

2008-09 SEASON PREVIEW

BOLSTERED BY OLYMPIANS, CAL SETS SIGHTS ON ANOTHER TOP FINISH

California has its sights set on competing for another top finish at the NCAA Championships in the second year of **David Durden's** reign with the Golden Bears. Cal has a slew of talented swimmers and divers on its roster, including U.S. Olympic gold-medalist **Nathan Adrian** and fellow 2008 Olympians **Martti Aljand**, **Guy Barnea**, **Damir Dugonjic** and **Martin Liivamagi**, joined by freshmen and returning Bears who hope to build on Durden's first year as head coach last season.

Under Durden in 2007-08, the Bears exceeded expectations by taking second place in the Pac-10 Championships and finishing fourth in the NCAA Championships. Along the way, they racked up six conference titles, 10 swimmers earned All-America honors and two more Bears earned honorable mention All-America honors. Seven of those All-Americans and honorable mention All-Americans – William Copeland, Mark Eckert, Sam Helvie, Louis Vayo and Joe Whittington and 2008 Olympians Jernej Godec and Dominik Meichtry – are gone, but the cupboard is far from bare.

"One of the things we have to immediately address is losing 11 seniors from last year's squad," Durden said. "Those 11 guys provided a lot of leadership, provided a lot of points at the Pac-10s and at the NCAA level, so we need a lot of our younger guys to step up and fill some of those voids. We have guys returning who have put themselves in a great position to be impactful at the Pac-10 and NCAA level. Just looking at our senior class now, a guy like **David Russell**, who finished third at the NCAA Championships in the 100 back and made the consolation final in the 200 back, we're going to expect and need great things from him at the NCAA level."

Russell is also an important contributor in medley relays; he led off the second-place 400-medley relay (3:05.38; 45.93 split) and led off the third-place 200-medley relay (1:24.50; 21.68 split) at last year's NCAA Championships. He capped off a strong year by competing in the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials, tying for 14th in the 100-meter backstroke (55.18) this past summer.

Cal will also look to its other seniors, including **Ian Lentz**, newcomer **Bennett Clark**, **John Foster** and **Dash Rothberg**, for leadership this season. Clark transferred

to Cal from Missouri after competing in the 50- and 100-meter freestyles in the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials. The former Tiger, who took last season off from collegiate swimming to focus on earning a trip to Beijing, gives Cal an immediate threat in the sprint freestyles and relays.

Foster returns to the Cal fold after competing for the Bears as a freshman in the 2004-05 season, when he posted top-10 finishes in the 200- and 500-yard frees and in the 1,650 free at the Pac-10 Championships and competed in the NCAA Championships. Lentz, another 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials swimmer, adds depth in the individual medley and butterfly events at the Pac-10 level and perhaps, in his final season as a Bear, at the NCAA Championships level.

Cal's roster is dotted with other internationally and nationally experienced athletes, including sophomore **Graeme Moore** and freshmen **Miller Douglas**, **Chris Rogers** and **Nolan Koon**, who the Bears will lean on to produce great results this season.

FREESTYLE

Cal should be strong again in the sprints, with talent including Nathan Adrian, Bennett Clark, Graeme Moore and Nick Cordes. Adrian is the latest in a long line of successful Cal sprinters that includes some nationally and internationally decorated athletes.

"Nathan Adrian is probably one of the most if not the most prolific American sprinters that's out there," Durden said. "He has a tall task for being a sprinter, not only from wearing a Cal cap and what that brings of the

legacy from Matt Biondi to Anthony Ervin to Duje Draganja – now Nathan picks up that torch and carries it – but also just from having the proverbial bulls eye on his back, having to bring it every meet, every day, to prepare himself for the NCAA Championships.

While at Missouri, Clark set the 100-yard free record of 43.58. His top time in the 50-yard free is 19.55, which would tie him for ninth place on Cal's all-time list.

Durden expects Moore to continue to build on a career that included qualifying for the NCAA Championships in the 50 and 100 frees. The Johannesburg, South Africa, product is another internationally experienced Bear who posted Cal's fourth-fastest 50 (19.93) and the Bears' fifth-best 100 (43.65) of the season at NCAAs as a freshman. Moore swam Cal's third-fastest 200 free (1:37.82) in 2007-08.

Cordes is a Maryland transfer whom Durden recruited when he was the Terrapins head coach. He should be immediately impactful as an NCAA Championships-level competitor. Cordes was one of the fastest American sprinters last year, when he swam a Maryland-best 19.88 in the 50 free as a freshman at the ACC Championships. Moore, sophomore **Daniel Smith**, Martti Aljand and junior **Scott Sorge** give Cal a solid 200-free corps.

Casey is Cal's top returning distance swimmer. He had Cal's second-best times in both the 1,000 (9:19.04) and 1,650 (15:28.00) as a sophomore and swam in the 1,500-meter free at the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials. Durden also looks for freshman Isaac

Howell to make an impact in the 200, 500 and the mile.

BREASTSTROKE

Cal has one of the most dynamic groups of breaststrokers in the nation, including Olympians Damir Dugonjic and Martti Aljand along with junior **Sean Mahoney**, sophomore **Nick Ferrif** and freshman **Tim Freeman**. Dugonjic tied for second in the 100 breaststroke in a time of 52.61 at the 2008 NCAA Championships after setting a school record with a 52.50 in the NCAA preliminary heat. Mahoney was another top-five NCAA finisher, with the 2009 World University Games swimmer taking third in the 200 breaststroke in 1:54.65; his prelim time of 1:54.14 was Cal's fastest last year.

