field.

"When you are high jumping," Wiley said, "it's just you out there by yourself. You can hear the crowd, You can hear everything. But when you're playing volleyball, everyone is making noise. I can be kind of loud."

Is there such a thing as a volleyball personality? Wiley thinks so. Maybe that's because she has one. Gregarious, energetic, unafraid, as if she is literally a verbal stream of consciousness.

"Happy and loud," she calls herself. "I don't want to be a robot. I celebrate each point with my teammates."

And then she gets dressed and celebrates some more with her teammates. Every year at Cal is an event called the Athletes' Formal, held at Blake's on Telegraph. Her teammates have dressed up as nuns, race car drivers, jockeys. Wiley? She came as a Spice Girl, Scary Spice to be accurate. Of course, Mindi Wiley really is Social Spice, but then Mindi Wiley would have come dressed as, well, Mindi Wiley. No costume, Mindi. Just come as you are.

Bears Notch First Win at Maples in 29 Years

STANFORD -- Lying on the court, overwhelmed by emotion, junior Mindi Wiley let out a yell that resonated throughout the arena where the No. 5 Cal volleyball team had not won in the past 29 years.

With one block, Wiley erased almost three decades of futility at Maples Pavilion and sealed a 3-1 (23-25, 25-22, 25-19, 27-25) Bears victory over No. 4 Stanford on Sunday.

"I blacked out," Wiley said. "I had trouble closing blocks, and all of a sudden, Tarah (Murrey) and I formed a solid block, and all I see is a ball falling on the other side of the net, and I just went crazy."

Wiley, along with many of her teammates, were left flabbergasted by the historic win, but also knew that the match didn't even have to go four sets. Cal (17-1, 7-0 in the Pac-10) was leading the first set before sputtering at the end and giving up four unanswered points to the Cardinal. It was the first set that the Bears had dropped since Sept. 14.

"I felt we were pushing and at the end, they pushed back, and we weren't used to that so we gave up," setter Carli Lloyd said. "We came back the next game feeling we should've taken the first set."

The last three sets were filled with more back-and-forth action, but unlike previous years, this Bears squad did not waver.

"This year's team is confident," Bears coach Rich Feller said. "When you play on the road, you're a little out of sorts, but they have that confidence level that makes them ready to play every match."

Even freshmen Murrey and Shannon Hawari, playing in their first collegiate match against Stanford (15-3, 6-1 in the Pac-10), appeared to be at ease on the court. Murrey was second on team with 14 kills and came just two digs short of recording a double-double.

"I've watched Stanford versus Cal since I was a little girl, and I've always wanted to play in this match, and it was so fun," Murrey said. "I can't even describe it."

For Murrey it was fun, but for the older players and Feller, the match was a culmination of past frustration and heartbreak. Just last year at Maples, the Bears had a match point but went down to the Cardinal in five sets.

"They've been such a monkey on our back, and we've come close but haven't quite done it in the 10 years I've been here, 29 years total," Feller said. "So for us, this is historic."

As usual, Cal's offense came out firing. Despite hitting .075 in the fourth and deciding set, the Bears hit .260 overall on a Stanford front row filled with three All-Americans.

Defensively, Cal was able to record its second-highest block output of the season with 11 total. While the Cardinal's Foluke Akinradewo and Alix Klineman combined for a .377 hitting percentage, the Bears limited the rest of the team's offense to just 25 kills and 16 errors.

"We had a hard time shutting down all the hitters, but overall we were able to get a good block up on each swing," Wiley said.

With the win, Cal now has sole possession of first place in the ultra-competitive Pac-10. The Bears will finish off the first half of conference play against USC and UCLA next week.

And if either team thinks the victory was fluke, Cal has a message for them.

"One of the fans came up afterwards and said 'Honestly, I didn't think you were going to do it,'" Wiley said. "And I told her, 'Don't underestimate us.'"

