



STEPHEN GLADSTONE



Men's Head Coach

Regarded as one of the premier rowing coaches in the United States, Stephen Gladstone's enters his 10th consecutive season – and 18th overall – as the head coach of Cal men's crew. During the 2005 campaign, Gladstone led his team to its 10th straight top three finish at the IRA (Intercollegiate Rowing Association) National

Championships and a Pac-10 Team Championship led by a gold medal Varsity Eight, and was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year. Gladstone is one national title away from tying Charles "Pop" Courtney, who won 11 titles while coaching Cornell from 1901-15, for the most Varsity Challenge Cup Titles (IRA Varsity Eight National Championships). In 2005, the Golden Bears finished third at the IRA National Championships.

Wanting to give full measure to coaching, Gladstone resigned as Cal's athletic director in June of 2004, having assumed the position in 2001. During his time as AD, Gladstone helped turn around Cal's football program by naming Jeff Tedford to lead the Bears on the gridiron. Despite the pressures of being both athletic director and head coach for men's crew, Gladstone led his team to a bronze medal finish at the IRAs and second place at the Pac-10's, a near carbon copy of the 2003 Spring racing season, the exception being a gold medal finish for the JV Eight at the IRA and Pac-10 Championships.

Dominance was the norm during the 1999 through 2002 seasons. The varsity eights claimed the IRA National Championship each year and set an unbroken IRA record time in 1999. Additionally the JV eight won Pac-10 gold in 2002, and IRA gold in 1999, 2001 and 2002. Gladstone was recognized as Pac-10 Men's Rowing Coach of the Year for the fifth consecutive season in 2002.

In 1997 and 1998, with Gladstone's return to Cal, the Bears once again stepped onto the IRA medal stand.

From 1981-1994, Gladstone served as the Director of Rowing Operations at Brown University, where he established a program that was, at the time, unparalleled in collegiate rowing. His crews amassed four Eastern Sprints Championships, five IRA Championships and two National Collegiate Rowing Championships. In both 1993 and 1994, the Brown varsity crew completed the "triple crown" with victories in each of the aforementioned championship regattas - a feat that had never before and has never since been accomplished. In Gladstone's final season at Brown, the men's crew went undefeated at all levels of competition.

During his previous tenure at Cal from 1973-1980, Gladstone guided the Bears to three undefeated dual-race seasons, an IRA title and a Pac-10 championship.

Stephen Gladstone's name has been synonymous with success ever since he began coaching in 1966. After directing the Princeton freshmen to a pair of IRA silver medals, Gladstone took over as varsity lightweight coach at Harvard. He led the Crimson to four straight undefeated seasons, four Eastern Sprints Championships and, in 1972, the Thames Challenge Cup and Wyfold Challenge Cup victories at the Henley Royal Regatta in England. During his tenure at Harvard, he served as the U.S. National Team Coach (1969) and was a selector for the U.S. Olympic Team (1972).

A graduate of Syracuse University, Gladstone has served on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Amateur Oarsmen and has also been a member of the Men's Olympic Rowing Committee. In 1984, he served as ABC's expert commentator for rowing events at the Los Angeles Olympics, and he worked in the same capacity for NBC at the Seoul Olympic Games. Immediately prior to his return to Cal, Gladstone was the president and director of marketing for Resolute Racing Shells.

DAVE O'NEILL



Women's Head Coach

Dave O'Neill is now in his eighth year as head coach of the Cal program. During his tenure, Cal has become one of the premier programs in the country as the team has received an invitation to the NCAA Women's Rowing Championships each season. In 2005 the Cal women capped a terrific year as they won their first NCAA

championship. The varsity eight was undefeated throughout the season, and its come from behind victory in the grand final at NCAA's was the fastest in the regatta's history.

In the past seven years O'Neill has garnered numerous awards including the Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association (CRCA) national coach of the year in 1999 and 2005. He has also been awarded the CRCA West region and Pac-10 coach of the year in 1999, 2004 and 2005. In addition, he was selected coach of the year by *Independent Rowing News* in 1999 and the *Joy of Sculling* coaching conference in 2002. Under O'Neill's leadership the 2005 varsity eight was selected crew of the year by *Independent Rowing News*. There have been numerous all-Americans, and many Cal women have gone on to race at the under-23 world championships, senior world championships and Olympic Games.