Aljand swam the second-fastest times in both the 100 (53.18) and 200 (1:56.14) last season. His latter time came in his sixth-place finish at NCAAs last year. He swam the 53.18 in the NCAA 100 breaststroke prelim and notched a 53.37 to take eighth in the final.

Ferrif and Freeman both competed in the 100-meter breaststroke at the U.S. Olympic Trials, with Freeman also swimming in the 200. Ferrif, who was 13th in the 100 breaststroke (1:02.31) at trials, posted Cal's fourth-fastest 100-yard breaststroke (55.08) and sixth-fastest 200-yard breaststroke (2:01.45) last season.

Nolan Koon is yet another talented young breastroker on the roster. He competed in the 2008 Junior National Championships in the 100-meter breaststroke, placing 13th (1:06.33).

BUTTERFLY

The return of Nathan Adrian will help in the butterfly, freestyle and relay events. His time of 46.80 in the 100-yard butterfly two years ago would have been Cal's best time in the 100 fly last year. Adrian joins **Matt Scanlan**, Guy Barnea, Nick Cordes and Ian Lentz among the fastest Bears in the 100 this year.

Scanlan is Cal's top returner in both the 100 and 200 races from last year. He posted Cal's fastest time in the 200 in 2007-08, swimming a 1:45.83, and Cal's second-fastest 100 (47.62) last season. An Olympic backstroker last summer, Barnea also holds Israeli records in both the 50- and 100-meter butterfly events. Cordes led his Terps team with a 48.57 in the 100 fly last year.

Miller Douglas will join Scanlan, Lentz, and David Russell among Cal's best 200 fly swimmers. The freshman swam a 2:01.52 in the 200-meter event in this year's Olympic Trials.

BACKSTROKE

Also a 2008 Olympic Trials competitor in 200-meter backstroke, David Russell, posted Cal's top time in the 100 backstroke - swimming a 45.42 to take third place in the NCAA Championships - and swam Cal's second-fastest 200 backstroke with a 1:42.01 to win the Pac-10 title in that event last year.

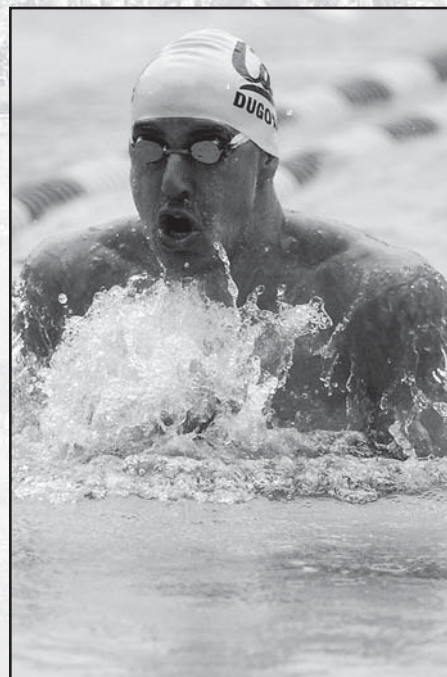
Graeme Moore, Martti Aljand and Matt Scanlan are Cal's other threats in the 100 back. Moore and Aljand finished 6-7 and Scanlan was 13th in that race in the Pac-10 Championships. Moore was also 14th in the 200 back at Pac-10s, with Aaron Casey taking eighth.

Freshmen Chris Rogers will bolster the backstroke events. Last July, Rogers competed at the World Youth Games in Mexico for the United States in both the 100 and 200 backstrokes.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

Martti Aljand and Sean Mahoney will lead the way in the 200 individual medley. Both competed in the 200 IM in last year's NCAA Championships, with Aljand taking 13th place in a time of 1:45.80 and Mahoney placing 16th in 1:46.60. Aljand posted Cal's fastest time in the 200 IM with his 1:45.27 in the NCAA prelims. Martin Liivamagi brings plenty of international experience in the 200-meter IM from competing in Beijing, the 2007 World Championships and the 2006 European Championships.

Aaron Casey should also make an impact in the 400 individual medley this season, after he reached the NCAA Championships in the 400 IM last year. Casey posted a career-best time in the 400 IM in the 2008 Pac-10 Championships, taking fourth place



with a time of 3:49.20, which is Cal's fastest returning time.

RELAYS

In the medley relays, half of Cal's quartet in both the 200- and 400-yard events returns, in backstroker David Russell and breastroker Damir Dugonjic. Who will man the butterfly and freestyle events at Pac-10s and NCAAs in either relay remains to be seen. There are several candidates to fill the strokes, including Bennett Clark, Graeme Moore, Nathan Adrian, sophomore **Josh Daniels** and Scott Sorge in the freestyle and Adrian, Matt Scanlan, Ian Lentz and Miller Douglas in the butterfly.

Durden will need to reconstruct Cal's 200- and 400-yard free relays, as only one swimmer - Graeme Moore in the 200 - returns from the Bears' third-place relays in the 2008 NCAA Championships. Moore and Martti Aljand are back from Cal's 10th-place 800-free relay at NCAAs. With talent that includes a world-class sprinter in Adrian, an internationally experienced swimmer in Moore and an Olympic Trials veteran in Clark, Cal should have plenty of talent to fill those spots.

DIVING

Coach **Tom Davidson** has another young diving corps led by sophomores **Tom Henninger** and **Taylor Dehn**. Freshmen **Joe Quattrocchi** and **Bobby Sullivan** join the squad this season. Last year, Dehn posted three top-10 finishes in the Pac-10 Championships, taking seventh place on the one-meter springboard with a score of 299.20, eighth on the three-meter board (302.30) and ninth on the platform (269.00). Henninger was sixth at one meter (307.45), ninth at three meters (289.95) and 11th on the platform (216.55).

