Head Coach Richard Corso

The 1996 head coach of the United States men's Olympic water polo team and one of the most respected coaches in the game, **Richard Corso** is in his sixth year (117-51 .696) leading the Golden Bears' women's water polo team. In his tenure at Cal, Corso has helped mentor a member of the 2008 USA Olympic Women's Water Polo Team (**Elsie Windes**), 15 All-Americans and 14 MPSF All-League selections. In 2010, he led the Bears to their first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament and a third-place national finish. In 2009, Corso led Cal to its most single-season wins (31) in school history.

BERKELEY - The No. 2 Golden Bears (24-4) will face the No. 14 Tritons (17-18) in the first-round of the NCAA Tournament on Friday, May 13 at 1 p.m. PT at the Canham Natatorium in Ann Arbor, Mich. Cal earned an automatic bid to the tournament when it won its first-ever Mountain Pacific Sports Federation championship title on May 1. This will be the Bears' second-straight year going to the NCAA Tournament (which was established in 2001), and their seventh appearance in a national tournament.

Highlighting the Bears

The Bears' have been performing magnificently on offense with the help of their leading scorer, sophomore left-hander Breda Vosters, who scored a team high seven goals in the MPSF Tournament and has notched 62 goals this season. Also benefitting the Bears' offense is freshman Ashley Young, who was recently named to the All-MPSF Newcomer Team, and Elizabeth McLaren, who scored six goals during the course of the MPSF Tournament. In the cage for the Bears is junior goalie Stephanie Peckham whose 24 saves during the MPSF Tournament earned her the MPSF Most Valuable Player award as well as a spot on the all-conference first-team.

Last Week in the Pool

The Bears come off of a weekend of history-making as Cal claimed its first-ever MPSF championship title. The Bears defeated San Diego State, 7-6, in a first-round thriller on Friday, April 29. Cal then went on the outlast host school San Jose State, 13-10, in the semifinals on April 30. On May 1, the Bears went head-to-head with UCLA and edged them out, 7-6, in the championship match. The second-seeded Bears fought their way past these three top-20-ranked teams to the top of the conference for a chance to extend their season in the NCAA Tournament.

Corso and the Bears Honored by the MPSF

California women's water polo head coach Rich Corso was named the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Coach of the Year, the conference announced May 4. Junior goalkeeper Stephanie Peckham was named the Most Valuable Player of the MPSF Tournament, and Emily Csikos was selected for the all-tournament team after the Bears won the championship title. Corso also coached Peckham (1st team), Csikos (1st team), Breda Vosters (2nd team) and Dana Ochsner (2nd team) to the 2011 All-MPSF team, in addition to freshmen Ashley Young and Kelly Mendoza, named to the MPSF All-Newcomer team.

Scouting the Tritons

The Bears prepare to face the Tritons of UCSD in the first-round of the NCAA Tournament. The third-seeded Tritons also earned an automatic bid to the tournament after upsetting top-seeded LMU in the Western Water Polo Association championship match, 13-11, on May 1. Senior driver Hanalei Crowell was named the WWPAA Tournament MVP after scoring a hat trick in the final game of the tournament and she leads the team with 54 goals this season. Kirsten Bates, who has also scored 54 goals this season, received all-tournament recognition along with Sarah Lizotte. The Tritons' defense is headed by sophomore goalkeeper Allie Taylor, who has notched 146 saves this season.

1 Stephanie Peckham: Junior goalkeeper has tallied 174 saves in 17 games this season and is second in the MPSF for saves per game with an average of 10.24...earned 2011 MPSF Player of the Week honors twice this season...was named 2011 MPSF Tournament MVP and All-MPSF first-team...already has 790 career saves which is at the top of the all-time Cal career save list...is a two-time honorable mention All-American and one of the Bears' team captains.

2 Dana Ochsner: Sophomore two-meter is third on the squad in scoring with 35 goals in 28 matches...had a season-high four goals against Loyola Marymount on Feb. 27...scored twice in the MPSF Tournament...earned 2011 All-MPSF second-team honors...was a member of the 2010 MPSF All-Newcomer Team.

