THE HOME OF...



Spieker Aquatics Complex has played host to some of the world's best swimmers, one of the most noted being Olympic medalist Matt Biondi (above).

The home of the University of California men's swimming team is the Spieker Aquatics Complex, one of the finest outdoor facilities in the United States.

Completed in the fall of 1982, the \$1 million dollar facility was made possible through the Cal Sports '80s project and was dedicated to the former California water polo

letterman Warren "Ned" Spieker Jr., who provided the major portion of the funding for the project.

The facility replaced the old Harmon pool, which had stood on the same site since the early 1930s. Included in the extensive remodeling project was the joining of the two existing tanks into one 50-meter by 25-yard pool of deep water, suitable for national and international

swimming and water polo competition. Also included in the reconstruction was the installation of new piping and filtration systems, lighting modifications and increased spectator seating.

The Spieker Aquatics Complex is located adjacent to Haas Pavilion at the corner of Bancroft and Dana streets on the Berkeley campus.

2003-04 GOLDEN BEAR OUTLOOK

2003-04 GOLDEN BEARS SHOWCASE A BALANCED COMBINATION OF EXPERIENCE AND TALENT

Last season, the fourth-place finish at the 2003 NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships by the California men's swimming team was its highest since 1999. As Cal's head coach **Nort Thornton** heads into his 30th season at the helm of the Golden Bears' men's swimming program, he believes that the 2003-04 team is a balanced and talented squad that should again vie to be one of the Top 5 teams in the nation.

During those 30 years, Thornton has compiled an impressive career dual meet record of 206-80 (.720) and led his 1979 and 1980 teams to back-to-back NCAA Championships. His teams have finished in the Top 10 nationally in 24 of the 29 years he has directed the Bears. This past August, Thornton was inducted into the ASCA (American Swimming Coaches Association) Hall of Fame, marking the second Hall of Fame that bears his name. He is also a member of the International Swimming Hall of Fame.

This season, Thornton, along with co-head coach **Mike Bottom** and volunteer assistant coach **Ben Sheppard**, believe that this year's squad will make Thornton's 30th year memorable.

"This year's group is great in terms of being eager and willing to work hard," said Thornton. "However, it's hard to predict the type of team we'll be this early. I think we'll be a good team, with a chance to be great."

Despite the loss of graduated seniors **Anthony Ervin**, **Joe Bruckart** and **Quentin Byma**, the Golden Bears do return seven All-Americans from last season. Those returning All-Americans include seniors **Alex Lim** and **Jeff Natalizio**, juniors **Duje Draganja** and **John Dorr** and sophomores **Milorad Cavic**, **Matt Lyon** and **Miguel Molina**.

Filling the holes left by Olympic gold medalist sprinter Ervin won't be easy, but junior **Duje Draganja** and sophomore **Milorad Cavic** should continue Cal's dominance in the sprint freestyle and butterfly events. Draganja won the 100 free title (42.02) at the 2003 NCAA Championships, edging out runner-up Ervin—a three-time winner in that event. Draganja placed second to Ervin in both the 50 and 100 free at the Pac-10 Championships. Cavic, who last season set a new Cal school record in the 100 fly (46.10), finished fourth in that event at the NCAA Championships. From his debut, Cavic proved to be one of the finest sprinters in the country, as he turned in a runner-up finish in the 50 free (19.37) at the NCAA meet. Both Draganja (lead-off leg) and Cavic (second leg) were part of Cal's 400 free relay (2:48.99) team that set the new NCAA, U.S. Open and Cal school record in that event. They also helped Cal's 200 free relay team to a third-place national finish (1:17.39).

Lim, a co-captain this season, earned All-America honors by virtue of his third- and sixth-place finishes in the 100 (46.59) and 200 backstroke (1:42.70), respectively. His time in the 200 back set a new Cal school record. Lim also scored points for the Bears with a sixth-place showing in the 100 fly (47.45). Natalizio earned All-America accolades after finishing 14th in the 200 IM (1:47.26) and 16th in the 200 back (1:46.66) at NCAAs. He also competed in the 100 back at the meet.

Dorr, Lyon and Molina round out the NCAA scorers from last season. Dorr anchored the Bears' sixth-place 800 free relay (6:26.30), while Lyon was part of Cal's 200 free relay that placed third (1:17.39). Molina qualified for the NCAAs in the 500 free and 400 IM and was also part of Cal's 800 free relay at the national championships.

A total of 10 newcomers dot this season's roster, including nine freshmen and one senior transfer. Despite its seemingly youthful look, Cal's squad is also comprised of a strong upper class, with a total of nine juniors and

seniors. The Bears are sure to miss the leadership and experience of graduated seniors Ervin, Bruckart and Byma. However, Thornton strongly believes that the balance of this year's team will help ease the transition of swimming without them.

"I think we'll be a more balanced team this year," said Thornton. "However, it will still be hard to replace lost points from our seniors who are gone."