"This year's team may seem very young if you only look at what year they are in school," Davidson said. "What you will not notice is the amount of experience they have competing against some of the best divers in the country. I am really looking forward in to seeing Taylor and Tom grow into solid leaders and point scorers after very successful freshmen years."

Across the board, the sophomores may be the key to the Bears' season. With second-year swimmers including Nathan Adrian, Martti Aljand, Guy Barnea, Graeme Moore and Nick Cordes and sophomore divers in Henninger and Dehn, the Cal sophomores may have the most talent than any other Cal class

"We have the most impact potential in our sophomore class," Durden said. "I hate using that word - potential - but that's where we're going to get our most NCAA points scored, from that sophomore class."

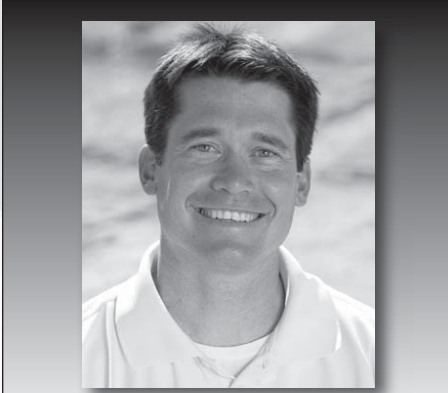

CALIFORNIA HEAD COACH



DAVID DURDEN
Head Coach
2nd Season at California

In his first season as head coach at California, **David Durden** continued the strong tradition that the Golden Bears have fostered through the years in men's swimming and diving. Ranked 11th in the 2007-08 regular season, Cal performed well in a talented field of Pac-10 teams to take second place in the conference championships and then take fourth place in the NCAA Championships.

Durden's team produced nine swimmers - including **Damir Dugonjic**, who was second in the 100-yard breaststroke, **Sean Mahoney**, who was third in the 200-yard breaststroke, **David Russell**, who was third in the 100-yard backstroke - who earned All-American honors at the NCAA Championships. Three relays - the second-place 400-medley relay and third-place 200-medley and 400-freestyle relays - finished in the top three at the national meet. Also, Cal diver Sam Helvie and various swimmers earning honorable mention All-America distinction at NCAAs.

In his first foray into what is one of the top conferences in the nation, Durden led Cal to a second-place finish behind eventual NCAA champion Arizona in the Pac-10 Championships.

The Bears won six Pac-10 titles in 2008 with Russell claiming the 200 backstroke, William Copeland taking the 50 and 100 freestyles, and Cal winning the 200-freestyle, 200-medley and 400-medley relays.

Once the college season ended, two of Durden's protégés - then-freshmen Dugonjic and **Martti Aljand** - competed with several other Bears in the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing. Dugonjic, swimming for Slovenia reached the 100 breaststroke semifinals, while Aljand, swimming for Estonia, raced in both the 100 and 200 breaststroke events.

A former top assistant at Auburn who for the two seasons prior to 2007-08 guided the Maryland's men's and women's swimming and diving teams, Durden was hired to direct the men's swimming program at California in August 2007. Durden took over the coaching reins from Hall of Fame coach **Nort Thornton**, who retired in July 2007 after 33 years at the helm of Cal swimming. Thornton has remained involved in the men's swimming program as Cal's head coach emeritus.

Durden, 32, spent five seasons at Auburn, including 2005 when he was the assistant head men's coach for the 2005 NCAA champion Tigers. Prior to being the No. 1 assistant and chief recruiting coordinator for the powerhouse Auburn men's team, he was an assistant coach for both the Tigers' men's and women's swim programs. During his tenure, the Tiger men's and women's teams won a total of six NCAA team championships - the men winning in 2003, 2004 and 2005, and the women winning in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Auburn women finished second at the national meet in 2005.

At Auburn, Durden was the primary coach for a number of world-class/postgraduate swimmers who were preparing for the World Championships and the World University Games. He mentored multiple world and NCAA record holders, and in 2004 coached multiple athletes who represented the United States at the Olympic Games. Durden also served as the head coach for the



Panama team at the 2004 Olympic Games and the 2003 Pan American Games.

"David is a perfect fit to carry on the legacy of athletic and academic excellence that has been so prevalent in the program built by Nort Thornton over the past three-plus decades," said Cal Director of Athletics **Sandy Barbour**. "Not only do I believe David will be a fabulous success, but I am thrilled that a person of such character and integrity will be providing leadership for the young men in our program. He has extensive experience coaching some of the nation's elite collegiate and international swimmers."

"I was impressed with David and look forward to working with him," said Thornton. "He is sharp and I am really pleased someone of his caliber has decided to come aboard. Working at Auburn he has certainly been around world-class athletes. Everyone in the coaching community I have talked to recommended him highly. He has a lot of tools he can bring to the program."

In 2007, Durden helped the Maryland women to a sixth-place finish, and the men to an eighth-place finish, at the Atlantic Coast Conference meet. During 2005-06, the Maryland women's team took fifth at the ACC championships, and senior Sasha Malanina was an ACC champion in the 400 individual medley.

Durden is a NCAA Division I Certified Coach, a member of U.S. Swimming and a member of the American Swimming Coaches Association. For five years, he was involved with the swim camps at Auburn, serving as the camp director in 2004 and 2005. Before coaching at Auburn, Durden served as an assistant for the highly regarded Irvine Novaquatics club under current USC coach Dave Salo.

A 1998 graduate of UC Irvine, Durden earned a degree in electrical engineering. He competed on the Anteaters' swim team from 1994-97 and was the 1997 Big West Conference champion in the 200 butterfly. He and his wife, Cathy, reside in Pleasant Hill, Calif.

