 ► Earned honorable mention All-Pac-12 honors in his first collegiate season as he set Cal single-season records for passing yards (3,508), most yardage gained (3,508), passes completed (320), passes attempted (531), total offense (3,446) and total plays (590), while tying school records with five 300-yard passing games and three consecutive 300-yard passing games to start the season and his career
 ► Finished with a completion percentage of 60.3% (320-of-531) and a 123.18 passing efficiency rating with 18 touchdowns and 10 interceptions, tying for 10th on Cal's all-time single-season list for touchdown passes

► Set single-game school individual marks for passing yards (504 vs. Washington State), passing attempts (64 vs. Northwestern) and total plays (71) vs. Northwestern with Cal also setting single-team school team marks for passing yards (504 vs. Washington State) and passing attempts (65 vs. Northwestern)

▶ Helped Cal set single-season school records for passing yards (3,977), pass completions (368), pass attempts (622), first downs passing (183) and total plays (1,046)

The only true freshman quarterback in Cal history to start the team's season-opener and one of only four players to start all 12 games in

▶ On 2014 preseason watch list for the CFPA Wide Receiver Trophy and third-team preseason All-Pac-12 by Athlon and Phil Steele

▶ On the Biletnikoff Award Watch List honoring college football's most outstanding receiver all the way from the preseason when he led Cal in receiving yards (852) in 2013 and tied for team lead in touchdown receptions (5), while ranking second in receptions (70) and tied for second in scoring (30) – all career highs

▶ Registered career and Cal season-highs of 14 catches and 231 receiving yards against Washington State that are both third on the school's all-time single-game lists

► Cal's active career leader in receptions (111), receiving yards (1,396), receiving touchdowns (7), total touchdowns (8) and points (48), while ranking second in all-purpose yards (1,429) over 23 games played and 14 starts during his first two seasons with the program ► Contributed seven catches for 100 yards and two touchdowns in 2013, including a memorable one-handed scoring catch against Portland

State dubbed "The Grab" that earned ESPN's top play for the weekend and was among candidates for the top catch of the year by several media outlets

 ▶ Has career totals of 16 receptions, 199 receiving yards and two touchdown catches over 17 games played and one start
 ▶ Rushed 67 times for 317 yards and two touchdowns in 2013 to rank tied for second on the team in rushing touchdowns, while he was third in both rushes and rushing yards

• Registered an average of 4.7 yards per carry that was second on the team among regulars

► Has played in more games than any other current Cal running back (20) with one start, compiling career totals of 426 yards rushing and three touchdowns

▶ Played in 11 games with five starts including each of the last three contests in 2013, co-leading the team with five touchdown catches among his 37 receptions for 347 yards receiving that were both fourth

► Also shared the team lead with five total touchdowns in 2013 and was ranked tied for first among non-kickers and tied for second overall in scoring with 30 points

► Had a single-game school-record-tying and team season-high three touchdown catches against Arizona
► Started 11 games in 2013 at right tackle but is expected to become the team's starter at left tackle in 2014 after taking over that role during the team's 2014 spring workouts

► An Athlon Sports third-team Freshman All-American and midseason third-team All-Pac-12 selection of Phil Steele, both as a kick returner, and also earned a spot on the CFPA National Freshman Performer of the Year Watch List in 2013

▶ Led the team with 445 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns in 2013 while his 6.0 yards per rush was the best among regulars and his 74 carries second on the club

Also led the squad with 1,638 all-purpose yards in 2013, adding school records and team highs of 46 kick returns and 1,006 kick return yards as well as 14 receptions for 187 yards and one touchdown

► Started last five games in 2013 at left tackle with team improving rushing average by 37.8 ypg during his starts

Played in 12 games with three starts in 2013, recording career highs of 25 receptions and 231 yards receiving while equaling a career best with one touchdown catch, ranking fifth on the team in yards receiving and sixth in receptions

▶ Leads all current Cal players with 24 starts as Cal's only player to have started every game possible over the last two seasons during his 2012 redshirt freshman and 2013 sophomore campaigns