With four of the 10 newcomers hailing from a different country, this year's Cal team has an international flair. There are a total of nine Golden Bears with ties to countries outside of the United States. Draganja is from Croatia, while Cavic is of Yugoslavian heritage. Freshmen **Rolandas Gimbutis** (Lithuania) and **Jonas Tilly** (Sweden) round out Cal's European contingent. Sophomore **Ricky Barbosa** and senior transfer **Renato Guerardi** are from Brazil, while senior **Alex Lim** and sophomore **Miguel Molina** represent Malaysia and the Philippines, respectively. Freshman **Daniel Lysaught** is from Australia.

Head diving coach **Phil Tonne** has added one newcomer to his squad in **Louis Gagnet**. Gagnet, a junior transfer from Florida State, won four ACC titles in the one- and three-meter boards. He qualified for the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships the past two seasons and earned All-America recognition after finishing ninth in the three-meter (531.8) at last season's NCAA meet. Senior **Robbie Quinn** and junior **Nathaniel Dean** return for the Bears to complete this season's diving squad.

The following is an event-by-event breakdown of the 2003-04 Cal men's swimming and diving team.

FREESTYLE

Losing an Olympic gold medalist in the 50-meter free (**Anthony Ervin**) would be a huge blow to most teams, but Cal still boasts three of the nation's top four sprinters from last year. Winning his first NCAA individual title in the 100 free (42.02) last season, junior **Duje Draganja** is capable of defending that title this year. Sophomore **Milorad Cavic** is the perfect person to complete Cal's 1-2 punch in the sprint freestyle. Last season, Cavic held Cal's second-fastest time in the 50 free (19.37) behind Ervin, good for third-fastest in the country. He also ranked 13th nationally in the 100 free (43.28). Sophomore returnees **Matt Lyon** and **Evan Lane** round out Cal's strong returning sprint freestyle group. Lane underwent surgery during the summer, but is expected to return before the end of the season.

Three key newcomers will also add to the Bears' sprint corps. Senior transfer **Renato Gueraldi** from the University of Tennessee, was one of the nation's top 50 freestylers last year. His fastest time of 19.41, was fourth best in the country, after Ervin (19.25, 2nd) and Cavic (19.37, 3rd). As a Volunteer, he won two NCAA relay titles and was a finalist in the 50 free as both a sophomore and junior. Incoming freshman **Rolandas Gimbutis**, from Lithuania, brings much international experience to Cal. A member of the Lithuanian national team, Gimbutis recently competed at the 2003 FINA World Championships and also competed at the 2000 Sydney Olympics. Freshman **Jonas Tilly**, from Sweden, will also add depth to an already strong sprint group. Tilly competed for Sweden's national team at both the 2001 and 2003 FINA World Championships.

While the Bears might be known for their solid sprinters, this year's group of middle and long distance freestylers is talented. Junior returnees **John Dorr**, **Steve Rehrmann** and **Matt Schmelzer** and sophomores **Ryan Lean** and **Miguel Molina**, along with newcomers Gimbutis, **Blake Dickson**, **Eric Dunipace**, **Alexander Holdridge** and **Daniel Lysaught** make up the middle and long distance group. Last season, Dorr swam Cal's fastest time in the 500 free (4:22.89) and second-fastest time in the 1650 free (15:37.85). He, along with Molina, qualified for the NCAA Championships in the 500 free. Molina posted Cal's second-fastest times in the 200 (1:37.20), 500 (4:25.14) and 1000 free (9:27.31). Lean was Cal's top 1650 freestyler, posting the Bears' fastest time of the season at 15:24.15. Dickson comes to Cal via The Bolles School in Florida, where he recorded runner-up finishes in the 200 and 500 free events at the Florida state finals as a senior, and was a finalist at the state meet each of his four years. Dunipace, who

can also contribute in the backstroke, earned All-America honors as a member of his club team's 200 and 400 free relays. Holdridge will add depth to the middle distance group, while Lysaught—one of Australia's top young distance swimmers—will help handle the long distance duties.

BREASTSTROKE

Cal's top breaststrokers from last year return in junior **Caleb Rowe** and sophomore **Ricky Barbosa**. Both were 2003 NCAA qualifiers in the 100 and 200 breast. Last season, Rowe posted the Bears' fastest time in the 200 breast (1:58.06), while Barbosa owned Cal's best time in the 100 breast (54.50). Junior **Brooks Jenkins** is another returnee for Cal in the breaststroke. Last year, he scored points for the Bears at the Pac-10 Championships after placing eighth in the 200 breast (2:02.65). Senior **Jeff Natalizio**, junior **John Dorr** and sophomore **Miguel Molina** are also capable of swimming the breaststroke. Newcomers to this event include freshmen **Paul Hernandez** and **Graham Lentz**. During their high school years, Lentz earned All-America honors four times in the breaststroke events, while Hernandez set his high school's record in the 100 breast.