HEAD COACH EMERITUS NORT THORNTON



NORT THORNTON **Head Coach Emeritus** **35th Season at California**

California head coach emeritus **Nort Thornton** is one of the deans of college coaching in the United States and was the longest tenured coach at Cal before retiring after 33 years at the helm of the Golden Bears men's swimming program in July 2007.

For Cal, Thornton had a dual-meet record of 231-85 (.731 winning percentage), produced two NCAA team titles and numerous individual champions, including Patrick O'Neil, who won the 200-yard butterfly crown at the 2007 NCAA Championships. Thornton's final team took eighth place at the 2008 NCAA Championships in Minneapolis, Minn.

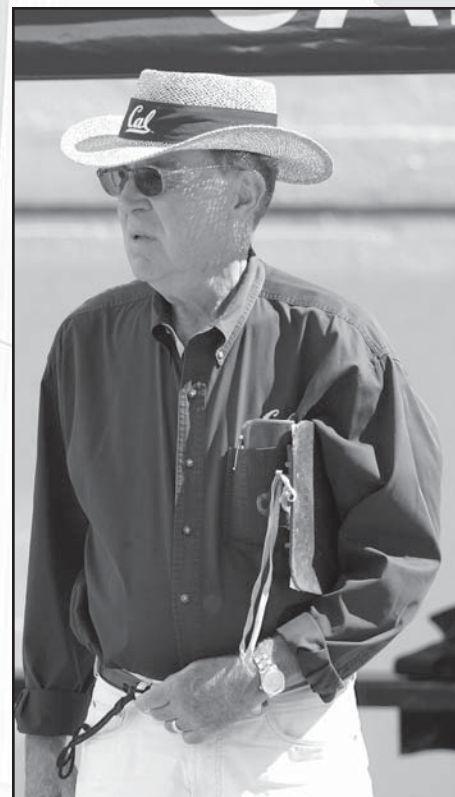
Through the years, his Cal squads won 48 individual and relay NCAA championships and 108 Pac-10 individual, relay and diving titles. His 1979-80 and 1980-81 teams also captured Pac-10 team championships.

In 2006-07, Thornton's Bears compiled a 5-3 dual-meet record (2-2 Pac-10) and claimed second place at the Pac-10 Championships. Cal also won three individual conference titles, with O'Neil claiming the 200 fly, junior Dominik Meichtry capturing the 200 freestyle and sophomore David Russell taking the 100 backstroke.

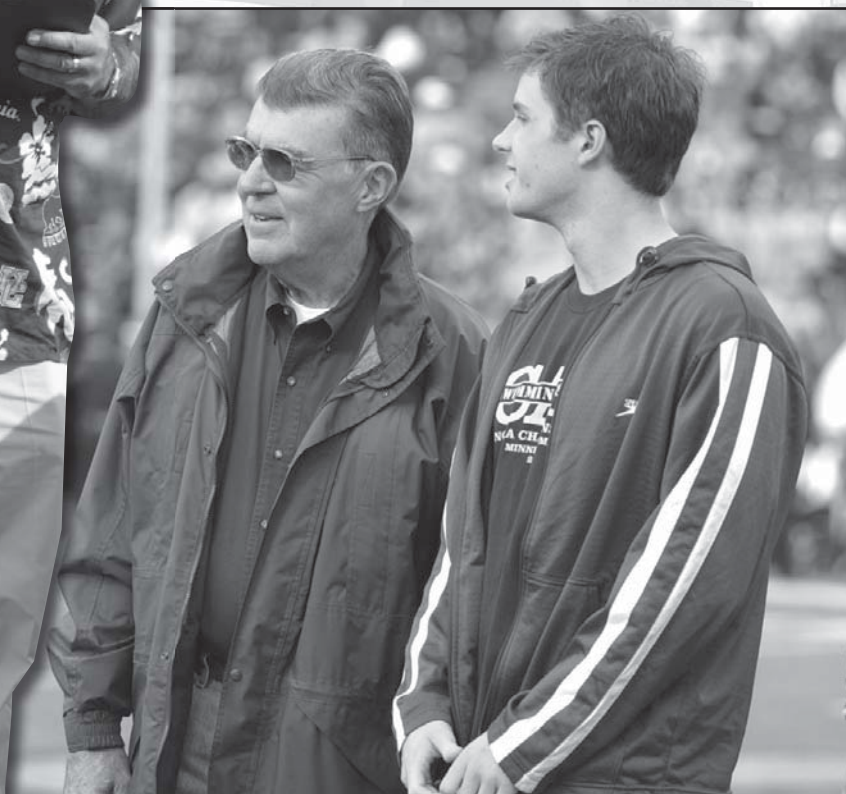
It is a credit to Thornton's recruiting and coaching ability that the Bears have consistently been in a position to compete for the national crown. For more than three decades he cultivated squads that combine some of the top local California talent with national and international blue chippers. Thornton's office is a testimony to his coaching ability with Olympic banners, photos of world record holders, NCAA championship trophies and mementos that span through his long and illustrious career. The veteran coach was honored for all of his accomplishments in May 1995 with his induction into the International Swimming Hall of Fame.

Thornton started his Cal career during the 1974-75 season. For 28 of the 33 years he coached the Bears, Thornton's teams finished ranked in the top 10 in the national polls. The veteran coach was named National Coach of the Year twice and was the Pac-10 Coach of the Year four times, most recently in 1999.