Hana Cutura paces Cal women past Stanford in volleyball

Hana Cutura had 23 kills and 12 digs Sunday as No. 5 Cal defeated No. 4 Stanford 23-25, 25-22, 25-19, 27-25 in a Pacific-10 Conference women's volleyball showdown in front of 3,085 at Maples Pavilion.

Bears freshman Tarah Murrey added 12 kills and eight digs and Kristen Kathan had 20 digs. Alix Klineman led Stanford (15-3, 6-1 in Pac-10) with 21 kills and 12 digs. But Cal (17-1, 7-0) used steady defense and passing to end the Cardinal's 11-match winning streak.

"We were trying to stop them instead of attacking them," Klineman said. "It's not that we didn't play hard but we held back at times."

Cutura, a 6-foot-4 outside hitter from Croatia, noticed Stanford's lack of energy. "Their heads were away from the court today," she said.

Cal setter Carli Lloyd had 55 assists and 12 digs, and Mindi Wiley and Am'ra Solomon added 11 kills each. Stanford setter Cassidy Lichtman had 35 assists.

Although boasting some of the country's most talented hitters, Stanford couldn't put away the Bears during crucial points. Kathan seemed to always reach a spiked ball before it hit the floor.

"Our defense was really good," Cutura said, adding the Bears knew what to expect after watching video of the Cardinal's big hitters.

Stanford still remained close with Cynthia Barboza getting 14 kills and Foluke Akinradewo adding 12 kills and seven blocks. But almost every time the Cardinal tried to make a run it fell victim to service errors or poor passing. Stanford Coach John Dunning attributed the problems to Cal's excellent play.

"How much difference was there in that match?" he asked. "It's a one-play difference. That's what this time of year gets to."

Cal volleyball team relying more and more on Meagan Schmitt

IT'S MAKE-OR-BREAK time for the Cal women's volleyball team, as the Bears prepare to host a regional in the opening two rounds of the 64-team NCAA tournament beginning with Siena on Friday at 8 p.m.

For Meagan Schmitt, a sophomore defensive specialist and former Redwood High product, make-or-break has been the mantra for some time now.

Schmitt, a little-used walk-on her freshman year, showed renewed dedication to the sport over the offseason in the spring and her hard work has paid off. She has earned a starting spot on the seventh-ranked team in the land, as well as a full scholarship.

"Her work ethic is probably second to none," said Cal coach Rich Feller, Volleyball Magazine's 2007 national coach of the year. "She's the type of player that says, 'Show me a brick wall and I'll run through it if it'll make me a better.'"

Schmitt's dedication was exhibited primarily in the spring workouts, when she said she was the first one in the gym and the last one to leave. Early in the season, Feller used junior Kristen Kathan as the team's primary defender, but as time has passed, he has utilized Schmitt

more and more.

"I decided that I only have four years to be on this team, so I needed to work 100 percent at it and take advantage of every opportunity I can," said Schmitt, whose brother Jake, mother Laura, and father Tom are or were collegiate runners. "Getting the scholarship just solidified everything I had been working towards. It was more of a confidence boost for my playing and it kind of took me to the next level."

The next level, in this case, was playing a major hand in some big wins for Cal, which won more Pac-10 games (13) than it ever had before this year.

Schmitt has played well in some of the Bears' biggest wins of the season. She had what was then a career-high nine digs in Cal's first win at Stanford since 1979. Later, she rattled off eight consecutive service points in the second game of a key match with Cal trailing USC 24-17 and 0-1 in games. The Bears went on to win the set and the match in four games.

"She doesn't have the easiest serve," Feller said. "She serves it some 30 feet behind the line and if you miss it by a fraction, you're going to miss the serve, but she went back there and hit five, six, seven (in a row) right in."

Reflecting on the season to this point, Schmitt agrees the wins over Stanford and USC were the high-water mark of the season - as of now.

"My highest point of the season will come in three weeks," said Schmitt, referring to the dates of the Final Four.

That is, if Cal can make it back. Schmitt certainly hasn't disappointed in big games so far.