BACKSTROKE

Senior **Alex Lim** will anchor a talented backstroke group. During his three years as a Golden Bear, Lim has garnered 10 All-America honors. Last season, he set Cal's 200 back (1:42.70) record. He also owns Cal's fastest time ever in the 100 back (46.05). In 2003, Lim turned in a third-place finish in the 100 back and a sixth-place finish in the 200 back at the NAAs. Fellow senior **Jeff Natalizio** also performed well in the backstroke last season. Natalizio finished 16th in the 200 back (1:46.66) at NAAs to earn All-America accolades. He also competed in the 100 back at the championship meet. Sophomores **Milorad Cavic** and **Chris Gibson** will also contribute in the backstroke events. Cavic is primarily a sprint backstroker who posted Cal's third-fastest time in the 100 back (48.05) last season, while Gibson swam the Bears' third-fastest time in the 200 back (1:47.72). Senior **Keith Vogelgesang** and junior **Steve Rehrmann** will also add depth to the Bears' backstroke unit.

BUTTERFLY

As strong as Cal is in the freestyle, the Bears might be equally as solid in the butterfly stroke. Senior **Alex Lim**, junior **Duje Draganja** and sophomore **Milorad Cavic** are Cal's top returning butterflyers. In his debut season, Cavic etched his name into the school record book, setting the Bears' best mark in the 100 fly (46.10). That time was good for third fastest in the nation. At the Pac-10 Championships, he won the 100 fly in 46.32, setting a new conference championship record. At the NCAA Championships, he finished fourth in the 100 fly (46.41) and swam the fly legs on Cal's 200 (1:26.10) and 400 medley relays (3:08.68) that finished in fifth and fourth places, respectively. Draganja is also a prolific butterflyer. At the NAAs, he took third place in the 100 fly with a time of 46.40—good for the fourth fastest mark in the nation. At the Pac-10 Championships, he was runner-up (46.44) to Cavic's victory in the 100 fly. Lim swam the Bears' fastest time of the season in the 200 fly (1:45.96), and held the third-fastest time on the team in the 100 fly (46.76). A qualifier in the 100 fly at the NCAA meet, Lim turned in a sixth-place finish (47.45) in the consolation final. Senior **Keith Vogelgesang**, junior **Steve Rehrmann** and freshman **Pat O'Neil** should also make an impact in the butterfly events. O'Neil set the Oregon state high school 100 fly record (49.41) and won that event at the state meet in both 2002 and 2003.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

Due to Cal's individual medley-based training, there is a rather large contingent of Bears that can swim the IM. Seniors **Alex Lim**, **Jeff Natalizio** and **Keith Vogelgesang**, juniors **John Dorr**, **Brooks Jenkins**, **Steve Rehrmann** and **Caleb Rowe**, sophomores **Ricky Barbosa** and **Miguel Molina** and freshmen **Alexander Holdridge**, **Graham Lentz** and **Patrick O'Neil** make up Cal's IM group.

"We have a large group of IMers, but that is not unusual as our training is IM based," said Thornton. "This helps with cross-training for their best strokes and it helps them improve on their weaker strokes."

Natalizio and Molina are Cal's returning 200 (1:47.18) and 400 IM (3:49.77) leaders, respectively. At the NCAA Championships, Natalizio finished 14th in the 200 IM, while Molina competed in the 400 IM. At the Pac-10 Championships, Natalizio finished fourth in the 200 IM (1:47.18) and Molina touched the wall in second place of the 400 IM (3:49.77) consolation final. Dorr posted Cal's third-fastest time of the season last year in the 400 IM (3:49.78), placing 15th in that event at NAAs. Lim swam the third-fastest time of last year in the 200 IM (1:48.89), and Rowe was a 200 IM NCAA qualifier.

RELAYS

Last season, Cal's relays were among the strongest in the country. For the second consecutive season, the Bears' 400 free relay won the NCAA title in that event, breaking the NCAA, U.S. Open and the Cal school record (2:48.99). Cal loses two of the swimmers from that relay in **Joe Bruckart** and **Anthony Ervin**, but they return junior **Duje Draganja** and sophomore **Milorad Cavic**. The Bears return three of the four swimmers from their 200 free relay (Cavic, Draganja and sophomore **Matt Lyon**) that placed third at the NCAA Championships. Despite the loss of Bruckart and Ervin, Thornton believes that the sprint free relays should still contend for national titles this season.

"Our free relays will be pretty good again," said Thornton. "They are well covered and we have a number of swimmers that we can plug into the other two spots on the 200 and 400 relays. We have the bodies, we just need two to swim fast enough."

Sophomore returnees Lyon and **Evan Lane**, along with several of the newcomers including senior transfer **Renato Gueraldi** and freshmen **Rolandas Gimbutis** and **Jonas Tilly**, might serve as those swimmers.

Junior **John Dorr** and sophomore **Miguel Molina** are the returnees from last season's 800 free relay team that finished sixth (6:26.30) at the NCAA meet. Senior **Keith Vogelgesang** and junior **Steve Rehrmann** are two current swimmers that could fill the holes left by former Bears Bruckart and **Jens Thiele**. There are also several newcomers in freshmen **Blake Dickson**, **Alexander Holdridge**, **Daniel Lysaught** and even sprinter Gimbutis that can be considered for spots in the 800 free relay.