A product of San Jose State, Thornton led the Bears to NCAA team titles in 1979 and 1980 and produced a long list

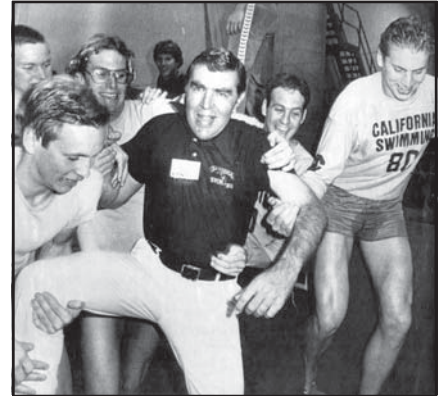

of stellar All-Americans. He has an even more impressive collection of Olympians, including world record holder Matt Biondi, Anthony Ervin, who won the gold medal in the 50-meter freestyle at the 2000 Sydney Olympics, and Duje Draganja, who took silver in the 50-meter free at the 2004 Athens Olympics. During Thornton's tenure as Cal head coach, 48 Cal athletes represented several countries in the Olympic Games, winning 29 medals, including 14 gold, 10 silver and five bronze. In addition, Milorad Cavic and current Cal sophomore Nathan Adrian, swimmers Thornton coached while still Bears head coach, earned medals in the 2008 Beijing Olympics, with Cavic earning a silver medal in the 100-meter butterfly and

Adrian taking home a gold medal as part of the United States' 400-meter freestyle relay.

On the international level, Thornton has coached numerous United States teams in world competition. In 1979, he coached the U.S. squad in the FINA Cup in Tokyo, Japan, and then in 1981 coached the U.S. team at the World University Games. In the summer of 1983, Thornton was an assistant coach for the United States team at the Pan American Games at Caracas, Venezuela. He served in the same capacity at the 1986 World Championships in Madrid, Spain, and in Perth, Australia, in January, 1997, as well as at the '97 Pan Pacific Games in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada.

A past president of the American Swimming Coaches Association, Thornton has served on the ASCA Board of Directors and is a past member of the NCAA Rules Committee. He was also awarded the National Collegiate and Scholastic Award, which is in the International Hall of Fame, for his contributions to swimming as a healthful recreation activity for schools and colleges.

Thornton, 75, graduated from San Jose State in 1956 with a degree in education and earned his master's degree from Stanford. Thornton and his wife, Carla, have three sons, Richard (50) and twins Marc and Gregg (47).

Greg Meehan, former head coach for both the men's and women's swimming programs at the University of the Pacific, joined California head coach **David Durden's** staff as assistant men's swimming coach in April 2008.

"Greg has a great reputation in the coaching community," Durden said. "He has tremendous strengths as a coach that will be immediately valued in our program. I couldn't be happier, not only with the type of coach we are getting, but with the quality of the individual. Greg exudes a level of

professionalism to our sport that to me is very, very important. He is such a positive role model for our student-athletes."

Meehan, 32, coached at Pacific from 2005-08, leading his women's team to a second-place finish in the Big West Conference in 2006-07 and two fourth-place finishes. On the men's side, Meehan led the Tigers to three fourth-place league finishes. Krzysztof Zoldak earned Big West Swimmer of the Year in 2005, while Ja-Neil Bragg advanced to the NCAA Championships in each of Meehan's three seasons. Bragg also competed in the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials.

Zoldak and Wojciech Bettej both advanced to the NCAA Championships in 2006-07. In all, Meehan's men's and women's teams at Pacific broke 13 school records and three conference records, and seven of his student-athletes qualified for the NCAAs.

At the international level, Meehan served as a manager for the United States team that competed in the 2007 World University Games held in Bangkok, Thailand.

Prior to coaching at Pacific, Meehan was the assistant women's coach under Cyndi Gallagher at UCLA from 2001-05, helping the Bruins to a 2003 Pac-10 title, a seventh-place NCAA finish in 2004 and a total of 33 All-Americans and 32 school records broken. He specialized in working with the Bruin distance and IM corps, in addition to recruiting duties.



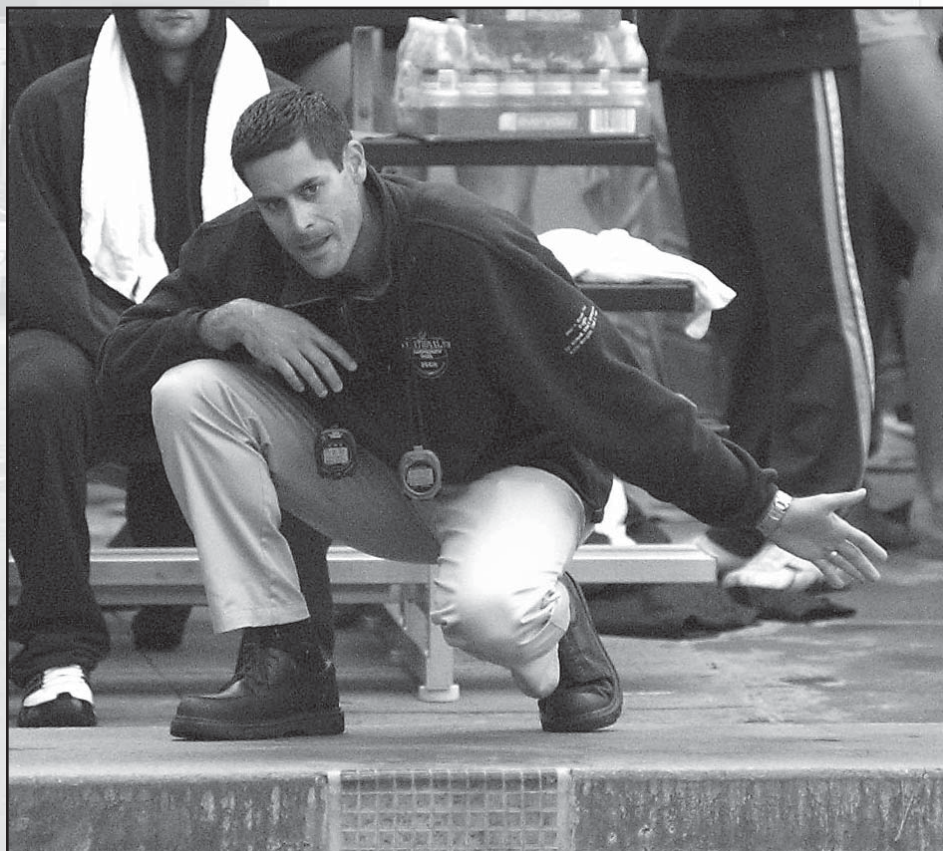
Meehan also was assistant women's swimming coach at Princeton from 1999-2001, helping the Tigers to a 17-0 dual meet record and the 2000 and 2001 Ivy League titles. Meehan was the first assistant and later interim head coach at William & Mary in 1998-99 as well.