One of only four Cal players to start all 12 games in 2013, starting the first four contests at left guard and the final eight at center after a

season-ending injury to Chris Adcock

► Fourth-team preseason All-Pac-12 in 2014 according to Phil Steele

► Has played in 21 games with 17 starts over his first two seasons in the program, ranking second among active players in career receptions (98) and receiving yards (967), while adding two touchdown catches to rank tied for fourth

Honorable mention All-Pac-12 selection and on the watch list for the Biletnikoff Award in 2013 when he led the team with 77 receptions to rank fourth on the school's all-time single-season list, while ranking second with 751 yards receiving and adding one scoring catch

  ► Played in all 12 games with four starts all coming in succession over the final five contests in 2013
  - ► Totaled 15 tackles and ranked tied for third on the team with 2.0 sacks for a team-high 16 yards in 2013, while adding 3.0 tackles for loss for 19 yards to rank tied for third on the club, one forced fumble to rank tied for second on the team, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry
  - ► Has played in 33 games with 18 starts over the last three seasons of his first four campaigns with the program, including all 24 contests possible over the last two seasons with his 18 starts tied for the most of any active Cal player on the defensive side of the ball
  - Cal's active career leader with 150 tackles, four interceptions that he has returned for 67 yards, eight pass breakups and two fumble recoveries that he has returned for 19 yards
  - ▶ Played in all 12 games with 10 starts including each of the team's last five contests in 2013, leading the squad in tackles (67), fumble recoveries (2) and fumble recovery yards (19) while his single interception tied for the team lead and his five pass breakups tied for second ▶ Has played in 16 games with seven starts over his first three campaigns with the program despite missing the 2012 season and the final seven games of the 2013 campaign due to injury
  - ▶ Second among active Cal players with seven pass breakups and tied for second with one interception that he returned eight yards and one fumble recovery, while adding 54 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss (-10 yards) and one reception for 11 yards
  - ▶ Contributed career highs of 30 tackles, five pass breakups that tied for second on the club and 1.5 tackles for loss (-5 yards) in 2013 as well as his first career reception for 11 yards on a fake punt from Jared Goff vs. Ohio State while starting the first five games before suffering a season-ending injury against Washington State
  - ▶ Played in 10 games with eight starts and tied for third on team with 64 tackles and tied for fourth with 5.0 tackles for loss (-16 yards), while he was tied for second with both one fumble recovery and one forced fumble
  - ► Added 1.0 sack (-7 yards), one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry before an injury against USC in the 10th game of the season ended his campaign
  - ► Has played in 24 games primarily on special teams but also with five starts at safety and in a reserve role at the position over his first three seasons with the program despite missing all but most of the first half of the season-opening contest of his 2013 junior campaign due to injury
  - ▶ Started the lone game he played at strong safety in the team's 2013 season-opener vs. Northwestern and recorded a game-high-tying and team-high 10 tackles as well as one interception that tied for the team's season lead in addition to 0.5 tackles for loss (-2 yards) before suffering a season-ending injury in the second quarter
  - ▶ Expected to move into a starting cornerback role as a 2014 sophomore after playing in the final 10 games and starting the last eight at a strong safety position in 2013 when he was forced into action due to injuries
  - ► Eight starts in 2013 were second among the team's true freshmen behind quarterback Jared Goff
  - ► Second on the team with 65 tackles, while adding 0.5 tackles for loss (-1 yard), three pass breakups to rank tied for fourth on the team and one forced fumble to rank tied for second
  - ▶ Saw the most extensive action of his collegiate career in 2013, moving from wide receiver to cornerback early in the season and totaling 24 tackles, 0.5 tackles for loss (-0 yards), three pass breakups to tie for third on the team and one forced fumble to tie for second in 10 games with one start

## KABAM FIELD AT CALIFORNIA MEMORIAL STADIUM DIRECTIONS

Attending a Cal football game at Kabam Field at California Memorial Stadium is an exciting entertainment experience. The stadium is located along Piedmont Avenue between Bancroft Way and Hearst Avenue on campus in Berkeley. The best way to get to the venue is to plan ahead and consider all transportation options available to you.