Senior **Alex Lim** (backstroke) and Cavic (butterfly) are the top returnees from Cal's medley relay teams that placed in fourth (400 medley relay) and fifth places (200 medley relay) at the 2003 NCAA Championships. At the championships, the 200 medley relay of Lim, former Bear **Quentin Byrna**, Cavic and Ervin set a new Cal record mark (3:08.68). Lim will once again handle the backstroke duties, while Cavic continues as the butterflyer for the medley relays. Several other swimmers will provide flexibility in determining who can fill the breaststroke and freestyle roles. Both junior **Caleb Rowe** and sophomore **Ricky Barbosa** are the top candidates for the breaststroke duties, while Draganja will likely fit into the relays as the freestyler. However, the butterfly and freestyle spots might be interchangeable as Cavic and Draganja are capable of handling both.

DIVING

Head diving coach **Phil Tonne**'s 2003-04 squad is small but strong. This season, Cal's diving corps is poised to have its first NCAA qualifier since 1987, in junior transfer **Louie Gagnet**. Gagnet, who spent his first two seasons competing for Florida State, is a two-time NCAA qualifier and was named the ACC's Most Valuable Diver two seasons in a row after winning four ACC titles in the one- and three-meter springboards. With a ninth-place finish in the three-meter board (531.8) at last year's NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships, he became the first Seminole diver to earn All-America recognition since 1992. Returning for the Bears from last season's diving team is senior **Robbie Quinn** and junior **Nathaniel Dean**. Quinn has continued to improve each year at Cal. Last year, he did especially well on the one-meter boards, placing seventh (573.35) at the NCAA Zone E Championships and fifth (280.25) at the Pac-10 Championships. Dean was Cal's star on the platform last year, placing eighth (373.90) at the NCAA Zone E meet and seventh (402.80) at the Pac-10 Championships.

HEAD COACH NORT THORNTON

*Head Coach
30th Season at California*



Nort Thornton, who was inducted into the ASCA (American Swimming Coaches Association) Hall of Fame last September, enters his 30th season as the director of the California men's swimming team.

Thornton, the dean of all Pac-10 swimming coaches, continues to combine great determination and dedication in helping his swimming team reach its potential and maximum success level. Last season, he led the 2003 Golden Bears squad to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. At the NCAA meet, Duje Draganja just edged teammate Anthony Ervin to win the 100 freestyle title. Cal sprinters have now won an unprecedented five consecutive NCAA 100 free titles. The Bears' 400 free relay team also won a championship title with the fastest time in NCAA, U.S. Open and Cal history.

A true indication of Thornton's success is the fact that Cal has finished in the Top 10 nationally 24 of the 29 years he has been at the helm of the Golden Bears' program. In 2002, he and co-head coach Mike Bottom, directed Cal to a sixth-place NCAA finish and saw Ervin three-peat as the national champion in the 100 free, breaking his own NCAA, American and U.S. Open records. Thornton also guided the Bears to a second-place finish at the Pac-10 Championships and was coach of the Pac-10 Swimmer of the Year (Ervin) and Newcomer of the Year (Draganja).

In his 29 years at Cal, Thornton has led the Bears to two national championships, 24 NCAA Top-10 finishes and a stellar cast of All-Americans. He has an even more

impressive collection of Olympians-including world record holder Matt Biondi, and now Olympic hero Ervin, who won the gold medal in the 50-meter free at the 2000 Sydney Olympics. The veteran coach has an impressive 206-80 (.720) career dual meet record, has been National Coach of the Year twice and has been the Pac-10 Coach of the Year four times, most recently in 1999.

It is a credit to Thornton's recruiting and coaching ability that the Bears are consistently in a position to compete for the national crown. For nearly three decades he has cultivated squads that combine some of the top local California talent with national and international blue chippers. Thornton's office is a testimony to his coaching ability with Olympic banners, photos of world record holders, NCAA championship trophies and mementos that span through his long and illustrious career. The veteran coach was honored for all of his accomplishments in May 1995 with his induction into the International Swimming Hall of Fame.

Championship performance at Cal is synonymous not only with Thornton's teams, but with the numerous individuals he has coached over the last 28 years. Since Thornton took over the Cal program, 40 Cal athletes have represented several countries in the Olympic Games, winning 28 medals, including 14 gold, nine silver and five bronze.

During the 1992 Olympics, Thornton was selected as an assistant coach, and 13 of his Bears competed in Barcelona, Spain, six of whom swam for the United States. Cal swimmers earned a total of six medals for their respective countries, including three by Biondi and one each from Joel Thomas, Tommy Werner and Scott Jaffe. At the 1996 Atlanta Olympics, nine of Thornton's swimmers competed, including Mark Henderson (1988-91), who was a member of the United States' gold medal winning and world record-setting 400 medley relay. At the 2000 Olympics, besides Ervin's exploits, four other Bears competed with Bart Kizierowski reaching the finals of the 100-meter back and 50-meter free, and Gordan Kozulj making the finals of the 200-meter back.