O'Neill brings a refreshing perspective to a program that is reaching its limitless potential. His teams have always finished among the top six nationally including four top four finishes. The varsity eight is consistently ranked among the top five in the country and has never finished lower than tenth at NCAA's. This priority crew has finished among the top 4 nationally four times in his seven years. The varsity eight has won the Pac-10 Championships the two previous seasons (2004, 2005) and the second varsity eight has won the last three years (2003, 2004, 2005).

Before coming to Cal, O'Neill headed the women's program at Boston College for seven years. Under O'Neill, the BC women regularly competed against Division I varsity competition, and they did so with tremendous success. His crews won numerous championships at the Big East Regatta, New England Championships, Champion International Regatta, and the IRA

During the summers O'Neill has directed and coached several USRowing Development Camps at Riverside Boat Club in Cambridge, MA and at Cal. Those camps have produced several crews that have won at the USRowing nationals and Canadian Henley Regattas. In 2002 O'Neill worked with the U.S. under-23 team, and the pair he coached won a silver medal at the Nations Cup Regatta. He has been selected to coach the U.S. women's eight for the 2005 Under-23 world championship in Hazelwinkel, Belgium.

As an athlete, O'Neill was one of the country's top lightweight oarsmen. During his freshman year at Boston College, O'Neill was a founding member of the rowing program. He was selected to the 1991 pre-elite team and continued to train with elite programs at the Riverside Boat Club and Boston Rowing Center. O'Neill was also an elite level cyclist and continues to race.

A '91 graduate of Boston College with a B.A. in history, O'Neill is a firm believer that the best way to succeed is to provide the athletes with an environment conducive to learning and achievement: "If we make the everyday experience of Cal crew a worthwhile and meaningful one, results will follow."

GEOFF BOND



Men's Assistant Coach

Geoff Bond is a 1988 graduate of Brown University where he earned a B.A. in Classical Greek and Roman History. Bond rowed in Steve Gladstone's powerhouse Brown program, competing in the Freshman, JV, and Varsity Eights, between 1984 and 1988. During that period Brown won two Eastern Sprints

Championships and five IRA National Championships. After graduating, Bond and his wife, Hilary, spent two years teaching and coaching at the Salisbury School in Salisbury, Connecticut. They then traveled to Japan where they taught English for two years. Bond headed the Berkeley High School Boys Crew Program in '93/'94 and '95/'96. When Steve Gladstone returned to Cal in the Fall of '96 he asked Bond to join him as his Varsity Assistant. During his three years of apprenticeship under Gladstone, Bond helped develop the less experienced athletes while raising the standards of the team as a whole. In 1999 he lead the Bears' Henley Campaign which ended in a second-place finish in the Ladies' Plate at the Henley Royal Regatta.

Coach Bond is in his sixth year at the helm of the California Freshman Crew. In addition to three consecutive Pac-10 wins in '03, '04 and '05, his crews have been in the medals at the IRA National Championships four of the last five years. In both 2004 and 2005 the Cal Frosh were undefeated National Champions, something never done before at Cal in consecutive seasons. Another first under Coach Bond's leadership has been three consecutive victories over the Washington Huskies in the annual freshmen dual dating back to 1939.

In the rare moments when he is not training his athletes or recruiting the next generation of Cal oarsmen, Bond can be found either preparing his house for the next big quake, napping, or doing laps around the Oakland Airport on his bicycle. Currently, he and his wife live in the Oakland Hills with their three children, Evelyn, Phineas, and Beatrix.

MIKE FENNELLY



Rigger/Boatman

In his 25th year as Cal's rigger, Mike Fennelly is regarded as one of collegiate rowing's finest boatmen. He not only maintains all of the program's boats and prepares them for racing, but also keeps the entire boathouse in ship shape. For the past 14 years, Fennelly has taken responsibility of maintaining the women's

equipment in addition to the men's.

Fennelly has a strong rowing background. He rowed in high school at St. Joseph's in Alameda and continued at Long Beach State before transferring to Cal and rowing one year in the lightweight varsity eight. In 1979, Fennelly became lightweight head coach while serving as rigger apprentice under the legendary Matt Franich. In 1981, he became Cal's full-time rigger upon Franich's retirement.

Fennelly and his wife, Kathleen, live in Alameda with their two sons, Brian and Patrick.