Middle Fiddle

Cal volleyball junior middle hitter Mindi Wiley has helped the Golden Bears to a record-setting season

Grammy-award winning recording artist Alicia Keys once sang, "Some people live just to play the game." Her words aptly describe California volleyball junior middle hitter Mindi Wiley's insatiable desire to improve her on-court skills. Since assuming full-time starting duties for the Golden Bears, Wiley has proven herself as a valuable cog to what has become a well-oiled volleyball machine.

"Last year, I would sometimes feel lucky to get a kill. But this year, I'm upset when I don't," says Wiley. "When I'm on the court as the starting middle hitter, it's my duty to get those kills; to be good at what I do; and to be good at what I do all the time."

Appearing in all 24 of Cal's matches this season, the middle from Sonoma, Calif. has recorded 174 kills on 356 attacks; registering a .306 attack rate with just 65 errors. She leads the Bears in total blocks with 83 and averages 1.02 blocks per set. She set career-high marks for kills in a match this season when she dropped 15 on UCLA in Los Angeles. In fact, the 6-2 hitter has posted career numbers in all statistical categories en route to helping the Bears set new school records to start the season.

After sharing time with two other middle hitters last season, Wiley used the spring to hone in on the parts of her game that needed improvement most. With enhanced timing and speed, she has been taking much stronger and faster approaches to the net and her offensive numbers have made significant positive strides. However, all the kills and points in the world pale in comparison to Wiley's favorite number when she glances at the post-match box score. All she hopes to see is a couple of zeroes. In particular, she enjoys finding those zeroes in the attack error and service error columns.

"It was difficult at times to be the third middle hitter last year but in hindsight, I benefited a great deal from the time I spent learning from the best in the game," said Wiley, speaking of former Bear Ellen Orchard. "She left such a significant mark on all of her teammates and really defined what it means to play the middle hitter position here at Cal. She truly was an inspiration."

Filling perhaps some of the biggest shoes in Cal volleyball history, Wiley knows that just being good is not enough. In a few short months, she went from being a solid contributor off the bench to someone who is looked to and depended upon to play at a high level during each and every moment that she is on the court. From year two to year three, her on-court mindset has shifted from being the player who wanted to blast every ball straight at her opponents faces to one of calm calculation, making her more and more like the ever-cerebral Orchard every day.

Head coach Rich Feller remarks, "Mindi has become such an intelligent player. She jumps out of the gym and puts a real hammer to the ball but this season, we've really seen her mature in terms of her mental approach to the game of volleyball and truly believe that the sky is the limit for her."

Although success for the Bears hasn't been an overnight turnaround, Wiley is quick to point out that quickness and speed have been the staples of this up and coming Cal squad. Her fellow Bears are fast, skilled, big and talented. Wiley's favorite play to run when Cal gets into system is the D or slide play in which she connects on a back-set from the setter for a cross-court attack.

"On this team, you need to be on time no matter what you're doing whether it's attacking or blocking," said Wiley. The thoughts running through her mind are to be fast; close the block quickly; get up as high as she can; and to always be available in transition. The most satisfying moment of any match for Wiley is when she knows she has beaten her opponent to the sticks and is set up for the perfect attack. "Whenever I hit the court, the only things on my mind are to be better; to be faster and to be stronger than whoever is on the other side of the net."

Much like a member of a symphony orchestra needs the direction of a conductor, Wiley has parlayed the encouragement of her coaches into a renewed work ethic and a spirit of accountability that has lifted the Bears to new heights as a team. Cal enjoyed the best start in program history at 19-1 and recorded the best mark to open Pac-10 play with an 8-0 record. The Bears also set a new school record for consecutive home matches won (16) and logged the second longest winning streak in school history (13) while posting a new mark for consecutive sets won (29).

Wiley chooses to describe her game with just three words: aggressive, quick and fun. But what she sees in her teammates falls right in line with her desire for improvement as she plays the middle hitter position.

"This team is a group of extremely competitive women that collectively are hungry to win so when fans come to see us play, they should expect nothing less than an all out hard-fought battle."