In the summer of 2003, Meehan served as assistant coach for the USA Swimming National Distance Camp at the USOC Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo., mentoring the top young male and female distance swimmers from around the country.

A graduate of Rider University in Lawrenceville, N.J., Meehan earned a degree in mathematics and secondary education. While at Rider, he competed in the 200 backstroke, was a member of several MAAC conference champion relays and was a four-time All-Academic Award recipient.

"I am incredibly excited about joining the Cal program," said Meehan. "It is a great situation for me as Cal is one of the premier men's swimming programs in the nation. It is a great opportunity, both from a University standpoint and an athletic standpoint. I am really looking forward to working with David. I was so impressed with him during my interview. He is passionate about what he is doing and is an inspiration to be around."

Tom Davidson returns for his third year of service as Cal's diving coach, after joining the Golden Bear aquatics program in the summer of 2006. Prior to Cal he was the diving coach at Illinois State.

Under the direction of Davidson, Cal showed strong success on the boards in the 2007-08 season. Individually, Sam Helvie earned honorable mention All-America honors by placing 15th on the one-meter springboard, with a score of 322.65 in the final, and 13th on the three-meter springboard (347.00) at the NCAA Championships.

While at Illinois State Davidson guided Emily Hirt to her first ever NCAA Zone diving championship. Hirt placed in the top 40 regionally with a score of 204.05 on the three-meter board, but did not advance to the final round.

Davidson graduated from Indiana's Kelley School of Business with a bachelors degree in management and a minor in history. He is currently pursuing his masters in management from Illinois State.



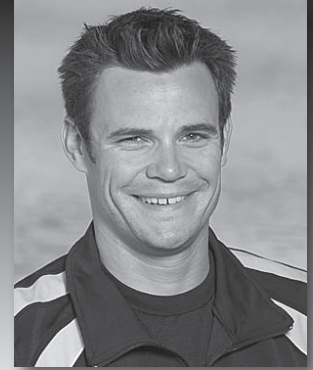

CAL IMPRESSES WITH FOURTH-PLACE FINISH IN 2007-08

California put together a strong finish to a 2007-08 season that began with a big transition. The Golden Bears, ranked 11th in the final College Swimming Coaches Association of America dual-meet poll that came out before the Pac-10 Championships, responded with a second-place finish in the conference meet followed by an even more impressive fourth-place finish in the NCAA Championships. The Bears accomplished all this under David Durden, the first-year head coach who had replaced long-time Cal head coach Nort Thornton the previous August.

With Thornton still on the pool deck as Cal's head coach emeritus, Durden led his charges to an admirable end to the season given all the changes they had to deal with right before the start of the school year. Ten Bears collected All-America honors, 10 earned honorable mention All-America honors and Cal won six Pac-10 titles.

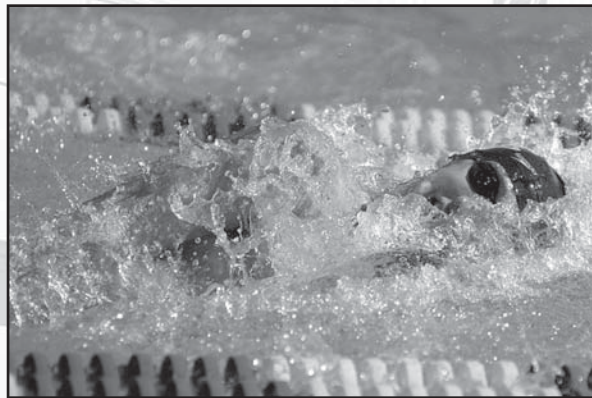
The Bears compiled a 5-2 dual-meet record, with a 3-2 record in Pac-10 dual meets. They opened their season by dominating the Pacific Invitational in Stockton, Calif., where Cal won 14 of 16 events and 1,435.5 points to win the meet. They then defeated Pacific, 133-116, in their dual-meet opener and Durden's home debut at Spieker Aquatics Complex. Next they defeated conference foe Washington, 153.5-106.5.

Cal wrapped up 2007 with performances in Stanford's Triple-Distance meet, the Hoosierland Open and the Husky Invitational. At Indiana's invitational, the Bears notched several top-five finishes, including a pair of third-place finishes (junior Ian Lentz in the 200-yard butterfly and Cal's 400-yard freestyle relay) on the meet's final day and junior diver Sam Helvie's second-place finish on the one-meter springboard. In Washington's meet, Cal's highlights included junior David Russell swimming automatic NCAA qualifying times of 46.94 in the 100 backstroke (46.94) and 200 backstroke (1:42.58).