Rich Corso Named MPSF Coach of the Year All-Conference Honors

BERKELEY - California women's water polo head coach Rich Corso was named the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Coach of the Year, the conference announced Wednesday. Junior goalkeeper Stephanie Peckham was named the Most Valuable Player of the MPSF Tournament, and Emily Csikos was selected for the all-tournament team after the Bears won the championship title. Corso also coached Peckham, Csikos, Breda Vosters, and Dana Ochsner to the 2011 all-conference team, in addition to Ashley Young and Kelly Mendoza, who were both named to the all-newcomer team.

Picked fifth in this year's MPSF preseason poll, sixth-year head coach Rich Corso led California to a first-ever MPSF Tournament Championship and repeat appearance in the NCAA Tournament with a 24-4 record. He has the Bears in the top-three in conference scoring (11.46 GPG, second) and scoring defense (6.18 GAA, third). Four Bears rank amongst the MPSF scoring leaders, while junior goalkeeper Stephanie Peckham is the MPSF saves leader. Corso led the team to the No. 2 spot in the national coaches polls, the highest the team has ever been ranked, where they have remained since March 9. Winners in 12 of its last 13 games, California enters the NCAA Tournament as one of the hottest teams in the nation.

"It is a great honor to have been selected as coach of the year in such a prestigious conference as the MPSF," Corso said. "But I am definitely sharing this honor with the rest of my staff and student-athletes. If it wasn't for them, I wouldn't be able to do my job and I wouldn't be winning this award. It was a complete team effort."

Peckham, a Coto de Caza, Calif. native, has been stellar guarding the Bears' goal this year, tallying 174 saves in 17 games with 26 saves last weekend in the MPSF Tournament to earn her the MPSF Tournament Most Valuable Player award. The junior goalie was named the MPSF Player of the Week twice this season, on April 4 and March 7, and stands at the top of the conference in saves per game to gain a spot on the all-conference first team. Peckham has already recorded 790 saves in three years, first on the school's all-time career save list.

A standout from Calgary, Alberta, Canada, Csikos is one of the Bears leading scorers with 27 goals in 28 games. Scoring in each of the Bears' matches during the MPSF Tournament, Csikos earned all-tournament as well as all-conference honors. Csikos also received all-conference honorable mention last year.

Leading scorer for the Bears, sophomore driver Breda Vosters earned a spot on the All-MPSF Second-Team. Vosters has notched 62 goals in 28 games, fourth in the MPSF with 2.21 goals per game. Vosters, from Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, was named the MPSF Player of the Week on Jan. 31.

Ochsner, from Oceanside Calif., also earned All-MPSF Second-Team honors. The sophomore's 35 goals in 28 games this season make her the third highest scorer on the team. Ochsner was on the All-MPSF Freshman Team in the 2010 season and continues to produce for the Bears.

Freshmen Young and Mendoza were both named to the All-MPSF Newcomer Team. Young, from Coronado, Calif., is the Bears' second leading scorer with 37 goals in 28 games for an average of 1.32 goals per game. Mendoza, from Alamo, Calif., has scored 24 times this season and takes the sixth highest-scoring spot on the team.

The Cal women's water polo team, 24-4, has qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the second time in school history and will take on UC San Diego (17-18) in a first round match-up on Friday, May 13 at 1 p.m. PT at the Canham Natatorium, in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

No. 2 Cal Women's Water Polo in NAAs vs. UCSD May 13

The California women's water polo team (24-4), fresh off of capturing the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Tournament for the first time in school history, has qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the second time in the past two years and the Golden Bears will take on UC San Diego (17-18) in a first round match-up, Friday, May 13 at 3 p.m. CT at the Canham Natatorium, in Ann Arbor, Michigan. Cal, coached by 1996 U.S. Men's Olympic Water Polo coach Richard Corso, is the tournament's No. 2-seeded team and will play the No. 7-seed Tritons.

