### TEAM NOTES

- The Golden Bears remain second in the Pac-12 standings at 13-4
- The Bears can now finish no lower than No. 3 in the Pac-12 standings with one game remaining
- Win No. 78 in Lindsay Gottlieb's tenure (78-21, .788) - matching the program-record for wins over a three-year stretch. Joanne Boyle's Golden Bears won 78 games from 2007-10.
- California now owns a season-best seven game winning streak.
- Lindsay Gottlieb improves to 5-0 against Washington State as the head coach of California.
- California was held without a 3pt FG for the first time this season.
- The Bears improve to 3-0 in overtime games this season.
- Cal's 59 rebounds were a season-high and 7 shy of the program-best 66.

- California Starters: Boyd (G), Lyles (G), Jemerigbe (G), Hartman (F), Gray (F) - the ninth consecutive game that Cal has used this lineup.

### PLAYER NOTES

#### BRITTANY BOYD • JUNIOR • GUARD

- Dished (11) assists - one shy of her season-high of 12 assists against Bakersfield on Dec. 15, 2013.
- Had the second triple-double in California history with (13) points, (14) rebounds and (11) assists - last done by Eliza Sokolowska who put up 13 points, 15 assists and 10 steals against Arizona State on Feb. 9, 1995
- Became the 17th player in the NCAA this season to register a triple-double
- Just the 13th player in Pac-12 history to record a triple-double and just the 18th triple-double performed in Pac-12 history (13 players have had a total of 18 triple-doubles)
- Her (14) rebounds were a career-high
- With her (11) assists, Boyd now has (485) career assists and is (36) shy of matching Mazetta Garrett for No. 2 on the California all-time list.
- With her (1) steal, Boyd now has (263) career thefts, (23) shy of matching Courtney Johnson for No. 2 on the California all-time list.
- Boyd improves her season total to (82) steals on the year, (18) shy of Eliza Sokolowska's single-season program-best mark of 100 set in the 1994-95 season.
- The only person to play all 45 minutes of the game.

#### GENNIFER BRANDON • SENIOR • FORWARD

- With her (13) boards, Brandon now has (1183) career rebounds and passes Tina Thompson (1168, USC) for No. 7 on the Pac-12 all-time list.
- Had a season-best (3) blocked shots.

#### RESHANDA GRAY • JUNIOR • FORWARD

- Scored a career-high (43) points on 17-of-20 shooting while pulling down a career-high (16) rebounds
- Was two field goals shy of the program-best 19 made field goals by Jennifer Bennett against Creighton on March 20, 1987.
- Her 43 points are a new season-high for a Pac-12 player - surpassing the 41 points scored by Chrisae Rowe of Oregon against Seattle.
- Picked up her seventh consecutive double-double and 14th of the season with (43) points and (16) rebounds.
- Had her 11th 20-point game of the season with her (43) points.
- Scored (8) consecutive points to open the game for California on 3-of-3 shooting and two free throws.
- Scored her 1100th career point on a layup with 10:50 remaining in the first half.
- Scored 32 points at the half on 14-of-15 shooting - one point shy of her previous career high.
- Matched her season-high with (2) blocked shots