#### BY AUTOMOBILE

From San Francisco Airport, take Highway 101 north to Interstate 80 and cross the Bay Bridge. Once over the bay, take Highway 24 toward Walnut Creek. Exit at Claremont Avenue and turn left. Turn left onto College Avenue (third light). Turn right onto Channing Way, then left onto Prospect Street, which will lead to the south end of the stadium.

**From Oakland Airport**, take Interstate 880 north, then Highway 24 east toward Walnut Creek and follow directions above.

**Gameday media parking** is located in the Underhill Garage at the corner of College Avenue and Channing Way.

These directions provide the most direct routes to Memorial Stadium, but other city streets and freeway exits provide alternate routes that fans are encouraged to use to avoid congestion. Please call 511 or go to 511.org for real-time traffic conditions.

#### **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION**

Public transportation is highly recommended when visiting Berkeley. There are multiple options that lead directly to Memorial Stadium, and the Downtown Berkeley BART station is about one mile west of the venue. Please visit bart.gov, actransit. org or 511.org for more information.

#### **CREDENTIAL REQUESTS**

All requests/questions for media, photo and parking credentials for 2014 Cal football home games should be made to Herb Benenson (510-334-0791, benenson@berkeley.edu) in the Athletic Communications Office at 349 Haas Pavilion, University of California, Berkeley, CA 94720. Only media who cover the Bears on a regular basis will be considered for season credentials. A lost season credential will result in that member of the media being moved to the single-game list.

All single-game requests should be made as far in advance as possible to help ensure space availability both in the press box and on the field. Requests for media covering a visiting team for a Cal home game should be made through the opposing school's football media relations contact. Credentials will be available for pick up at Media Will Call located in the third-floor lobby of the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance just outside Gate 5 near Warring Alley the day of the game unless other arrangements are made.

Media should consult CalBears.com/media for complete media and credential policies.

#### **INTERNET ACCESS**

Both wireless and ethernet connections are available in the press box and field-level photographer work area. Contact a member of the Cal Athletic Communications staff on gameday to obtain a username and password for wireless access. No password is necessary for ethernet connections.

#### **MEDIA PARKING**

The Underhill Garage serves as the football gameday media parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about three blocks from Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to Media Will Call at Gate 5 in Memorial Stadium or use a media-only shuttle that begins running two hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available postgame from the pregame dropoff point along Warring Street to the Underhill Garage.

Parking passes cannot be left at will call on gamedays and must be picked up or mailed in advance.

Television crews should order parking passes for their crews by sending in the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the university's website (pt.berkeley.edu) in advance. Request the Underhill Garage for football games. Note that the campus parking office does not accept credit cards – only cash or check.

Parking at Cal is always at a premium and visitors are encouraged to use public transportation. The Downtown Berkeley BART station is located about one mile west of Memorial Stadium, in close proximity to Haas Pavilion, Edwards Stadium/Goldman Field, the Hellman Tennis Courts and Spieker Aquatics Complex. AC Transit also runs several

lines to campus on gamedays.

On non-football gamedays, hourly guest parking is available in the Witter Lot east of Memorial Stadium, at the Underhill Garage off Channing Way and in the RSF Garage along Bancroft Way.

#### **MEDIA WILL CALL**

Media Will Call is located at Gate 5 in Memorial Stadium. It will open six hours before kickoff and remain open through the conclusion of the first quarter. Identification is required to pick up credentials or tickets. Parking passes cannot be left at will call.

Media who arrive after the end of the first quarter should call the press box at (510) 642-3098 to obtain their credentials.

#### **PHOTO REQUESTS**

Requests for photos can be made through the Athletic Communications Office. Fans can also purchase images of all 30 teams by visiting goldenbearsports.com.