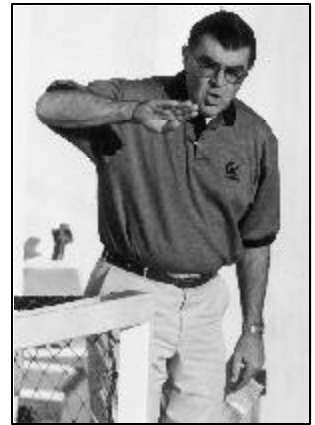
Thornton has been a part of Cal's swimming excellence since the 1973-74 season when he took over the Bear program. Five years after his arrival, Thornton guided Cal to its first national championship in 1979 and successfully defended the national crown in 1980. He claimed National Coach of the Year honors in both of those seasons.

Thornton's coaching record shows a long history of success at every level of competition. When he was the head coach at Los Altos High School in the late '50s, his team won the national prep championship and his swimmers broke 13 of the 20 standing national records. Before his hiring at California, Thornton was the head swimming coach at Foothill Junior College from 1960-73, where he constructed one of top junior college programs in the nation.

On the international level, Thornton has coached numerous United States teams in world competition. In 1979, he coached the U.S. squad in the FINA Cup in Tokyo, Japan, and then in 1981 coached the U.S. team at the World University Games. In the summer of 1983, Thornton was an assistant coach for the United States team at the Pan American Games at Caracas, Venezuela. He served in the same capacity at the 1986 World Championships in Madrid, Spain, and in Perth, Australia, in January, 1997, as well as the August '97 Pan Pacific Games in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada.

A past president of the American Swimming Coaches Association, Thornton has served on the ASCA Board of Directors and is a past member of the NCAA Rules Committee. He was also awarded the National Collegiate and Scholastic Award (which is in the International Hall of Fame) for his contributions to swimming as a healthful recreation activity for schools and colleges.

Thornton, 70, graduated from San Jose State in 1956 with a degree in education and earned his master's degree from Stanford. Thornton and his wife Carla have three sons, Richard (45) and twins Marc and Gregg (42).



ASSISTANT COACHES

MIKE BOTTOM



Co-Head Swim Coach
7th Season at California

California co-head swim coach Mike Bottom has established himself as one of the world's top sprint coaches. Last season, he and head coach Nort Thornton, directed Cal to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. At the NCAA meet, Duje Draganja out touched teammate Anthony Ervin for a 1-2 finish in the 100 freestyle.

Cal's sprinters, coached by Bottom, have now won the 100 free at the NAAs an unprecedented five years in a row. The Golden Bears' 400 free relay team also claimed a championship title with the fastest time in NCAA history (3:48.99).

At the 2003 FINA World Championships in Barcelona, Spain, Bottom coached athletes from seven countries. Former Bear Gordan Kozulj finished second in the 200 back, while current swimmers Milorad Cavic and Alex Lim finished eighth in the 100 free and 100 back, respectively.

During the summer of 2002, Bottom traveled to Europe with 14 athletes to establish a training base in Split, Croatia. He also served as the official coach of both the Croatian and Polish teams at the European Championships, where he coached two former Bears to gold medals (Gordan Kozulj '00 - won the 200 back; Bart Kizierowski '01 - won the 50 free). He also coached current Bear, Draganja, to a bronze medal in the 100 free, in which he set a national Croatian record.

During the summer of 2001, Bottom was selected to be an assistant coach for the United States at the World Championships in Fukuoka, Japan. At the World Championships, several of the sprinters Bottom has coached excelled. Cal's Ervin won both the 50 and 100-meter freestyle; South Africa's Roland Schoeman was third in the 50 free (first medal ever for South Africa at a world championship) and fourth in the 50 fly. Therese Alshammar from Sweden won the silver medal in the women's 50 free and 50 fly.

Bottom was the assistant coach for the World Team that finished second at the 2001 Goodwill Games in Brisbane, Australia. Poland's Bart Kizierowski, a former Cal standout, won both the 50 free and 50 back, breaking a Goodwill Games' record and two Polish national records in the process. Kizierowski also

won the 50 freestyle and was second in the 100 freestyle at the University Games in Beijing, China. In the 50 free at the 2001 summer US Nationals, Gary Hall, Jr. won the gold medal and three of Bottom's other swimmers finished in the top nine. Cal's Lim won both the 100 and 200 back at the South East Asian Games held in Malaysia. Bottom was also the head coach for team Stars and Stripes at the first-ever Norvo Nordisc Sprint Challenge. His team, made up of American swimmers, won the competition against strong European and World teams.

For the first time in Olympic history in 2000, two men tied for the gold medal, and both were coached by Bottom. Gold medallists Anthony Ervin and Gary Hall, Jr., swimming for the United States, were joined by Bart Kizierowski, swimming for Poland, in the finals of the Sydney Olympics.

During the 1999-2000 NCAA season, Bottom coached Ervin to wins in both the 50 and 100-meter freestyle at the NCAA Championships. In 2000-2001, Ervin repeated as the NCAA champion in the 100 free, tying the legendary Matt Biondi with a time of 41.80. In all, Bottom's sprinters won five Olympic medals in Sydney and he has coached four different NCAA champions and 10 different Pac-10 champions at Cal.

