TEAM NOTES

- California drops to No. 4 in the Pac-12 standings at 11-4, three games behind leader Oregon State (13-1), one game behind second place Stanford (12-3) and half a game behind third place Arizona State (11-3)
- California held a 32-23 halftime lead, the first time Cal has led Stanford at the half since winning a 67-55 game at Maples Pavilion on Jan. 13, 2013
- The Bears forced Stanford into their Pac-12 high of 18 turnovers
- California committed a season-low 10 turnovers despite losing the game
- The crowd of 5,039 was the second-largest crowd of the season
- The Bears received no points from their bench for the second consecutive game
- Stanford won the rebounding battle 43-27, Cal's worst rebounding margin of the season (Kansas had a +15 rebounding margin on the Bears on Dec. 7)
- Cal shot 42.9% (12-of-28) in the first half but just 11.1% (3-of-27) in the second half
- The two teams combined for just 15 assists in the game
- Brittany Boyd and Reshanda Gray have both played in 126 career games - 10th-most in California women's basketball history.

PLAYER NOTES

BRITTANY BOYD • SENIOR • GUARD

- Played all 40 minutes
- Matched her season-high with (1) blocked shot
- With her (6) points, Boyd has (1577) in her career, just (11) shy of matching Devane Hampton (2006-09) for No. 9 on the California all-time points list at 1,588.
- With her (6) assists, Boyd has (686) in her career, just (2) shy of matching Brenda Pantoja for No. 4 on the Pac-12 all-time assists list.
- With her (1) steal, Boyd has (346) in her career, the most for an active player in the NCAA.

RESHANDA GRAY • SENIOR • FORWARD

- Has gone 17-of-19 from the free throw line in Cal's last two games
- Attempted a season-low four field goal attempts
- With her (9) points, Gray has (1654) in her career and is (112) points shy of cracking Cal's all-time top five.
- With her (9) rebounds, Gray has (849) in her career, just (6) shy of matching Cynthia Cooke (1982-85) for No. 8 on the California all-time rebounds list.

GABBY GREEN • FRESHMAN • GUARD

- Had her fifth-career Pac-12 game in double figures scoring with (10) points

MERCEDES JEFFLO • SOPHOMORE • GUARD

- Led the Bears in scoring for just the second time in her career (last vs Utah on Jan. 3, 2015) with 14 points
- Averaging 15.0 points over Cal's last five games