#### **PHOTOGRAPHERS**

Field photographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be picked up on gamedays at Media Will Call located at Gate 5 in Memorial Stadium. Photo vests are distributed on the field behind the visitor (west) bench and near the entrance to the photographer work room at the 20-yard line on the north end and west side of the field.

NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the playing field and outside the 25-yard lines (team area).

In addition, photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the press box.

## PHOTOGRAPHER WORK ROOM

A photographer work room has been established at field level in Memorial Stadium (west side at approximately the 20-yard line on the north end of the field). Power and internet access are available, as well as limited desk space on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional photographer work stations are available in the press box. Pregame meals and drinks are available on the south end of the media level of the press box (seventh floor).

Access to the internet is available through both wireless and ethernet connections. Contact a member of the Athletic Communications staff on gameday to obtain a username and password for wireless access. No password is necessary for ethernet connections.

## PLAYER/COACH INTERVIEWS

All player and coach interviews, either in person, by phone or via email, must be coordinated through Kyle McRae in the Cal Athletic Communications Office (510-219-9340, mcrae@berkeley.edu).



#### **POSTGAME INTERVIEWS**

Cal football will conduct postgame interviews in the Tahir Family Team Theater inside the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance. A member of the Athletic Communication staff will lead media to the room at the conclusion of each game.

Cal head coach Sonny Dykes as well as players and coaches requested by media members will be present to answer questions. Visiting team interviews will be in the media room just outside the visiting team locker room on level one of the stadium (through a tunnel on the southwest end of the field). Contact the visiting team's Athletic Communications Office for postgame policies.

## POSTGAME MEDIA WORK AREA

The Memorial Stadium press box also serves as the postgame media work location. The area is equipped with desk space, electrical outlets and internet access. Final statistical game books, as well as postgame notes, quotes and other relevant media materials will be distributed.

Cal is scheduled to practice at Memorial Stadium during the 2014 season on Sunday and Tuesday-Thursday. Contact Kyle McRae for specific policies regarding non-gameday coverage of the team.

#### THE FLAGSHIP STATION

KGO 810 AM is entering its 42nd season as the flagship station of California Golden Bears football.

KGO Radio's 50,000 watts has been carrying Cal football since 1974. Led by play-by-play announcer Joe Starkey, KGO's signal, along with the other affiliates within



the Cal IMG Sports Network, provides statewide coverage of Cal football. Each KGO broadcast begins 60 minutes before kickoff. Then after all the action, the 60-minute postgame show hosted by Lee Grosscup and Danny Freisinger airs live from the Paragon Restaurant & Bar inside The Claremont Hotel Club & Spa and features a reaction from the Bears' locker room followed by a breakdown of the game.

#### IN THE BOOTH

Joe Starkey, the legendary voice of the Golden Bears, is in his 41st season with the Cal football broadcast team in 2014.

Cal's play-by-play voice is perhaps best known

for his legendary call of "The Play." The famous fivelateral kickoff return for a touchdown against Stanford in 1982 is part of college football lore with Starkey's emotional "the band is on the field" part of gridiron vernacular.

Starkey has had an array of NFL and NHL positions

during his career, including a 20-year stint with the San Francisco 49ers he fulfilled in conjunction with his Cal duties from 1979-2008.

In 2010, Starkey received the Chris Schenkel Award from the National Football Foundation for his distinguished career broadcasting college football.

He is joined in the booth by former Cal quarterback Mike Pawlawski, who will be in the fourth season and

second stint as part of the Cal football broadcast team in 2014. Pawlawski previously served for one season as the team's analyst in 2004 after two campaigns on the sideline before rejoining the broadcast team in 2012. He has also been a television football analyst since 2000, working for entities such as Comcast SportsNet, FOX and NBC.

Pawlawski led Cal to backto-back bowl victories as the Bears' starting quarterback in 1990 and 1991, and was the Pac-10's Co-Offensive Player of the Year as a 1991 senior.

In his 11th season on the broadcast team in 2014 is sideline reporter Todd McKim, who also serves as