While at Auburn from 1991-94, Bottom created the ultra sprint program, taking two then unheard-of athletes, Bill Pilczuk and Dean Hutchinson, to the NCAA finals. He assisted in the rise of the Auburn men's team that won the 1997 and 1999 NCAA titles. In 1995, Bottom moved to USC to become the Trojans' sprint coach, and in 1997, the USC women's team won their first ever NCAA title. He joined Cal head coach Nort Thornton in July of 1997.

From 1995-98, Bottom summered in Phoenix, AZ where he coached outstanding sprinters such as Hall, Jr., a four-time medallist at the Atlanta Olympic Games, and Jon Olsen, a four-time Olympic gold medallist. In the summer of 1999, Bottom worked with Hall at Cal. This team effort resulted in a U.S. National Championship and Hall's then best time in the 50-meter freestyle, 22.13. In addition, former Bear Matt Macedo, trained under Bottom that summer and lowered his 50-meter free by over 1.5 seconds to 22.67 to place third. Macedo's third and sixth place finishes at his first ever Phillips 66 National Swimming Championship earned him the Rookie of the Meet Award.

Bottom graduated Summa Cum Laude from USC with a bachelor's degree in psychology and received the Scholar-Athlete Award for the graduating athlete with the highest GPA. He received a master's degree in counseling at Auburn. In his swimming days, Bottom was an Olympic team member and was on a world record 400 free relay. While at USC he was a member of three NCAA Championship teams.

PHIL TONNE



Diving Coach
20th Season at California

Tutoring both Cal's men and women divers for the 20th consecutive year is Phil Tonne, a former All-American diver at San Diego State.

In 1987, Nick Chaves became the first Cal diver to qualify for the NCAA meet. Four seasons later, Melissa Graviss became the first Cal woman diver to qualify for the NCAA meet (1991), earning All-American honors on the three-meter board. Graviss qualified for the NAAs in both the one-meter and three-meter competition in 1992.

Prior to coming to Cal in 1984, Tonne served in the same capacity at San Diego State from 1979 to 1984. Other coaching stints included a four-year stay at Palomar Junior College and Diablo Valley College in Concord. He is currently coaching a U.S. Diving Club Team (Diablo Divers) in Walnut Creek, CA, as well as his duties at Cal.

Before enrolling at San Diego State, Tonne attended Chabot Junior College where he was a two-time All-American diver. While at Chabot, he was awarded the William A. Tunney Award for outstanding leadership in athletics. Tonne prepped at Granada High School in Livermore, CA where he was a four-year letterman in soccer and diving.

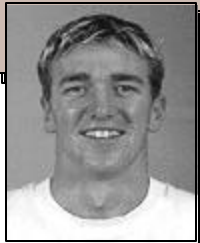
Tonne, 48, has produced nine All-Americans and one state champion during his coaching career. He and his wife, Teresa, live in Antioch with their son, Matthew, 11.

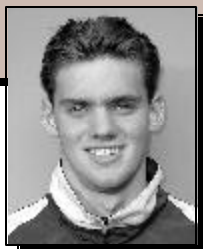

CAL OLYMPIC TRADITION

The University of California has a long and proud Olympic tradition, and nowhere is that tradition more evident than in the sport of swimming. Since head coach Nort Thornton arrived in Berkeley in 1975, 40 Cal swimmers have represented their countries in the Olympic Games. Bear swimmers have captured a total of 28 medals, including 14 golds, nine silvers and five bronze medals.

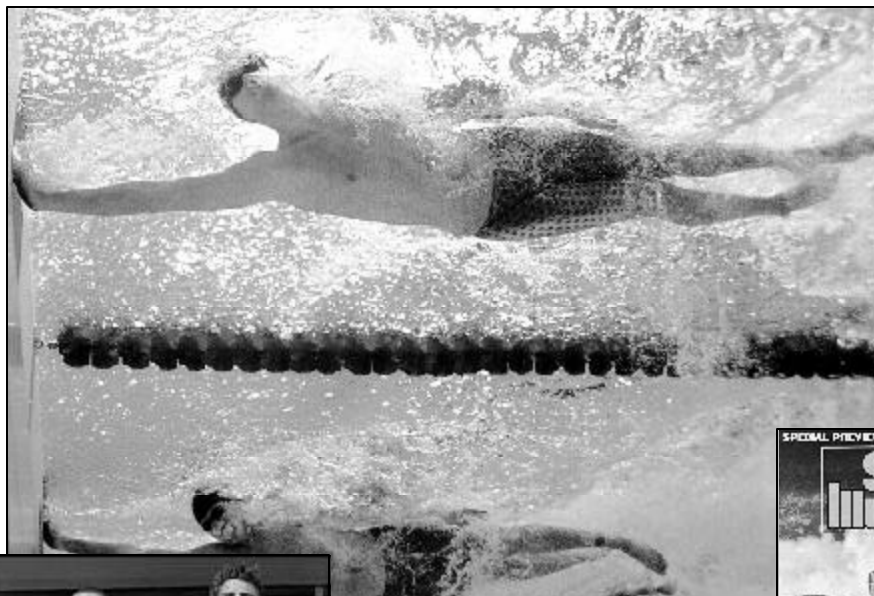
Behind the guidance of Cal's Associate Head Coach Mike Bottom, the Bears Anthony Ervin was one of the United States' stars at the 2000 Sydney Olympics. Ervin came away with gold medals in the 50-meter free and the 400-meter medley relay, and earned a silver medal in the 400-meter free relay. Also at the Sydney Olympics, four other Cal swimmers competed, with Bart Kizierowski reaching the finals of the 100-meter back and 50-meter free, Gordan Kozulj making the finals of the 200-meter back and Ratapong Sirisanont competing in the 200-meter breast.