SARA NEVIN



Women's Assistant Coach

Currently in her fifth season at Cal, Sara Nevin has led the novice crew to the top of the Pac-10, in 2004 the Bears captured the Pac-10 crown for the first time since 1989. Nevin has shown the ability to cultivate novice rowers into competitive oarswomen. Many of her rowers have moved up the ranks to contribute to the varsity's success.

The class of '05 was Nevin's first crew at Cal, and this group of seniors provided the leadership for the 2005 NCAA Championship team.

Nevin joined the Bears in 2002 after serving as the executive director and head coach at the Lake Lanier Rowing Club in Gainesville, GA. During her five years in Georgia, Nevin coached all levels of rowers from beginners to U.S. National team members. In addition to her coaching, Nevin acted as the full-time boathouse and rowing club director, as well as Regatta Director for the NCAA Women's Rowing Championships in 1998 and 2001.

Before arriving at Lake Lanier, Nevin spent seven years coaching in Seattle, Wash. Between 1989-92, Nevin coached at the Seattle Training Center, coaching a group of elite and pre-elite rowers. Her stint culminated with all eight women earning spots on the '92 Olympic team. From 1990-96, Nevin also coached the varsity boys rowing team at the Mount Baker Rowing Club. There, Nevin grew a program of 16 athletes to over 50 and won four USRowing Junior National Championships, including the school-boys' eight in 1991 and '93.

Nevin earned a B.A. in political science with a minor in pre-medicine from the University of Washington in 1985. During her rowing career at UW, Nevin won three varsity eight national championships between 1983-85 and was undefeated in U.S. collegiate competition. She was a member of the U.S. National team in 1985 and '86

2006 SEASON OUTLOOK

MEN'S PREVIEW

Cal men's crew looks to make a statement in 2006 after a successful 2005 season. Last year the Golden Bears placed third at the Intercollegiate Rowing Association (IRA) National Championship Regatta for a second consecutive year. Cal returns five members from the 2005 varsity eight

squad that that won the Pac-10 championships: Senior Rory Tuttle and juniors Elliot Bertinetti, Daniel Casaca, Eric Hand and Marko Knezevic.

"Our goals don't really change year by year; we race for the national championship every year," said varsity head coach Steve Gladstone. "We were very pleased with the way last year went, winning the Pac-Championship; 10 however, we felt our race at the IRA was below expectations. our Finishing in the top three nationally is a significant achievement; none the less, there was a feeling that we did no race to our capacity."

This year's varsity eight should be much improved over previous crews, with the squad made up primarily of rowers from the 2004 and 2005 undefeated, national champion freshman squads.

"I think there is no question that those classes back to back puts us in the strongest position we have been in since 2002," Gladstone said. "That being said, this year's senior class is also making a significant

contribution to the speed of the squad."

The varsity crew has a strong commitment to work hard in practices. Their ambition to succeed is a great asset to the Bears as they vie for the 2006 IRA National Championship.

"The varsity squad in general has an energy and ambition that is packed with good talent. I think this is the strongest we have been since 2001-2002," Gladstone said.

With seven of the eight oarsmen returning from the 2005 undefeated, national champion freshmen crew, the varsity should see a great improvement in its results. The Bears depth lies not only in the

varsity boat, but also in the second tier of rowers.

Sophomores Charlie Smith and Jan Tize are two great rowers who will

make an impact on this year's varsity squad. Both Smith and Tize have experience rowing at a high level as members of the 2005 undefeated, national champion freshman crew.

"I'd say the people from last year's freshman class who are making a significant impact are Charlie Smith, Jan Tize, along with others," Gladstone said. "Charlie sets a very aggressive pace for the crew. Jan provides strength and stamina."

> The team's fall race schedule featured one appearance at the Head of the Charles Regatta in Boston where the Bears finished in fourth place, second among the collegiate rowing teams. While the course and race format is very different than spring racing, it is an indication that Cal has a good group of oarsmen who are sure to put themselves in a position to succeed at the IRA National Championship Regatta.


"The crew had a strong performance at the Head of the Charles, beating all the collegiate crews with the exception of Princeton," Gladstone said. "That being said the Head of the Charles is not an indicator of what spring will be like."

Cal's freshman squads have made a habit of going fast. With the great successes of the boats over the past two years, there are high expectations for this year's group to remain a dominant force.

"There is a strong group of freshman, but it is very difficult to predict how they will mold as a group," Gladstone said. "None the less, there is confidence that the work we do here will bring out the best in the class."

