TEAM NOTES

- The Bears have now won 17 consecutive Pac-12 regular season games - the longest streak active streak in the conference.
- Lindsay Gottlieb remains perfect at 28-0 against non-California Pac-12 schools.
- California set a Haas Pavilion record with 101 points - surpassing the 100 points Cal scored against Idaho State, 100-43 (11/15/09)
- The two teams set a Haas Pavilion record with 199 combined points (previous high of 166 on Feb. 19, 2004 - UCLA 97, CAI 69)
- Cal's second overtime game this season after defeating Pacific 68-66.
- California improves to 13-2 all-time when playing on the Pac-12 Network.
- California improves to 7-1 at Haas Pavilion this season.
- Oregon leads the all-time series 36-30, but California has won five consecutive games.
- The Bears committed a season-high 26 turnovers in the game.
- California surpassed 90 points for the first time since defeating Fresno State 90-76 in the NCAA Tournament First Round last season.
- Leading 60-59, the Bears went on a 7-0 run over the next 60 seconds to build themselves a 67-59 cushion with 8:39 remaining in the second half.
- For the first time this season, two Golden Bears had double-doubles in Reshanda Gray (33p-13r) and Courtney Range (12p-13r).

PLAYER NOTES

BRITTANY BOYD • JUNIOR • GUARD

- With her (9) assists, Boyd now has (397) career assists, passing Layshia Clarendon for No. 5 on the California all-time list.
- With her (4) steals, Boyd now has (228) career thefts and is (10) shy of tying Jackie Lear for No. 5 on the California all-time list.
- Went (4-for-6) from 3-point range this weekend after entering conference play just 3-for-30.

GENNIFER BRANDON • SENIOR • FORWARD

- Returned to game action for the first time since playing nine minutes against then-No. 2 Duke. Subbed in for the first time with Oregon leading 20-16 (13:22, 1st)
- Became the 24th Golden Bear to score 1,000 career points. Brandon hit her historic mark with 4:13 left in the first half to tie the game 33-33.
- Became just the fourth Golden Bear to hit the 1000-point, 1000-rebound career marks at California, joining Talia Caldwell, Colleen Galloway and Ashley Walker.
- Scored (9) points and pulled down (8) rebounds in (22) minutes of action.

RESHANDA GRAY • JUNIOR • FORWARD

- Set a new career-high with (33) points in the game.
- Had her fourth double-double of the season with (33) points and (13) rebounds.
- Matched her career-high with (2) assists in the game - last set against Oregon in Berkeley last season (Feb. 22, 2013)

JUSTINE HARTMAN • JUNIOR • FORWARD

- Matched her career-high with (2) assists in the game - last set against George Washington last season on Dec. 28, 2012.

MIKAYLA LYLES • SENIOR • GUARD

- Set a new season-high with (12) points - surpassing the 9 points set at George Washington.
- Matched her career-high with four made 3-pointers - last set when she went 4-for-6 at Stanford last season. Finished the game Sunday (4-for-4) from beyond the arc.

COURTNEY RANGE • FRESHMAN • FORWARD

- Had her second career double-double with (12) points and (13) rebounds.
- Scored a career-high (12) points.
- Hit double-digits rebounding for the sixth time this season after pulling down (13) boards