In the New Year, Cal opened with a 182-118 dual-meet setback against Arizona in Berkeley before rebounding the next day with a 159.5-123.5 win over Arizona State. The Bears spent the rest of their season on the road, claiming victories at Cal State Bakersfield, 133-78, and at USC, 136-102, before ending the regular season with a loss at Stanford, 132.5-110.5.

At the 2008 Pac-10 Championships, Cal won four more titles than the two they won in 2007. The quartet of Russell, freshman Damir Dugonjic, senior Jernej Godec and senior Joe Whittington posted a then-school record of 1:25.09 to claim the 200-yard medley relay. Cal won two more titles on the second day of the conference meet, as senior William Copeland swam 19:47 to win the 50 freestyle and the Bears' foursome of Copeland, Godec, Whittington and freshman Graeme Moore posted an automatic NCAA qualifying time of 1:17.99 to win the 200-freestyle relay.

On the Pac-10 meet's third day, Cal's Russell, Dugonjic, Godec and Copeland won the meet's final race, the 400-medley relay, in a then-school record time of 3:06.84. Russell added the 200-back crown (1:42.01, NCAA

A) and Copeland won the 100 free (43.03, NCAA A) on the final day.

In the Pac-10 Diving Championships, Cal's top results included freshmen Thomas Henninger (307.45) and Taylor Dehn (299.20) finishing 6-7, respectively, on the one-meter springboard, Dehn (302.30) and Henninger (289.95) taking 8-9, respectively, on the three-meter board, and junior Brian Lawler (309.65) and Dehn (269.00) finishing seventh and ninth, respectively, on the platform.

Prior to the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships, the Bears competed in the NCAA Zone E Diving Regional. Helvie turned in Cal's top two performances, taking second place on the platform (708) and seventh (311.05) on the one-meter board.

Cal's first day in the NCAA Championships had several highlights, including its group of Russell, Dugonjic, Godec and Copeland swimming a school-record time of 3:05.38 to take second in the 400-medley relay, Copeland taking fifth (19.41) in the 50 free and Godec finish sixth (19.46) in the 50 free.

The Bears ended the day in third place with 112 points.

At the end of the second day of NAAs, the Bears wound up in fourth place with 222.50 points. Highlights included Russell taking second in the 100 back with a school record 45.42, the quartet of Russell, Dugonjic, Godec and Copeland swimming a school-record 1:24.50 to take third in the 200-medley relay, Dugonjic taking second in the 100 breaststroke in 52.61, freshman Martti Aljand finishing eighth (53.37) in the 100 breaststroke and senior Dominik Meichtry placing ninth (1:33.56) in the 200 free.

The final day of nationals featured sophomore Sean Mahoney capturing third place in the 200 breaststroke (1:54.65), Aljand taking sixth in the 200 breaststroke (1:56.14), senior Mark Eckert placing fourth in the 200 back (1:41.59) and the Cal 400-free relay of Godec, Meichtry, Whittington and Copeland finishing third in 2:50.87. Helvie also posted honorable mention All-America performances on the one- (15th, 322.65) and three-meter (13th, 347.00) springboards for Cal, as the Bears garnered 332.5 total points to finish fourth at NAAs.

Cal athletes starred in the classroom as well as in the pool. Senior swimmer Justin Pollard was awarded a Pac-10 Post-Graduate Scholarship, which included a \$3000 stipend for graduate study, the Neufeld Scholar Athlete Award, representative of collecting the highest cumulative grade-point average (3.926) on the team, and the Walter A Haas, Jr. Community Service Award, for commitment and service to the University and larger community.

Senior swimmer Paul Hernandez, who graduated with a 3.923 GPA, was awarded an Oscar Geballe Post Graduate Scholarship, with a \$5000 stipend for graduate study. Godec was also awarded a Pac-10 Post-Graduate Scholarship, with a \$3000 stipend for graduate study.

In addition, Cal put seven athletes, more than any other school, on the Pac-10 All-Academic first team: Godec, Pollard, Lentz, senior Eric Dunipace, senior Richard Hunter, sophomore Matt Scanlan and senior Louis Vayo. Copeland, Russell, sophomore Scott Sorge and Helvie earned spots on the Pac-10 All-Academic Honorable Mention team.

Pollard had a busy year, as he was also named the Pac-10's representative to the NCAA's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee in early February. His term began immediately and ends on Sept. 1, 2009. The NCAA SAAC acts as a student-athlete voice for feedback on structure, legislature and governance by the NCAA.

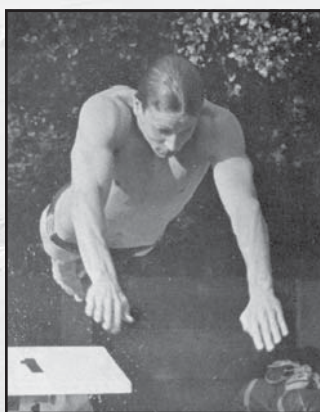

SPIEKER AQUATICS COMPLEX



The home of the University of California men's swimming and diving team is the Spieker Aquatics Complex, one of the finest outdoor facilities in the United States.

Completed in the fall of 1982, the \$1 million dollar facility was made possible through the Cal Sports '80s project and was dedicated to the former California water polo

letterman Warren "Ned" Spieker Jr., who provided the major portion of the funding for the project.

The facility replaced the old Harmon pool, which had stood on the same site since the early 1930s. Included in the extensive remodeling project was the joining of the two existing tanks into one 50-meter by 25-yard pool of deep water, suitable for national

and international swimming and water polo competition. Also included in the reconstruction was the installation of new piping and filtration systems, lighting modifications and increased spectator seating.