"What is exciting about our making the NCAA Tournament is we were picked to finish fifth or sixth in our conference," said Corso. "To be the MPSF's automatic qualifier is a great thrill as it was the first time in school history we had won the conference tournament. Of course last year was a big step for us to make it to the NAAs, but I think only about 50 percent of this year's team was on last year's squad. What has helped us this season is facing a team like Stanford in the regular season and then defeating UCLA in the finals of the MPSF Tournament. Those matches were good learning experiences for us and will help us prepare for the NAAs in Michigan. This run of ours has been a great team effort, and that is what it is all about."

The other May 13 first round match-ups for the 2011 Women's NCAA Water Polo Tournament will feature No. 3 seed, UCLA (24-6) and No. 6 seed Indiana (25-11) at 4:30 p.m. Stanford will face the winner of the play-in game (the winner of May 7 play-in game between Iona and Redlands) in the third game of the day at 6 p.m. The final contest of the night will pit No. 5 seed UC Irvine (21-8) against No. 4 seed Southern California (18-6) at 7:30 p.m.

The Bears were outstanding last weekend at the MPSF Tournament at San Jose State, defeating San Diego State (7-6), host San Jose State (13-10) and finally UCLA in the title match (7-6) behind two goals apiece from junior Elizabeth McLaren and freshman Ashley Young. Cal's leading scorer this season is sophomore left-hander Breda Vosters, who had a team-high seven goals in the MPSF Tournament, and 62 goals on the year. Two other top players for the Bears are junior team captains Emily Csikos, a first team All-American last year, and goalie Stephanie Peckham, who had 24 saves in the three MPSF Tournament matches.

Even though the Cal women's water polo program will be competing in its second NCAA Tournament (which began in 2001), the Bears competed in the national tournament in each of the first five years of the program's existence as a varsity sport. Cal was the national runners-up from 1996-98, and placed fourth at the national championships during the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

Bears Win MPSF Championship Match Over Bruins, 7-6 MPSF Champions

BERKELEY - The No. 2 Golden Bears (24-4) overcame the Bruins (24-6) to earn the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation championship title on Sunday, May 1 at the San Jose State Aquatics Center. This is the first time the Bears have won the MPSF title and this victory earns them an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament May 13-15.

The Bears' early lead gave them an advantage which they maintained throughout the match. Starting the game with two Cal goals, the Bears held the Bruins to zero points in the first. The second quarter saw two more Cal goals to the Bruins' two, giving the Bears a 4-2 lead at the half. The second half saw even scoring by both teams, but the Bears early goals gave them the upper hand for the win, 7-6.

The first quarter saw domination by the Bears with Emily Csikos scoring the first goal of the match at 4:26 left, followed by an Ashley Young goal, giving the Bears a two-goal lead going into the second period. The Bears widened the gap with a goal from Kelly Mendoza who scored with 4:18 left in the half for a Bears lead, 3-0. The Bruins finally got on the board after they drew a man-advantage that Brooke Martin capitalized on. With 1:55 to go in the second period, Kelly Easterday scored for UCLA to bring the team within one goal, but the Bears' Remington Price scored another goal to maintain their lead, 4-2 at the half.

The Bruins scored the first goal of the second half during an exclusion when Priscilla Orozco shot one past the Bears' defense with 4:04 to go in the third quarter. Elizabeth McLaren replied for the Bears with 1:12 left in the third period, followed by a second goal from Ashley Young with nine seconds to go for a tally of 6-3 at the close of the third. The final quarter saw two more consecutive goals from the Bruins to bring them within a single goal once again. However, at the 2: 18 mark, Elizabeth McLaren fired another goal past the Bruin defense to secure the Bears' lead by two goals, 7-5. The final goal of the game came from Gisselle Naranjo of UCLA, but this effort was not enough to overcome the Bears, and Cal won the match 7-6 to earn its first ever MPSF Championship title.