The team is looking forward to a full season of competition against the usual challengers. With improvement over last year's team, Cal is awaiting a chance to contest the 2005 IRA National Champion, Harvard, and Pac-10 foe, Washington.

"It would appear that the main competition will be Washington, Harvard and Princeton, and an outside shot with Wisconsin," Gladstone

WOMEN'S PREVIEW

Cal Women's Crew looks to continue it's the remarkable success it has achieved over the last several years. After winning its first NCAA Championship in 2005, the program has risen to the top of collegiate rowing. The 2006 team has the experience and talent to challenge for its third straight Pac-10 championship and another NCAA title.

The Golden Bears return 14 letterwinners, all of whom have experience racing at the NCAA Championships. Head coach Dave

O'Neill is now in his eighth year at the helm of the program, and he sees this team with much potential.

"The team has grown in many ways over the last few years, and this group has learned a lot in the process. They have very high standards and know what is needed to win tough races," O'Neill said. "Throughout the year they have put in a tremendous amount of work; combine that with effort and a great attitude, and we will have a fast team come race season."

While the Golden Bears have a strong pool of talented and experience women, they expect to be challenged throughout the season.

"Everyone on the team understands that each year is different, and the only thing we can do is make the 2006 team as fast as possible," O'Neill said. "Women's rowing is really competitive, so the racing will be tough throughout the season. We will stay focused on what we can do and our goals for the year."

Leading the way for the Golden Bears are seniors Kaylan Vander

Schilden and Erin Cafaro. Vander Schilden, aco-captain from Victoria, British Columbia, is a three-time all-American and has raced at the varsity level for the three previous years. Cafaro raced with the U.S. Under-23 team last summer and won a gold medal at the Under-23 world championships.

"Kaylan and Cafaro are two of the best rowers in college right now, and they have elevated the level for the entire team. They bring skill, strength and experience to the crew and team as a whole," O'Neill said.

Also returning is junior Jelena Djukic, who stroked the varsity eight in 2005.

"Jelena is a fierce competitor, and she sets a long and smooth rhythm for everyone to follow. When she is in a boat, the confidence of everyone grows," O'Neill said.

Two additional members of last year's varsity eight are sophomore Mara Allen and senior Erin Reinhardt.

"Both Mara and Erin are skilled and talented athletes, but the biggest area of improvement for them has been their maturity. They have a terrific understanding of what it takes to win and how to get there," O'Neill said.

Natasha LaBelle and co-captain Gina Antonini are back for their senior years, and both will be integral in the team's success. Labelle and Antonini were the bow pair of the 2005 second varsity which won the Pac-10 championship and placed second at NCAA Championships.

"We can always count on Natasha to go flat out, and Gina is one of the strongest women on our team, especially for her size," O'Neill said.

Three more members of the 2005 second varsity return for the upcoming season. Juniors Megan Smith and Kirsten Hextrum are stronger technically and physically, and sophomore Candice Rediger, who stroked the W2V8, has also stepped up to another level. O'Neill anticipates all three will be vying for seats in the varsity eight.

Newcomers Lauren Nowinski, a freshman, and transfer Onna Poeter, have proven to be real boat-movers, and sophomore Laura Browne, who missed last spring due to injury, is one of the most improved on the squad.

"All three (Nowinski, Poeter and Browne) are relatively new, but they

have shown to be able to compete at this level," O'Neill said.

Under the leadership of fourth year assistant coach Sara Nevin, the novice squad is loaded with talent and look to regain the Pac-10 trophy.

"The novices are an athletic group, and they have stepped up to meet the standards of our program," O'Neill said. "They look to be a success this spring and for years to come."

The Golden Bears will face a number of challenges during the 2006 campaign. The Windermere Classic will be the first real test as both the varsity and second varsity will race perennial contenders at the NCAA championships, Ohio State and Virginia. Cal will go for its fourth straight win at the San Diego Crew Classic, and the Simpson

Cup against rival Washington will be a great test at Redwood Shores.

"After winning NCAA's last spring, everyone will be excited to race us, so we need to be prepared. I am confident we will be," O'Neill said.

Ultimately, these races point to the Pac-10 and NCAA Championship regattas where the Cal women will be racing at their peak. O'Neill believes this team has the potential to compete for the NCAA title.

"The women on this team recognize what they can accomplish, and they have shown real commitment to each other and the program. I am excited to watch them race," O'Neill said.