The Spieker Aquatics Complex is located adjacent to Haas Pavilion at the corner of Bancroft and Dana streets on the Berkeley campus.

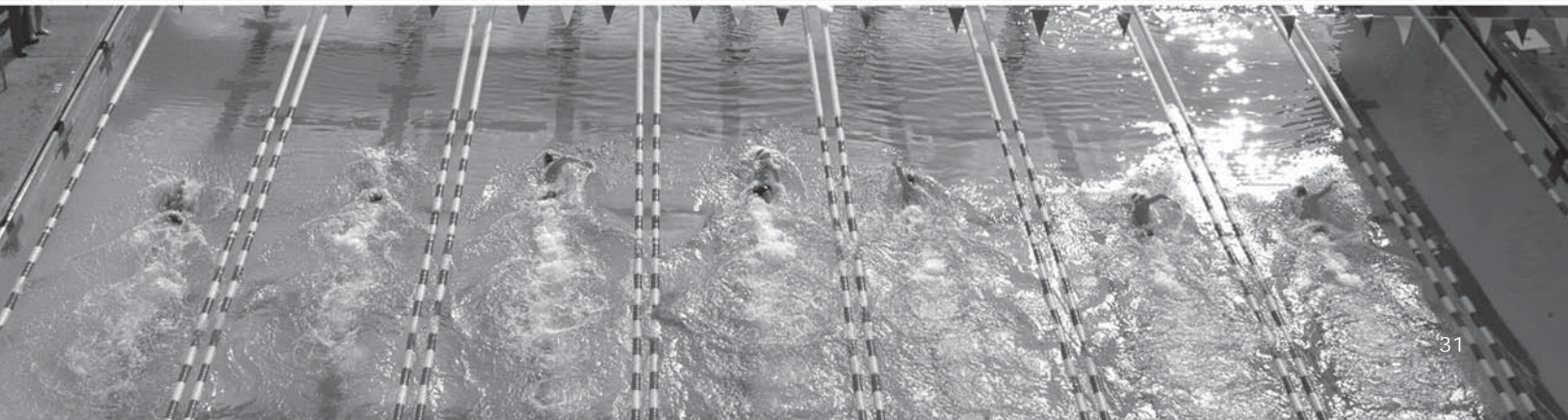

CAVIC, ADRIAN WIN MEDALS AS BEARS STAR IN BEIJING

The 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing, China, were notable for the number of Golden Bears competing there in all sports, with swimming making many of the headlines for California. Former Cal stars Milorad Cavic and Dominik Meichtry made news as the only swimmers to defeat U.S. star Michael Phelps in head-to-head races in Beijing. While Cavic did not ultimately prevail over Phelps in the 100-meter butterfly final, the Serbian from Southern California made headlines with his silver-medal performance. Current Bears sophomore Nathan Adrian and Cavic earned Cal's 31st and 32nd

men's swimming medals, respectively, in the Olympics.

Cal had a total of 14 men's swimmers, including five current Bears – Adrian (USA), Martti Aljand (Estonia), Guy Barnea (Israel), Damir Dugonjic (Slovenia) and Martin Liivamagi (Estonia) – in action in Beijing. The Cal alumni competing in China included Cavic (Serbia), Henrique Barbosa (Brazil), Duje Draganja (Croatia), Rolandas Gimbutis (Lithuania), Jernej Godec (Slovenia), Bart Kizierowski (Poland), Gordan Kozulj (Croatia), Dominik Meichtry (Switzerland) and Miguel Molina (the Philippines). In addition to the Bears who competed in the 2008 Olympics, former Bears swimmer Matt Macedo was the head coach of Trinidad and Tobago's Olympic team.

Adrian won a gold medal as part of the United States' record-setting 4x100-meter freestyle relay. He was part of a world record in the preliminary heats as the United States posted a 3:12.23 to qualify for the final. He later watched as the Phelps-led U.S. quartet won the relay gold medal in a new world-record time of 3:08.24.

Cavic won his 100 butterfly preliminary heat in a then-Olympic record 50.76, topping Phelps (50.87), and later won his semifinal in a time of 50.92, which was faster than the 50.97 Phelps swam to win an earlier semifinal. To the naked eye, Cavic looked to have won the gold medal in the final in a European-record 50.59, but video replays confirmed that, by one hundredth of a second, Cavic earned the silver medal.

Earlier in the Games, Meichtry posted a time of 1:45.80 to defeat Phelps (1:46.48) in the ninth heat of the 200-meter freestyle. Meichtry, who completed his Cal career in the 2007-08 season, later took sixth place in the final with a time of 1:46.95. He also swam for 13th-place Switzerland in the 4x100-free relay heats (3:13.80) and advanced to the semifinals of the 100-free semifinal round when Cavic withdrew from the 100-free semifinals to focus on the 100 fly.

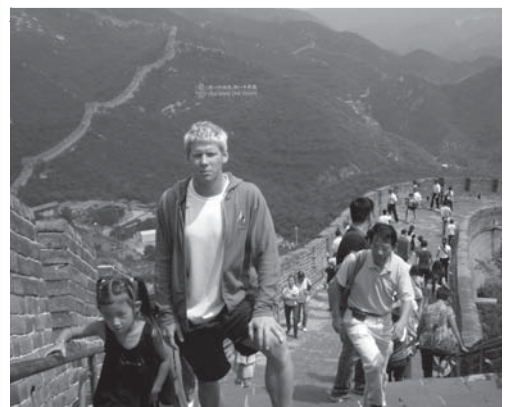
