TEAM NOTES

- The Bears move to 12-4 in Pac-12 play and have earned a first round bye in the upcoming Pac-12 Tournament
- The California senior class (Brittany Boyd, Reshanda Gray, Justine Hartman, Brittany Shine) is the only current senior class in the Pac-12 to earn two wins at Maples Pavilion
- California's first win over Stanford at Maples Pavilion since the historic 67-55 win on Jan. 13, 2013 that ended Stanford's 81-game conference winning streak
- Lindsay Gottlieb's 99th career win as the head coach of California
- Cal's second win over a ranked opponent this season
- California is now tied for third in the Pac-12 with Stanford
- The two teams combined for just one free throw attempt - a miss by Stanford - in the first half
- Cal earned 10 points from its bench after getting zero over the last two games
- California won the rebounding battle, 35-31, after being outrebounded 41-27 Wednesday
- The Bears forced Stanford into five shot clock violations
- Brittany Boyd and Reshanda Gray have both played in 127 career games - 10th-most in California women's basketball history.
- California starters: Green (G), Jefflo (G), Cowling (W), Range (F), Gray (F)
- Halftime: Stanford 29, California 27
- Attendance: 5,209

PLAYER NOTES

BRITTANY BOYD • SENIOR • GUARD

- Had her team-leading ninth double-double of the season with 12 points and 13 rebounds
- Pulled down a game-high (13) rebounds, her first double-figure rebounding game since she did so in a three-game stretch against Utah, Colorado and Washington State.
- Her seventh game this season with 10 or more rebounds.
- With her (12) points, Boyd has (1589) in her career, to pass Devanei Hampton (2006-09) for No. 9 on the California all-time points list.
- With her (4) assists, Boyd has (686+) in her career, passing Brenda Pantoja for No. 4 and just (7) shy of matching Erica Gomez for No. 3 on the Pac-12 all-time assists list.
- With her (1) steal, Boyd has (347) in her career, the most for an active player in the NCAA.

MIKAYLA COWLING • FRESHMAN • WING

- Finished with 9 points

RESHANDA GRAY • SENIOR • FORWARD

- Scored a team-high (17) points
- With her (17) points, Gray has (1671) in her career and is (95) points shy of cracking Cal's all-time top five.
- With her (9) rebounds, Gray has (858) in her career, passing Cynthia Cooke (1982-85) for No. 8 on the California all-time rebounds list.

MERCEDES JEFFLO • SOPHOMORE • GUARD

- Scored (15) points with (4) assists and (2) steals
- After starting the season 16-of-69 from beyond the arc, Jefflo has gone 9-of-22 over Cal's last four games.