Just two years after Thornton was named the head coach at Cal, five of his swimmers competed in the 1976 Olympic Games which were held in Montreal. Peter Rocca, a member of the California Hall of Fame since 1988, swam in the 100 and 200-meter back and won two silver medals. Graham Smith, representing the host country Canada, was a member of a 400-meter medley relay team that won the silver medal. Representing Sweden were Cal swimmers Par Arvidsson and Leif Ericsson, while Jim Carter represented England.

In 1980, Thornton's son, Richard, made the Olympic team that did not go to Moscow because of the United States boycott. However, eight swimmers from foreign countries upheld Cal's Olympic tradition. Swedish swimmers shined the brightest as Bengt Baron won the gold in the 100-meter back and Arvidsson won the gold in the 100-meter fly. Pelle Holmertz took the silver in the 100-meter free. Other Bear swimmers in the 1980 Moscow Games were Michael Soderlund, P.A. Magnusson and Thomas Lejdstrom from Sweden, Carter from England and Diego Quiroga from Ecuador.

In the 1984 Los Angeles Games, Cal was represented by eight swimmers, four of whom captured medals. Matt Biondi, who had just completed his freshman year at Cal, was a member of the gold medal winning 400-meter free relay team, while Cal teammate John Mykkanen captured silver in the 400-meter free. Baron and Thomas Lejdstrom were part of Sweden's 400-meter free relay team that took the bronze. Other Cal swimmers in Los Angeles included Dave Wilson (United States), a silver medalist in the 100-meter back, Soderlund (Sweden), Tommy Werner (Sweden) and Paul Kingsman (New Zealand).

The 1988 Olympics in Seoul, South Korea proved to be successful for the Bears as well. Eight swimmers from Cal represented their homelands. None, however, were more successful than Biondi. Biondi entered the

Matt Biondi on the cover of the 1988 Sports Illustrated Olympic Preview issue.

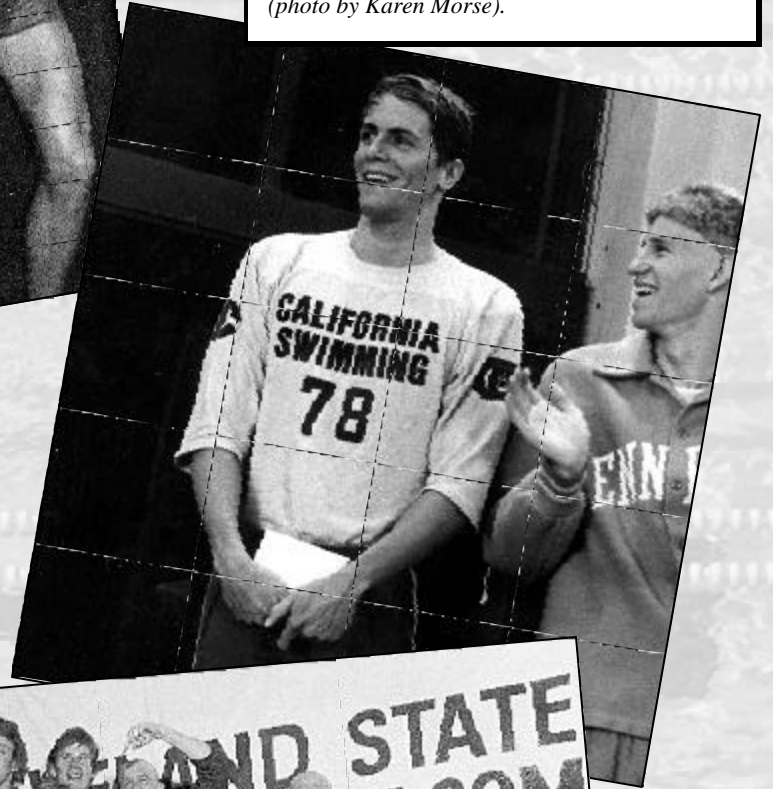
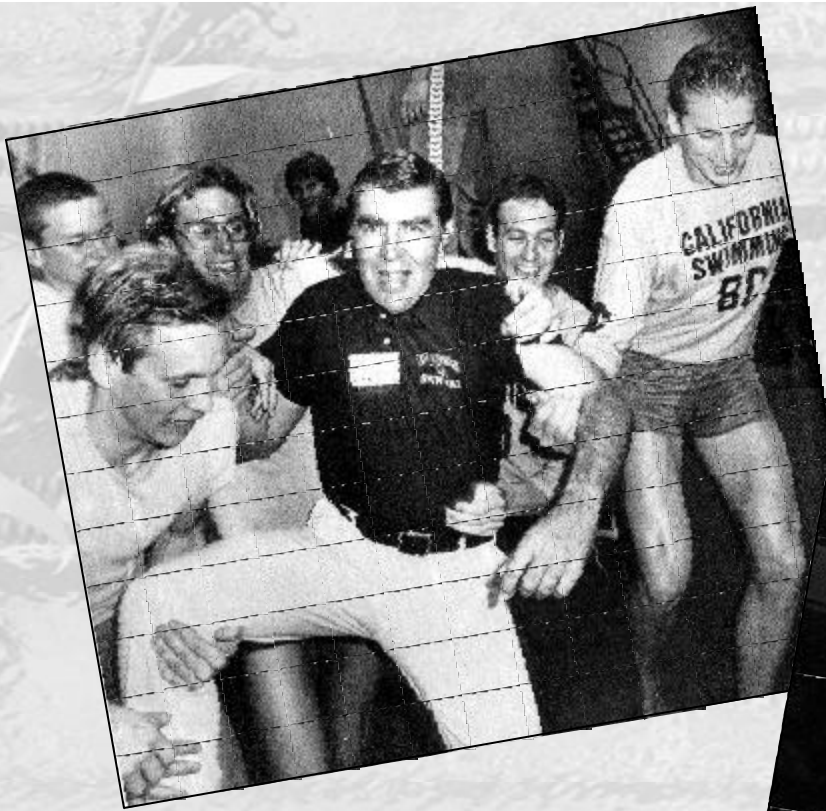
Olympics seeking to match Mark Spitz's 1972 seven gold medal performance. He did not achieve this goal, but his efforts will be forever remembered. Biondi captured gold in five events—the 50 and 100-meter free, the 400 and 800-meter free relays and the 400-meter medley relay. He also received a silver medal in the 100-meter butterfly and a bronze in the 200-meter free. Another Cal swimmer who won a medal in Seoul was Kingsman, taking a bronze in the 200-meter back. Other Cal swimmers in Seoul included Guy and Lee Concepcion (Philippines), Niko Lahanas (Greece), Steffan Persson, Soderlund and Werner (Sweden).

At the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, Spain, the Bears produced the largest number of Olympic swimmers in the nation (13) coming from one school. In addition, six of the 13 athletes swam for the United States, the largest number in the school's history. In all, Cal swimmers captured a total of six medals. Biondi led the pack, earning three medals—a silver in the 50-meter free and two golds for the 400-meter free relay and the 400-meter medley relay. Biondi, with eight gold, two silver, one bronze medal, tied swimmer Mark Spitz and shooter Carl Osborn for the American record of total Olympic medals won. Other Bear swimmers to bring home awards were U.S. team members Joel Thomas, who earned a gold as a member of the 400-meter free relay team, and Scott Jaffe, who earned a bronze as a member of the 800-meter free relay team. Swimming for Sweden, Werner won a silver medal in the 800-meter free relay. U.S. swimmer Ron Karnaug also reached an individual final, placing sixth in the 200-meter individual medley.

At the 1996 Atlanta Olympics, the Bears were represented by nine athletes from seven different countries. A highlight for the University was Mark Henderson (1988-91) swimming the butterfly leg on the United States' gold medal winning, world-record setting 400-meter medley relay (3:34.84). Bart Sikora also had a stellar Olympics, placing fourth in the 200-meter back, setting a Polish National record with a time of 2:00.05. Other Cal athletes at the Atlanta Olympics included Kizierowski (Poland), Sirisanont (Thailand), Sikora, Kozulj (Croatia), Dominik Galic (Croatia), George Giziotis (Greece), Par Lindstrom (Sweden) and Patrick Sagisi (Guam).

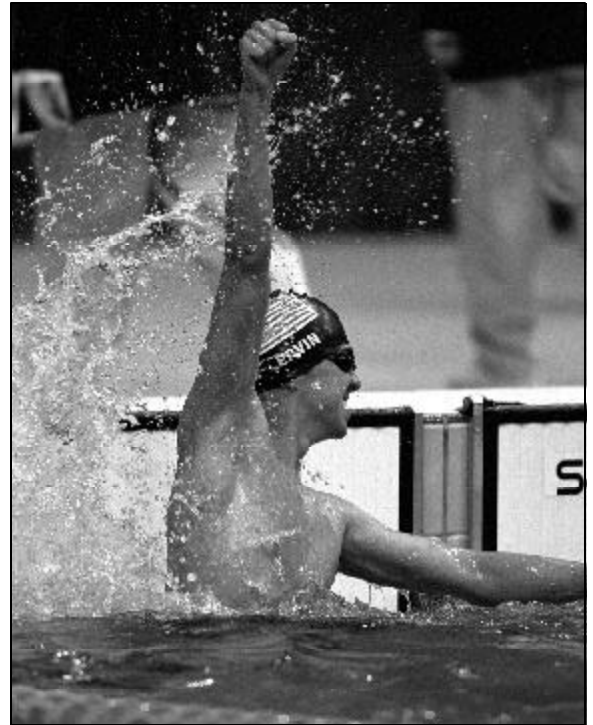
